Reader's Viewpoint

Parent Involvement Held Scouting Need

Recently, an article appeared in this paper stating that parents rap the lack of action of Scout leaders pertaining to the arrest of an assistant Cubmaster on child molestation charges and the responsibility of leaders. The issue was whether or not a meeting or special program should be held for all parents and members of Pack 314.

It first must be understood that scouting leaders at the unit level are volunteers who have committed their personal time to work with children. They are not compensated in any way. They volunteer their time to be den leaders, Cubmasters, etc. Training is limited to the Cub Scout program as it pertains to boys advancing in rank and the various ideals and concepts of Cub scouting and the ways to accomplish this.

Scouting can not take the place of parents. In fact, Cub scouting is dependent on the involvement of parents in the total program for their son. While Cub Scout leaders receive training for their specific volunteer roles, they are not trained or qualified to deal with problems such as the psychological effects of child abuse.

There are professionals who are qualified to work with youth to assist them to understand this situation. The volunteer leaders are in a difficult situation trying to work with the boys but also please the parents. The Boy Scouts of America had developed a program called "Child Abuse, Let's Talk About It". The emphasis is on the involvement of parents and their sons. Scouting believes that programs which deal with sensitive subjects such as child abuse, must be the primary responsibility of parents.

Volunteer leaders, like any responsible adult, do not condone and specifically reject such malicious conduct. But they are not the primary source of program information. If parents decide they need a program for their sons, it may be arranged with or without the leaders. In fact, it is the parents' responsibility to review the child abuse program first prior to involving their children, no just the leaders.

The Boy Scouts of America doe not ask parents to blindly trust volun teer leaders with their children. In fact, we request and expect responsi ble parents to become directly in volved, know your son's den leader. Cubmaster, join the pack committee. participate in meetings and outings and voice your opinions and concerns.

However, remember the leaders working with your boys are volunteers. If you are critical of the program, then volunteer, take the training and join the ranks of adult leaders.

Our good faith, reasonable efforts on behalf of all concerned in this unfortunate incident continues in close cooperation with the leadership of Pack 314.

DUQUESNE Molestation Case Probed by Police

A 31-year-old father of three has been arrested by county police on charges of child molestation.

The arrest followed an investigation by Detectives James Heyl and Donald Fox, acting on a report from parents of one of the alleged victims.

Police have charged the Kennedy Avenue resident with four counts of involuntary deviate sexual intercourse, three counts of incest, one count of sexual abuse of children and three counts of indecent assault.

As the arrest involved incest, the name of the suspect was not released in order to protect the identity of his child, who reportedly is one of the victims.

According to Detective Fox, the parents had initially contacted the county's Children and Youth Services and were not satisfied with their handling of the complaint. The parents then called county police.

After talking with three of the alleged victims, police obtained a warrant for the arrest of the man.

County police, assisted by the city Police Department, are continuing their investigation to determine whether there are any additional incidents involving other children.

Detective Fox said the boys reportedly assaulted were between the ages of 9 and 12. He also said the majority of assaults reportedly took place at the home of the suspect.

Because the suspect is affiliated with the Cub Scout program, troop leaders met last night to plan a special program in which the county police would be asked to present a program explaining sexual abuse to the scouts.

The suspect was arraigned in Night Court and remanded to the County Jail to await a preliminary hearing. Bond was set at \$25,000.
