This period was extended to April 29th following which time a court date was set here in New Bedford. On May 4, 1977 Mr. The was brought to court and an attempt was made to find probable cause of his being guilty. Seven youngsters were called to testify and probable cause was found on 9 counts of rape and 4 counts of indecent assault and battery. Two additional counts of rape were denied but in conversation with the detective from the Dartmouth Police Department involved with the case, he was informed that this was due to some confusion on the part of the judge and that the detective will later file for a direct indictment on these two counts.

It is my understanding that each conviction of a count of rape carries a maximum life sentence. In any event the next step calls for Mr. For appearing before a grand jury at the Superior court level. What is startling, however, and you will note from the enclosed news clipping, is that the judge has enabled bail to be set at \$10,000. I personally find this hard to accept.

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## \$10,000 bail set on area Scout leader

Charges of rape brought against a North Dartmouth Boy Scout leader were referred to the June session of Superior Court yesterday after a 3rd District Court hearing.

Bail of \$10,000 was placed on 23, of 530 Chase Road. It yes 10 counts of rape of a child less man 16 years old. He also is charged with five counts of Indecent assault and battery on a child less than 14 years

of age. At Byron yesterday cleared everyone from the courtroom except for court personnel and those directly involved with the case.

Court officials said the parents of the defendant were in the courtroom. Also seen in the courtroom were seven boys of Scout age.

Atty. Alan Zwirblis, public defender, represented Freitas. The prosecution was handled by Harry Bello of the district attorney's office.

was arrested last March after what Dartmouth police said was a month-long investigation. According to police, the offenses took place over a four-month period during weekend camping trips.

The defendant was brought to the court from Bridgewater State Hospital where he underwent 30 days of examination following his arrest. He was returned there after the hearing, court personnel said.

This incident is related to one Chase Road, age 24, 530 Chase Road, North Dartmouth, Mass., who is repistered as assistant Scoutmaster of Transferred synthe Congregational Church of South Dartmouth.

The first account of the problem was the 6 o'clock evening news on WTEV-6, New Bedford, citing that the above mentioned Scouter had been arrested by the Dartmouth police and was being held at the New Bedford Police station being charged with 10 counts of rape of children under 16 and 5 counts of indecent assault on children under 14. From subsequent news releases we were led to believe that there are 9 youngsters involved over a period of time which may extend up to 4 months.

Sgt. Herbert Tondreau, Pape Squad of the Dartmouth Police Dept. has been charge of the situation but to date we have been unable to communicate with him. Upon learning of the detention at the New Bedford Police station, I went (accompanied by the District Scout Executive for that district) to the station to see if I could speak to the Dartmouth Police they would have to give us this permission. We then went to the Town of Dartmouth where we discussed the situation with a Sgt. Medeiros. He informed us of a report from New Bedford that the had just attempted suicide by hanging in his cell. He was not successful. However, under the circumstances, no further attempt to communicate with him that evening was made.

Also on that evening, the 21st, the following people were notified:

Council President, March 1; Area Director, Theo; Pastor of the Congregational Church, Rev. Theorem, In Audition, I received a midnight telephone call from the Scoutmaster who had been unavailable earlier and had just learned of the incident. I brought him up to date and suggested a meeting the following morning.

#### • MARCH 22, 1977

Met with Rev. A. his I.R. to discuss what had happened and to set plans to deal with the situation. It was decided that a meeting of the Scout ommittee would be called for 7:30pm this evening at the church hall where the unit meets. It is understood that some of the members of the committee are parents of some of those alleged to have been involved.

I have been in further communication with Area Director, **Determined** who has been very helpful, along with the Public Relations, Legal Service, and Registration and Subscription Departments of the Home Office.
