
In accordance with this statute, we are providing you with a copy of the notes made by our relevant employees relating to the incident you are investigating.



While [redacted] and I review the nature of this serious allegations, we then proceeded to have a tell and ask question session pertaining to this matter.

As [redacted] told me: On Friday 7-31-87 at about 1:30 pm he and Larry left Marquet to get a pop from the machines located at the Administration Building not far from Marquet Campsite.

On their way, Larry told him that they must first stop and check Desoto campsite for close out of camp (Not UNUSUAL FOR LAST WK. OF CAMP TO CHECK FOR TRASH, WATER LEAKS, PLATFORM STACKING, ETC) (DESOTO & MARQUET ARE SEPARATED BY ONLY +/- 150 yds)

While in Desoto, [redacted] said that Larry layed his books down and walk over to the latrine and looked over the washstand area, returned to the area by his books and both sat down on a platform in Desoto campsite.

[redacted] then said that Larry asked him ~~him~~ to scratch his back for him.

The conversation then to follow according to [REDACTED] is that Larry asked him "How he [REDACTED] felt about him (Larry)?" and "If [REDACTED] loved him?"

[REDACTED] then claims that Larry had [REDACTED] hug him three different times, and that [REDACTED] did so. This happened on a platform about 17 yards from the south of the latrine area. [REDACTED] was basically sitting indian style, legs folded and Larry sitting upright with legs stretched forward.

On the ~~third~~ ^{three} hugs, [REDACTED] claims that Larry wanted him to "French" kiss, and asked [REDACTED] to define ~~the~~ his "French Kiss".

Upon the third hug [REDACTED] claims that Larry "pulled him down (later to find he ~~was~~ ^{did not} rolled him over) and got on top of him (Larry on [REDACTED]). [REDACTED] continued to say that Larry put his hand down [REDACTED] back side (Butt).

I asked if Larry had touched any specific body parts and [REDACTED] answered NO.

At that point, [REDACTED] told Larry he had to go and then left.

Upon the completion of [redacted] side of the story I asked a couple of questions, then asked [redacted] to show me where all this took place.

[redacted] took me to DeSoto campsite, showed me the platform, told me the story again and we returned to the Admin Bldg.

With this preliminary investigation complete with [redacted] I asked Stephen Becker to come from my office and hear what [redacted] had shared with me. [redacted] relayed to Stephen at the house what he had relayed to me.

Upon completion of this, [redacted] went back to his campsite, and Stephen and I returned to the office in the Admin. Bldg. We discussed the event and then I found Larry and at the Admin Bldg., Stephen and I confronted Larry with the charges.

Larry, completely upset, denied all but the fact that the two did stop at DeSoto campsite while getting a pop to inspect the campsite.

After a couple more discussions with Keith and [redacted] in the Dining Hall with myself, and another discussion with Larry, Stephen and myself, [redacted]

TIME OFF — Camp staff needs depend on Scout attendance. If a week is closed because of poor attendance or other factors, or if staff numbers are reduced, you would be given time off without pay. (We do not expect this to happen)

SALARY — All salaries are based on job duties, your experience and your qualifications. Therefore, all salaries are standardized in all camps and are not negotiable. Value of room and board is in addition to salary.

OTHER ASSIGNMENTS — You will be expected to perform such duties as requested by the Director. These duties will be normal staff functions such as camp clean up, camp set-up and take-down, and other such items. If you are required to attend National Camp School as a pre-requisite for your duties, the fee will be paid by the camp but you will not receive salary during this period.

DAYS OFF — Normal in camp period is from 12:00 noon Sunday to 12:00 noon Saturday. Camp Directors may give other out of camp time. Working hours are established for individual jobs.

COMMITMENT TO STANDARDS: Infractions can and will result in immediate termination.

Possession or use of alcohol in camp is prohibited.

All staff members will conduct themselves in an exemplary manner in or out of camp; in or out of uniform. Specific examples include, but are not limited to: intoxicated behavior, flagrant violation of law, illegal use of drugs, and other forms of gross misconduct.

While in camp, all staff will be in uniform except when preparing to leave from or returning to camp; or while in their own quarters. Uniforms will be required for all meals in the Dining Hall. You need at least two complete uniforms.

When departing from or returning to camp, all staff members will check in and check out.

Smoking will be at times and places agreed upon with the Director.

Standards of appearance must be maintained; staff members will be neat and clean at all times.

Our Council camps are committed to excellence. All staff members are leaders by example. If a staff member proves ineffective for any reason, his employment will be immediately terminated.

Mid-America Council is keenly interested in you and will help in every way to insure your success as a staff member. Workmen's compensation, while on duty, is provided in addition to your salary, but does not cover non-occupational sickness or accident. Any change in insurance coverage will be discussed with you. A Staff Packet with detailed information in it to assist you in preparing for the summer will be mailed to you before the season starts.

Camp staff service demands your very best. At the same time, you will find that camp staff service will be among your most enjoyable experiences. Acceptance and signing of this letter (parental approval required if under 19); transmittal upon arrival of an approved health examination; acceptance of the position description; and successful completion of staff training are conditions of your employment.

On Friday, July 31st at approximately 7:00 pm, Chris Andersen, Camp Director asked me to come to the Director's House.

[redacted] introduced me to [redacted] who told me a story of someone, who during the afternoon of the same day, had ask him to check out De Soto campsite. After arriving at the campsite and sitting on a tent platform [redacted] was asked to scratch the individual's back several times, was hugged and french kissed by the individual, and the individual attempted to put his hand down [redacted] pants in the rear. [redacted] said he had to go and left the area.

I then asked [redacted] who this person is and they said Larry Sullivan.

The next step was to find Larry and ask him about this situation. [redacted] and I sat Larry down and shared the accusation with him. He was stunned and said it was untrue. We asked him if he knew the boy in question, he said he did

and that the boy seemed to be needing attention all week and that Larry had talked to him several times to console him.

We [redacted] then asked Larry to remain in the vicinity of the Administration Building.

Chris had [redacted] and Keith Petersen come to the office to talk further. After explaining the situation and its ramifications as well as possible, [redacted] stated that it was just people to not believe him.

Chris and I then explained that we would remove Larry from the camp immediately and that [redacted] was to remain with Keith for the remainder of his camp stay. We at this time attempted to telephone [redacted] several times and got no response.

After [redacted] and Keith went back to their campsite, Chris and I asked Larry to leave camp and he did so immediately.

Saturday, August 1st

Keith Peterson told us that he would be taking [redacted] home this morning and would talk with him (some more, as well as, telling [redacted] when he and [redacted] arrived in Omaha. Later that day (Sat.) I called Keith [redacted] on his conversation with [redacted] and his mother. Keith said he would talk with her again in the evening and give us a call back.

Sunday, August 2nd

Chris called Keith in the morning or early afternoon.

Monday, August 3rd

John Davis called about 2:30 PM to tell me that [redacted] had called the Scout Office.

Approximately 3:30 pm an Inspector Busek from the Saunders County Sheriff's Office called regarding the situation. I told him I would call him back after talking with my supervisor. I then called John Davis to confer with him as to what I could or couldn't do and he instructed me to cooperate and thought, after talking with [REDACTED]

Shortly afterward I returned my call to Inspector Busek and answered his questions as to what was told to me concerning the situation.

About 4:30 or 4:45 pm, Bob Freeman, a Council Attorney called to speak with me about the situation.

Because I feel that I am incapable of performing my job up to the standards set by the Viking Council, Boy Scouts of America, I must tenure my resignation as soon as possible.

I feel that it is a very tough profession and that it is not for just anyone. The stress can be tremendous at times and I have felt since I have been with the Boy Scouts over the past four years that the stress has had a tremendous effect on me personally.

Futhermore, I feel that it is not the Viking Council that has contributed to this decision that I have made. I feel that I have performed my duties very inadequately and I am not sure why this is. But it stands that the Crow River District and the Viking Council would be better off with a new man in this Executive position.

I feel very sorry that the Viking Council has put so much trust in my abilities and that I have let them down so badly. My supervisors have been tremendous (especially John Reesor) and have given me every opportunity to be successful.

Two other very important reasons for my resignation are that I have not been completely honest in my dealings with my supervisors and that there have been certain factions in my district area that have been applying tremendous pressure that I can not live with because of the stress involved.

This letter is very hard for me to write because I have been in this fine program for almost twenty years total. And the hurt I feel at this moment is greater than any that I have ever felt. But for the good of the Viking Council and the Crow River District, I feel that this is logically the best move to make.

Once again I am very sorry for letting the Boy Scouts of America down and I wish my wonderful professional counterparts and the program only the best in the future.
