

Corruption trial jury 10 men arrested hears more evidence

The jury in the corruption trial of former Justice Department prosecutor David P. Twomey heard more evidence yesterday that confidential information was leaked by a marijuana smuggler, Frank Lepere of Marshfield. Twomey, 40, is on trial in US District Court in Boston, charged with selfing information to Lepere in return for \$210,000 in cash and a S0-foot specificat. Twomey headed a task force that investigated Lepere. In testimony yesterday, another marijuana smuggler said Lepere apped him off about the ex--istence and identity of a government informant inside his organization. The smuggier. Robert Frappier 37, formerly of Southwick, said Lepere telephoned him in March 1983, while they were both fugitives and warned him. that a member of his organization. Thomas Tindall, was a government informant.



Scouts support leader facing child sex charge

SUPPORTERS of Boy Scout leader Lawrence O. Brehaut, inciuding some youngsters from his scout troop, railled on Wakefield Town Common yesterday to protest his arrest on a child sex charge.

Craig Hudson, 14, who carned Scout merit badges with Brehaut's help, said, "He's a real good guy. I think he's innocent because he helps people all the time. I never heard any stories about him."

Jee Clark, whose son James was in Brehaut's troop several years ago, said, "I think he (Brobant) got a real bum deal.

"He's not guilty until proven guilty, but his life is in shambles because of all the publicity,"

Brehaut's arrest last week miles north of Boston where he court on Dec. 19.

had been active in youth groups for many years.

The 41-year-old bachelor pleaded innocent to a single charge of indecent assault and battery on a minor and has since kept a low profile. Police have released no specifics on the case.

About 40 friends and supporters gathered in the crisp morning air yesterday on the common. They collected letters of support to be delivered to Brehaut.

Victor Kirmes, 70, a longtime neighbor of Brehaut, said, "I'll back him up any way I can. I don't think the guy is capable of anything intentionally indecent.

"I've known Larry since be was a boy delivering newspapers," Kirmes said. "This thing is one hell of a mess. This is a small town and there's so much sensationalism."



Brehaul is scheduled for a pretrial conference on Dec. 19 in Malden District Court. The result of that conference will determine whether there is enough evidence against Brehaul to warrant a trial or a hearing before a grand jury.

According to Middlesex Assistant District Attorney Patricia Bernstein, the charges of indecent assault and battery against a child under the age of 14 carry a maximum sentence of 10 years in prison or up to two and one half years in a house of correction.

The Burlington School Committee, which temporarily suspended Brehaut from his teaching job when they learned about his arrest, is holding a closed hearing on Wednesday'to determine whether they will continue his suspension.



Brehaut Wednesday

WAKEFIELD - Lawrence O. Brehaut of Wakefield is expected to be arraigned in Middlesex Superior Court in Cambridge Wednesday on 27 charges, including eight counts of rape of child and posing children in the nude in order to take their pictures.

The 41-year-old Bennett Street resident — a Burlington sixthgrade teacher until his resignation Jan. 23 — was indicted last Thursday by a Middlesex County grand jury.

The 27 charges include eight counts of rape of child, eight counts of posing a child in a state of nudity, nine counts of disseminating (pornographic) matter harmful to children, and one count of indecent assault and battery on a ninth child.

Originally, Brehaut was charged with only the indecent assault and battery on a child under 14, following his arrest Nov. 18 by Wakefield Police after an out-of-town youth came forward with details of an alleged assault by Brehaut on Aug. 28.

Despite the grand jury indictments and the scheduled arraignment Wednesday, Brehaut was still scheduled to appear in Malden District Court today where he faces the one charge of indecent assault and battery.

Wakefield Police officials today expected that the case against Brehaut in district court would be dismissed today, and the indecent assault charge would be part of the superior court proceedings against the

Wakefield man.

Continued from Page 1 Times Chronicle this morning that "he (Brehaut) can't be charged twice for the same crime; and the superior court case will override the district court case."

Inspector O'Keefe further stated that Assistant District Attorney Patricia Bernstein had attempted to get Bre-aut and his attorney Thomas Sullivan to forego appearing in Malden court today, and simply "surrender himself in Cambridge instead."

However, Brehaut and his attorney were expected to appear today in Maiden to conduct the district court proceedings to the end.

Brehaut recently resigned from his teaching position at Burlington's Marshall Simonds Middle School after having been suspended following his arrest last November.

Arrested at his home, Brehaut is now alleged to have taken the photographs that depicted the children in a state of nudity, with the incidents occurring over a six-year period. Wakefield Police, however, say the acts may stretch as far back as 20 years.

According to Assistant DA Bernstein, the investigation of further incidents came as a direct result of the first charge.

That investigation led to the discovery of other victims by tracking down the youths through the photographs found in Brehaut's home, and to the subsequent indictments by the grand jury.

Wakefield Police said Brehaut's victims were boys mostly in the age bracket of 10 to 12

years old.

scheduled when Brehaut was charged with only one count of indecent assault and battery against a child under the age of 14.

Bernstein brought the case before a grand jury in Superior Court which indicted him on 26 charges, last Thursday. The 26 charges Brehaut faces in court on Wednesday are eight counts of rape against children, one count of indecent assault and battery against a child under 14, eight counts of posing a child in the nucle and nine counts of disseminating pornography.

Brehaut, who has been released on \$2,500 cash bail appeared in court to-day with his attorney, Thomas Sullivan of Melrose. Bernstein asked Judge Killam to allow the matter to be continued until next week and with Sullivan offering no objection, the hearing was continued until Feb. 11.

Brehaut faces a life sentence on the rape charges and 10 to 20 years imprisonment on each of the other 18 charges. The nine charges of "disseminating matters (pornography) harmful to minors," that Brehaut faces allegedly stem from accusations that he showed young boys pornographic magazines and photographs before he supposedly molested them.

According to local Police Inspector Arthur O'Keefe, seven of the children who have filed charges against Brehaut, are from Wakefield, one is from Burlington and the other is from Meirose. All claim they were between 10 and 13-years-old when they were supposedly molested, O'Keefe said.

He added that since news of Brehaut's arrest was publicized, several young adults volunteered information concerning alleged molesting incidents which supposedly occurred when they were children under Brehaut's supervision.

"This apparently has been going on for 20 years," O'Keefe commented last week.

A six year statute of limitations on child molesting cases prohibits those alleged victims from pressing charges, O'Keefe said.

According to O'Keefe, police have not yet ruled out the possibility that other adults were involved in the alleged crimes. Evidence which led to the indictments last week reportedly included over one dozen incriminating photographs of boys.

News of Brehaut's arrest on Nov. 18, 1964 alarmed many persons throughout this region, where he was renowned for his hard work and dedication to the youth of Wakefield, Lynnfield, Melrose and Burlington.

One week after his arrest on Nov. 28, a group of about 35 to 40 residents gathered on the Town Common to raily support for Brehaut, charging
