I am responding to your letter of September 21 requesting some information on Mark Dunkin. Enclosed is a copy of his signature which is highlighted on the last charter renewal.

I have talked with detective Pince regarding the status of Dunkin's case. On September 30, he told me that the case is now formally closed. The reason is that they couldn't prove a statement by was over the age had been forced to be fondled by Dunkin. Since of 14 and the State could not prove force, the case was dropped. The law has since changed, and if the same situation arose today Dunkin could be charged with the crime of child molestation. It's important to know, according to detective Pince, that in 1984 Dunkin was charged with five counts of indecent liberties. There were no convictions because the youth and parents would not follow-up on these accusations. If you wish verification of these statements, you may talk with detective Pince at . I have looked for a copy of the letter that we gave to Dunkin denying his involvement, but cannot find it. Dunkin did receive the letter and came to my office; however, we did not keep a copy. Please advise me on this oversight.

Attached is a newspaper article regarding Charles Grewe which I'm sure you will want to add to your file.

As always, whenever I have new information regarding any of our former dismissals from the Scouting program, we will keep you informed.




