

Subject: Leo McDonald

I cam back into camp on Tuesday July 23rd at which time the Revisional Scoutmaster came to me and informed me that three boys had come to him and told him of improper advances made by Leo McDonald. Then I went over to Wood Badge and talked to and he advised me to talk to each of the boys separate which I did.

The first boy I talked to had been on an overnight week-end with Leo and a troop. This took place on July 10th. This boy informed me of what advances Leo had made to him and said he had been too scared to inform me previously and had gone to his Priest and his Priest advised him to stay away from Leo and the Priest did not advise him to do anything else.

The second incidents occurred on Saturday night July 20th at which time Dick Mulliner, Camp Director and I were in camp, but not informed until after it happened. On that Saturday night the whole staff was out of camp with the exception of possibly 4 staff members and Leo returned from Huntington Lake - Where he had been drinking according to the boys. He came into the first boy's tent at approximatel 2:00 A. M. in the morning, talked to him for awhile and then made improper advances. The boy stated he was so scared that he didn't do anything or say in thing and finally Leo left the tent. He went into the second boy's tent, talked to him for awhile and started to make advances and the boy told him to get out, which he did.

I talked to each of the three separately. Thise were their stories and they were willing to face him as a group and accuse him to the face. All this happened on Tuesday and these are the stories the boys gave me.

Dick Mulliner came back into camp The sday in the and I consulted with the resident Dr. about one boy who was in a state of shock from the whole thing. (This was the second boy.) On Wednesday the property of the whole thing. (This was the second boy.) On Wednesday in the property of the was also there and when they were all out of camp (Wednesday ifternoon) I told Leo that I wanted to talk to him and he came down to headquarted the conversation by telling him (Leo) that there was no room in Scouting for homosexuality, nor was there room for it in a Scout Cair. He agreed with me. I then told him that there were three boys who had accused him of such acts and were willing to face him and make their accusations. He asked me for the names of the boys and I told him that was not necessary because he knew who they were and I knew who they were, but they were willing to come forward, if necessary, but reign twant that and I didn't think he did. I then asked if he could deny their accusations and he stated that he would neither deny nor admit them. He asked me what wanted him to do. I told him that there was no place for him in Scouting or in the Scout camp and I wanted him to leave as soon as possible. He was out of simply within 20 to 30 minutes.
