PAK SR-IL SHEET Thank you for the opt discuss the Federal Hill Euro a recnartering of Troop 99. We appreciate your organization's continued support of the Scouting program for Providence boys.

The Boy Scouts of America has granted the Federal Hill House a charter to operate a Scout Troop for the period of one year. As we discussed, your organization's responsibilities are threefold:

- 1. To provide an adequate meeting place.
- 2. To secure and approve all adult leadership
- 3. To provide quality interpretation of a Scouting program.

An immediate concern in our discussion was the leadership adequacy of Zevin Smith, the person whom your organization had chosen as Scoutnaster for Troop 99. At that time I made you aware of difficulties that arose within Troop 71 when Kevin Smith was their Scoutmaster between 1977 and 1979. The most pressing of these problems were poor financial record keeping and responsibility, and a safety violation in which a Winnebago bus was badly overcrowded and then driven straight through to Disneyworld last summer.

Your decision was to proceed with Troop 99 with Kevin Smith as your Scoutmaster. At that time you stated that Troop Committee Chairman Joseph Kaskiewicz and you would closely watch the progress of the Troop and would make certain that Kevin acted within the perimeters of the Boy Scouts of America.

I am writing to urge you to monitor the progress of Troop 99 as closely as possible. If any difficulties should arise, or if you have any questions concerning the Scouting program, please contact me. I will be glad to assist you in any manner I can so that your organization can provide quality Scouting to the Federal Hill neighborhood.

Dear Triends,

In November of 1979, Reverend Charles Maher and Reverand Raymond Buft informed us that the Marragansett Council of the Boy Scouts of America had requested that the church replace us as the leaders of Troop 71 Providence. As you know, this did immediately happen. After listening to our explanation of the problem that the Council was creating, Father Maher instructed to iron out out differences with them. Until such time, the troop would not be allowed to meet.

In February of 1980, after conferring with the Mortheastern Regional Of ice of the Boy Scouts in New Brunswick, New Jersey, we informed Father Luft that if the Council wanted to remove us as leaders, they had to charge us with specific violations of the Rules and Regulations. In the Regional Offices report from the Marragansett Council it stated that there were no such charges, that the only reason the leadership was being changed was because the sponsor, Blessed Sacrament Church, wished to do so.

Father Luft said that this was not trie, it was never their intention to replace the leadership. The Marragensett Council had threatened to pull the treep charter if they did not receive our resignations. That was the only reason it had been requested. The Marragensett Council was, therefore, in their report to the Northeastern Office, attempting to blame the sponsor for the resignation request. Also, according to the report, there were no charges. Therefore, according to Mr. Ben Love, Regional Executive, we could remain as leaders if the sponsor signed the charter.

We were informed after the meeting that Father Luft had stated, after being pressed from a couple of parents, that Hevin Smith would probably not be Scoutmaster. It should be noted that to this day noither Father Luft or Maher has had the coupleousy or the couples to inform us of this decision.

We surungled for months trying to resolve the problems stemming from the Disney trip so that we could keep this troop alive. We did so only because Father Maher had led us to believe that he would not replace us as the leaders. If we knew that he would, at the last possible moment, change his mind, we would never have offered the boys hope that we would soon be enjoying good scouting. Our concern was for the boys of our troop, it always has been.

Father luft told us that he was informed of the decision shortly before the start of the parents meeting. May, however, did he not inform us of this after the meeting. He had not talked to us until just last week when we approached him at the rectory. There is no excuse for the way in which the sponsor handled this situation. They should never have allowed the scouts and parents, and ourselves, to think that we have the troop once we worked out a possible colution.

It is important to us that you know we never stopped fighting to get the troop together again. We appreciate those of you who stood by us through all of this. We had many good times with our scouts, memories that will live in our hearts and theirs for a lifetime. We are grateful for the opportunity we had to serve them, to teach them, to travel with them. Our troop enjoyed a unique belationship between scouts and leaders, and that is what helped to make all the times we had even more special.

Even though the trip to Disneyworld may have been the cause for these problems, we cannot forget the great times we shared on that voyage. All of you who attended we are sure had a good time, and



Attached to my letter are the documents that will give you the background on the Troop 71 Providence incident. You will see in my memo to Joe DeStefano, Providence District Chairman, that the matter was reviewed by the Council Activities Committee.

Father Edward Kelly, a member of the Activities Committee, met with the Associate Pastor of Blessed Sacrement Roman Catholic Church to review the details of the trip and point out to the church leadership that they are responsible for the troop and its activities and that they are also responsible for the selection of the leadership of the troop.

To this date, the council has not taken a specific action. If necessary, I'm sure the Activities Committee would be willing and able to handle any additional steps in the solution of the Troop 71 problem.

I personally feel that the leaders of the troop made major deviations from their approved Tour Permit. I believe those decisions were judgements that put the reputation of Scouting in jeopardy. Thank God that no additional problems occured on the trip.

The following are the responses of Scoutmaster Zevin Smith of Troop 71 Providence. They are in response to questions by someoning a letter written September 13th by She is a parent of two Scouts in Troop 71. The letter protests the troop's August trip to Disneyworld. The conversation with Kevin took place over the phone on September 24th.

- claims that you and Mr. Yates told her on 8/3/79 that you would try to get other transportation and "maybe by Monday they would know."
  - We told everyone to stay packed and be ready to leave on a moment's notice. We said that Monday would be our last possible day to leave because Disneyworld would not hold the campsite much after that.
- 2. Why did you leave on Saturday, August Lith?
  - We called friends from Corming, New York. They own a campground there and had often been very good to our troop. We had camped there several times. They have two sons whom we were taking on our trip with us as a thank you for all their past help. When we told them that the trip was probably off, they said mayte not, and that they'd call us back. They called Saturday morming to say that the troop could use their large motorhome for the trip. Since it was an eight hour drive from Providence to Corming, they told us that we should meet them halfway. This would also save travel time to Florida. These friends had to leave immediately so that they could get back to their campground before the late aftermoon influx of campers. Because of this, we did not have much time to round up all our Scouts. We called everyone we could reach and told them we were leaving immediately. We then talked to Father Luft (or S.C.) to advise him on what we were doing. We thought that he might get calls from parents of Scouts we couldn't reach, but he received none.
- 3. Was it true that you didn't want to take all the Scouts with you, since your new transportation was smaller than your original bus, and therefore you only made a half-hearted effort to call the boys?
  - No, if that were true I wouldn't have tried to call everyone. Also, we had told all the boys to be ready to leave on a moment's notice.

    Scouts probably should have called us to check on our progress before they left for Rocky Point. Also, we easily fit 20 people on board.
- 4. Why did you refund only \$200 instead of the \$250 that she paid?

  It was always our intent to refund the total \$125/boy. However, since it

cost us over \$200 to have the bus towed from Stonington, CT, and more for what repairs had been done, we weren't financially able at that time to refund more than \$100/boy. When I told that I was coming over to drop off the check, she hung up on me before I could tell her it would be only for \$200. We are now in the process of refunding the remaining \$50 to her.

- 5. Why were you so late in returning the money to her?
  - When we returned from Florida she was away on vacation for a couple weeks. I didn't hear from her until September, and I had been busy and hadn't contacted her.
- 6. When you switched vehicles, why didn't you notify our office concerning a change in your National Tour Permit?

We had the priginal National Four Permit with us on the trip. When we had to make the last second change in vehicles, it never occurred to me that the tour permit should be changed. We did make sure that the new vehicle was insured, and we carried those insurance forms with us. Also, we would not have been able to notify you for a change in tour permits on a Saturday.

Narragansett Council, in our assigned territory, is responsible to provide help in organization, training for adults, and to uphold the standards of the Boy Scouts of America. The upholding of standards and the creation of local procedures is done by a majority vote of volunteers on Council committees.

With these facts in mind, I must inform you that the Council has not taken any action regarding Troop 71 Providence or specifically with Kevin Smith or John Yates. If members of the former sponsor, Blessed Sacrament Roman Catholic Church, would like to review the circumstances regarding Troop 71, the Council would be happy to consider any request from Rev. Charles Maher or his representative.

It is our understanding that Troop 71 is being now reorganized and a new Scout-master has been selected. All equipment and property purchased by the former Troop is the property of Blessed Sacrament Church and if not in the church's possession now, said property should be turned over to the church to allow the Troop to continue in behalf of boys.

Dear Joe:

I want you to be aware of an action on the part of Troop 71 Providence that has prompted the Council Activities Committee to review the current procedure for issuing tour permits to Troop 71 Providence.

In early August, Troop 71 planned a trip to Disneyworld. They have their own troop bus. As I understand it, the bus is registered in the name of John Yates, former Scoutmaster, currently chairman of the troop committee. The current Scoutmaster, Kevin Smith, is an Eagle Scout from Troop 71 and a very close associate of John Yates. The trip had been planned for some time and evidently there were insufficient members of the troop to fill the bus. Therefore, the members of the troop and leaders solicited becole, other than Scouts, to take the trip. One of these is the son of one the son of John Yates and two boys were sons of people who own a KCA campground in the state of New York.

The trip left Rhode Island early in the day of August 2. The bus got as far as Stonington, Connecticut, where it broke down. To make a long story short, the bus was not repairable and parents of the troop were called to come and get their children. The trip returned late in the day of Thursday, August 2. During the day of Friday, August 3, efforts were made to re-establish the trip. The troop was able to borrow a Winnebego camper from the parents of the campground owners in New York. During the morning of Saturday, the trip was rescheduled, minus approximately 8 of the original paid members. Seventeen boys and adults were transported non stop from New York to Disneyworld in a Winnebego.

Several things have happened since that point. First, after the trip returned I was visited by 3 parents.

and who were alarmed at the conduct of the activity and the fact that they had not yet been reimbursed for the trip that there sons were to have taken but were left back. I have also had a visit today from who again told me that he had not been reimbursed for his son's expenses, who was also left back. Complicating the issue is the very difficult matter of the troop leaders violating the national tour standards of exceeding 400 miles per day in travel and also in substituting a bus for a 6 passenger Winnebego camper to be used as transportation for the event.

I cannot presume to forecast what the Activities Committee may decide, however, pending their decision, I will make my own decision on future arrangements that the council may have with the current leadership of Troop 71.







On May 16. 1976. On or about 3:30 PM, Chairman of the Activities Committee, same to the Youth Expo office at Lincoln Downs to report that one of the law inforcement Explorers, had been physically abused by an adult Scouter. In June 200 was in charge of the security and parking group made up of law Enforcement Explorers.

He brought long with him. The boy, around 15-16 years of age, slight in build, was dressed in a darkolue uniform (resembling that worm by a police officer.) The uniform was covered with dust and dirt. had apparently been crying and it took him 15-20 minutes to contain himself and stop sobbing.

Once he settled down, I asked him what had happened. He indicated that his post was the gate towards the south end of the race track. His instructions were to let no one through that gate. All people entering the track had to enter through the ticket gates. He said that this big, white-haired guy was inside the grounds and proceeded across the track, approaching the gate. He informed him that he'd have to go around, and the guy pushed his way through. He immediately informed Mr. Brunnckow of the problem. As Mr Brunnckow was approaching, this same person approached the gate again from outside. He again informed him that could not pass through this gate. He grabbed shold of the chain around the gate so he couldn't push through. "He pushed me down, but I still kept a tight hold on the chain, and held on as he attempted to push me away from the gate". "Then, one of the Scouts that was with him jumped me while I was on the ground and just as he started to hit me, some other guy told him to stop it and get off me". The white haired guy was identified as John Yates, Scoutmaster of Troop 71, Providence. The Scout who jumped the Explorer was identified as

I then proceeded to the location where Troop 71 was set up for the show and asked John Yates to come up to the office. He said nothing, and proceeded immediately to the office. Vince Borrelli then talked with John.

when Vince was talking with John, three adult leaders from the troop; Kevin Smith, and a third who's hame escapes he, came to the Youth Expo Office to defend John saying that "the kid should never have tried to stop him". "He should have known from John's size that he shouldn't have tried to stop him". They also expressed a concern about what would become of John. I told them that it wasn't for me to decide.

Comments regarding prior incidents with John Yates:

Three years ago, John's troop camp to summer camp on a Sunday evening. That evening, one of John's boy leaders heard some talking from one of the tents later in the night. He went over to the tent to find out what was going on, and silently stayed outside the tent for awhile to "make sure he knew what they were doing". He then xxx went and got John, who also stayed outside the tent to make sure what was going on. They had found three boys engaged in some sex play.

They immediately packed the kids up, took them home and literally left them on their doorsteps, explaining to two parents (fathers) what had AMPHARICAN happened, and to the third nothing, because the father wasn't home. When John did reach the father, and as was true with the other fathers, he left them with the impression that they were sent home because they were homosexuals. The one father who wasn't home, called me the next day in a rage. At that time, I had not been informed by John that he had brought these boys home. He continue d to call for the next six months trying to work out in his own mind whether or not his son was a homosexual as was indicated by Yates.

The handling of this situation was extremely poor. It showed a total lack of mature judgement and leadership. I'm sure it has left a mark on these boys lives that they'll never be able to erase,

It acting the way he did, John violated one of our regulations that we tell all Scoutmasters, every year, at the Scoutmasters' Steakroast, the week before they come into camp. No child may be removed from the camp property during summer camp without the signature of the Scoutmaster, Camp Director, Health Lodge (if sick), and Reservation Director. John knows our feelings on this matter, but as always acted irrationally. His reasoning at the time, was:

"It was Sunday night, and I didn't think our actual stay at Yawgoog started until Monday morning, so I didn't feel it was necessary to tell anyone."

Last fall, John and his troop went to Aquapaug. During their stay, they managed to cut down some live trees (6), removed the limbs from others, hasseled the them there are the control of the control of

When they arrived on Friday night, Roscoe met with the leaders and instructed them on the regs of the camp. ie don't cut live trees, stay off the bank in front of Mowry Tavern (serious erosion problem), etc. Saturday, he went over to see how they were doing and found a group of boys playing on the bank. He asked them to get off the bank, and they gave him some lip, including the SPL. John was not there the entire time. He talked with on Sunday, and gave a lot of static, swearing at him in front of some of the other men and boys.

I contacted John shortly thereafter and confronted him with the incident. He denied that his boys had done anything wrong except take a few limbs off trees. He did apologize for his SPL giving a hard time, and after that date, they went to Aquapaug to do a service project designated by

You are aware of the incident at Youth Expo. You might not know, however, that even his SPL indicated to one of our men that John did physically abuse the Explorer that was guarding the gate, and Kevin Smith also admits that it happened saying The boy shouldn't have tried to stop him, John was so much bigger than him.

John is usually quite contrite after these incidents, but in my estimation sets a bad example for his Scouts by his own behavior. The kids think he is great, and have followed his style. ie awearing at Roscoe and the incident at Youth Expo where one of his Scouts jumped the Explorer after John knocked him down.

has had problems with him at Yawgoog. Most of these incidents have evolved around John pushing his way around, and I haven't kept any information on dates or incidents. That has handled those incidents without the being involved.

This has the potential of being an excellent troop. I'm sure that Kevin smith is ready to move into the Scoutmaster's position if John is asked to step down. Kevin realizes that John was wrong, but is loyal to John and doesn't want to see him hurt too bad.





Riese be aware that District and Council has an obligation to be sugar that all unit poney radsing projects are in harmony with National by laws, and have approval of the sponsoring institution. Scout units should conform to any role established by the sponsor.

In answer to paragarph two, the sponsor of the Troop, Blessed Sacrament Church, and the governing body of that church are responsible for the Scouting program (Packs, Troops and Posts). If the policy making body of your church is the Parish Council, them the Troop is responsible to the Council. I would also believe that any unit would function in harmony with the spiritual leaders of the Parish.
