Around the time I just began scouts I was the victor in a first aid test for [redacted] and [redacted] two other guys in scouts. [redacted] and [redacted] had to treat me for I think heat exhaustion, it is hard to remember. He had me take my clothes^{off} all except my underpants, I know that isn't required, I'm sure they could explain and demonstrate a little with my clothes on. Before camp I was tested for ~~the~~ first aid merit badge. I used my brother as the victor, the other scouts didn't want to be the victor because they were afraid Doc would pull something funny. I had to treat [redacted] for Hypothermia. I asked Doc if we could keep our clothes on and do it, he said no. He told me to pretend it was really happening and he timed me on it. After me and [redacted] my brother, were in the sleeping bag with all but our underpants^{off} he unzipped the bag and told me I wasn't doing it right. He told me to wrap my legs around him and my arms. Neither one of us~~o~~ was very comfortable doing that but I figured I had to, that them were the requirements.

On the way to camp I fell and got stitches in my hand and I couldn't get it wet. ~~the~~ When we stayed in the Sheridan for one night I wanted

to take a shower and Doc said to come and get him when I was finished and he could wash my hair for me. I stepped out of the bathroom with my swimming trunks on and asked him to help me wash my hair. I didn't really trust Doc so I kept my swimming trunks on to get my hair washed. He said to take them off and I did.

When we stayed in the Sheridan on the way home I had to sleep in the same bed with Doc. When that night I woke up and Doc must have woke up. He asked me if I was alright and I said ya I just woke up. I was laying on my stomach and Doc began to massage my back and then he took my underwear completely off and threw them on the floor. Then he began to massage my butt. I began to get really confused and scared and I got butterflies in my stomach. I didn't know what to do so I pretended I was asleep.

All but one day out of six total of traveling I had to be in the van, that is the vehicle that Doc drove. The only reason I got to be in the Blazer with Mr. Wolfe and a couple other kids is because [redacted] and [redacted] stayed at camp so Doc asked [redacted] to change the seating chart because Doc didn't have time with Wolfe

said he didn't think that was right that I had to be with Doc all the time.

It was the same thing with in the hotels, I had to be in the hotel rooms with Doc all three nights we stayed in hotels.

After we got off a ^{sea plane} ~~plane~~ ride we hiked to the Adirondac museum. During the hike [redacted] was poking [redacted] and Doc pulled the stick away from [redacted] threw [redacted] to the ground and kicked him, then Doc yelled at ~~the~~ all the scouts for not ~~being~~ behaving ~~there~~. After we continued on the hike [redacted] asked [redacted] if he was alright, Doc replied, "Oh ya, im alright, scouting over for me, but I'm alright!" He meant he didn't want to be a scout leader any more because he couldn't controll the troop, I think.

The entire incident came to light with a phone call from another scout's ([redacted]) mother. Her son had told her that Doc Hall had pushed him down and kicked him during a hike on the trip ~~to~~ to Sabatt's Adventure camp, a Boy Scout camp in New York State. He also related to her an incident my son [redacted] told him and several other scouts about. The incident involved himself [redacted] and Doc Hall on the first night of the return trip. They were staying at a hotel and [redacted] was sleeping with Doc Hall in the same bed. [redacted] awoke and found Doc Hall rubbing his back. He then removed [redacted] underwear and also rubbed [redacted] butt.

The following day I talked to Jones to get more information as to what had transpired. He told me of [redacted] walking alone during a hike with a hiking stick, [redacted] poked another boy a couple of times and Doc became angry grabbed the stick and pulled it and the boy to him. He then pushed [redacted] down and while he was falling kicked [redacted] in [redacted] said it looked as if he caught [redacted] him in the ribs).

[redacted] also told me that on the first night returning home, Doc made them sleep in a double bed with him.

Two other scouts, [redacted] and [redacted] were also in the room. We had them sleep on the floor on the far side of the other double bed in the room (this bed then ~~was~~ was unoccupied). During the night [redacted] awoke to find Doc rubbing his back. Doc then proceeded to remove [redacted] undergarments and also rubbed his buttocks. [redacted] said he was scared, confused and almost crying but that he pretended to be asleep hoping nothing more would happen. → Upon further questioning [redacted] told me that on ~~the~~ a different occasion Doc offered to wash his hair for him after a shower. This was because [redacted] had stitches in his hand and could not get them wet. After the shower [redacted] had put on some swimming trunks. Doc had him remove the swimming trunks so they would not get wet while he washed [redacted] hair.

[redacted] also told me of the first aid ~~man~~ badge test he took. His [redacted] went along to be the victim for [redacted] to demonstrate techniques on. When [redacted] came to the hypothermia portion of the test he made both boys strip to their briefs climb into a sleeping bag and wrap their arms and legs around each other. After hearing this I talked

separately to [REDACTED] who at this time had no knowledge ~~of~~ of the occurrences on the ~~to~~ trip. He described the ~~the~~ pneumonia part of the test exactly as [REDACTED] had related it.

I do not know whether these are isolated incidences or if they are part of an ongoing problem, but my son, [REDACTED] said he certainly hoped that no other ~~the~~ kid would have to go through what he did the night in the hotel.

I have recieved allegations of sexual misconduct against Dr. Hall by a Scout. The matter has been turned over to the Racine County Department of Human Services for investigation.

George Nicoll has been charged by the Kenosha Police Department of criminal sexual assault of a minor, who is not a registered member of the Boy Scouts. Criminal charges are pending during a thorough investigation by the Kenosha Police Department.

James Ketler and David Ketler have been suspended for habitually failing to follow policies of the Boy Scouts of America, related to two deep leadership and alcoholic beverages on troop outings.

Robert J. Koehler, an adult registered as an Assistant Cubmaster in Pack C3507, was found guilty of sexually assaulting his son or stepson. He is currently in a state prison.

All of these individuals have been taken off of our roles as members.

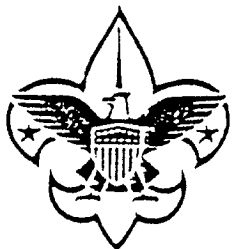

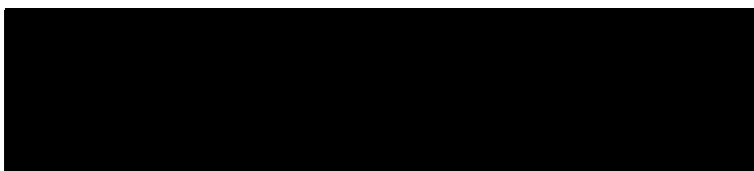
