Memorandum of Decision - CON Council Review Board for BSA Registration Revocation Buttes Area Council, Boy Scouts of America

Mr. John Roberts was invited, alone, into room with Hearing Board and Mr. Graska. Mr. Roberts was told that if he wished to invite the others into the hearing that they would become aware of his felony police record and his registered sex offender current status. Mr. Roberts said all of these people knew of his status on both matters and he would like them to attend. The five couters from Pack 77 were then invited into the hearing room.

Mr. Roberts opened the hearing by saying that his parole officer could verify that he had had no problems while on his parole - no language or no bad act. The parole officer felt, and Mr. Roberts felt, that scouting was very beneficial to his behavior. All of the leaders of his Pack 77 knew of his situation and stand behind him. Mr. Roberts said the Pack is aware of the sensitive nature of the situation so whenever the boys are with him, another scouter is present also.

Mr. Roberts was asked why he wore his scout uniform in his local parade after receiving notification both in writing and in person that his BSA registration had been suspended. Mr. Roberts responded saying they needed a second adult for the event and he went along in a parent's role, wearing a uniform to look better in the parade. The board responded that he cannot wear a BSA uniform if he is not a registered scouter.

The other scouters from Pack 77 strongly supported Mr. Roberts. They said Mr. Roberts has been a scouter since November 1987 with no problems and had done a great deal of good for the cubs in Pack 77, both as a hard worker and as a good role model. They said that in spite of the general heading of the parent's petition [parent's petition is attached to this report], the parents were privately told of Mr. Robert's felony and sex offender status before being asked to sign the petition.

The hearing board congradulated the Pack 77 scouters for their hard work bringing scouting to the boys of their area, especially in light of the many single parent, difficult situation, families in their area. The board then stated their concern of both the legal and public relations liability of having a leader in Mr. Roberts' situation, should anything happen.

Mr. Roberts asked if he has to withdraw his son from scouting He felt scouting was a good influence on him and on the other boys in Pack 77 and would like to have his son continue with the scouting. He did not have an opportunity to be a scout when he was young.

CONFIDENTIAL The board told him his son definately could continue in scouting. He can participate in a "parent's role" and the board would like to see him support his son in that role. But he could not be a registered scouter - he could not wear the unform of the Boy Scouts of America nor could be be counted as one of the two registered scouters on outings. He could go on outings as a weblos father but, again, he could not be in uniform and the weblos den must have two registered scouters in attendance.

Mr. Roberts said he had paid his penalty for his mistake, had spent his time in jail. What did he need to do to be recognized as rehabilitated? Mr. Eden on the board and he had some discussion about California Department of Corrections rehabilitation papers and possible Governor's pardon. The board said that as far as the Boy Scout coucil was concerned, his reinstatement would be a decision of the elected scout leaders at the time of his possible reapplication as a scout leader - that those leaders not be required to reinstate him or to disqualify him with or without those rehabilitation papers and pardon.

The board again mentioned the legal and public relations dangers of Mr. Robert's BSA registration.

The board's decision regarding Mr. John Roberts, Jr's application for reinstatement of his Boy Scout leader registration was:

If you do wish to appeal, notify the local Council Executive, Mr. David Graska, at 742-3215, to get copies of all the relevant documents.

I talked with Quentin Campbell, John Roberts parole officer, again regarding Roberts. Quentin indicated the fact that Roberts served in prison from 6/12/85 to 4/2/87. There were two charges one with sexual intercourse the victim under 16 and one with a 16 year old. He thought from looking at the information that one of the charges was dropped and there was a plea bargain and the controlling case was the incident with the 16 year old. He also said that it was definite and that he had seen the card that Roberts was registered as a 290 penal code sex offender with the Yuba County Sheriff's Office.

He said Roberts was under psychiatric counsel after his release from prison and was released from this in September of 87 with comments from the psychiatrist that he attended regularly and was showing no signs of sexual deviance problems.

After careful review, we have decided that your registration with the Boy Scouts of America should be suspended. We are therefore compelled to request that you sever any relations you may have with the Boy Scouts of America. A refund of your registration fee is enclosed.

You should understand that BSA membership registration is a privilege and is not automatically granted to everyone who applies. We reserve the right to suspend registration whenever there is a concern that an individual may not measure up to the high standards of membership the BSA seeks to provide for American youth.

If you wish to have this decision reviewed, please write to me within 60 days of the date of this letter, explaining your version of the facts supporting your claim that your registration as a BSA member should be granted or reinstated. The procedures for review are actached.

On March 30, 1988, Dave Graska, Scout Executive of the Buttes Area Council, and Jack Barnard, an executive committee member served a letter of registration suspension on John F. Roberts Jr. from Cub Scout Pack 77.

Dave Graska was contacted by Quentin Campbell, a probation officer from Chico, who indicated John Roberts Jr. was a registered sex offender on parole, having been released from prison in April of 1987.

Mr. Roberts sexual activities included two episodes with under age females. One starting at age 12 and with over 50 episodes over a period of several years. This was with a consenting female. The other episode was with a 16 year old babysitter who claimed forciable rape.

Graska and Barnard delivered the letter to Mr. Roberts in his home. Roberts read it, did not have any questions or comments to make regarding the letter or the attached appeal procedure.

As to your recent letter regarding my ability to serve B.S.A.

Your revocation of my services was very vague to say the least. You did not state why suspension was necessary. I feel that I have "given my all" to B.S.A. Pack 77 without question and being a leader in the Webelos Program has been a very rewarding experience, an experience that I would feel lost without. Personally I have felt the impact Scouting has on our youth due to the fact that I have a son in Scouting and it has brought us much closer together. Scouting is as rewarding for him as it is for me.

Being a Scout leader is not an easy jcb. And you know as well as I that there are far too few individuals willing to participate in the Scouting Program today.

At this time I am asking for a brief explanation of my evaluation. This would assist me in my endeavor to give you the information you need to reassess my position with B.S.A.

The leaders of Pack 77 are very supportive and are at this time circulating a petition for parents and committee members to sign backing my reputation and ability to serve the Scouts.

Your time and consideration would be greatly appreciated.
