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Recently the Chairman of the Troop Committee and the Scoutmaster of our Troop <u>57</u>, sponsored by the First Presbyterian Church of our city came to me, confidentially, for advice concerning the removal of an Assistant Scoutmaster, Lemmie C. Stabler, Sr. The reason was misconduct with one of the boys of the Troop.

The father of the boy involved had approached the men after receiving a note from his son. A copy of the note is enclosed.

My advice to the Chairman of the Committee was to talk to the Minister of the Church regarding a course of action. This was done and the two men confronted Stabler quietly, with the knowledge of the majority of the Troop Committee.

Stabler resigned without an argument and since he has a family - two Fagle Scout sons and a younger son in the troop also - it was decided to keep these proceedings confidential. Stabler promised the Committee Chairman and the minister never to try to become associated with Scouting or Youth work again.

Thanks for your recent letter. I am glad to know you are still making use of some of the material we developed during my September visit. I hope you continue to find it sound.

As to Lemmie C. Stabler, Sr., since you indicate that this is the first time you have placed a man on the Confidential File, let me indicate a little more of what we need. We need to know why a person is being placed on the file. Further than this, we need to know what did he do, and this needs to be supported by written statements from boys or parents, or by copies of police records, or court records and/or by newspaper clippings, etc.. In short, we need to have here in this office all the facts available. They are kept in a locked and closely guarded file and they are used in Teview of cases in the future.

So, if you would please send us a letter, giving us the complete story regarding Mr. Stabler and support it with enclosures along the lines indicated above and, at the same time, complete the enclosed confidential record sheet, we will then review all of the facts, classify the case and place the man on the file.

Yes, Doris is planning to be in Birmingham late in April, but she will be alone. She will fly down some time during the day for the evening program. I will have to stay here, particularly since that is the second day of a two-day Personnel Division staff meeting.
