Sentence suspended again for man guilty of child sex abuse

A Yakima man has again received a suspended prison sentence after being convicted a third time for sexually abusing children.

Michael Hicks, 21, was given a suspended sentence Thursday for committing indecent liberties in an incident that came to light after he had been convicted last year on two charges of child molestation.

In the 1990 convictions, Hicks was found guilty of molesting two foster children who were staying in his parents' home last year. A third charge — of allegedly raping a 6-year-old girl who visited his home — was dismissed.

He pleaded guilty to second-degree and third-degree child molestation charges in November, and his 20-month prison sentence was suspended.

Under a special sentencing option for first-time sex offenders, Hicks was allowed to enter a two-year outpatient treatment regimen instead of serving his prison sentence on the two charges. If a defendant re-offends, he or she can be ordered to serve the prison sentence.

But the child molestations, authorities learned later, were not his first offense.

An earlier incident of committing indecent liberties in 1987 did not come to light until recently and a charge was filed this summer, Deputy Prosecutor Ruth Reukauf said.

On Thursday, visiting Pacific County Superior Court Judge Joel Penoyar imposed a 28-month jail term but suspended the sentence.

The judge questioned whether it is legal for a person convicted of child molestation to again receive the suspended sentence intended for first-time offenders. But the judge agreed to impose the sentence when Reukauf said she did not object.

Reukauf said Hicks has been cooperative in his treatment program and passes lie detector tests used to ensure compliance.

Hicks' attorney, August Hahn, said it does not make sense to kick his client out of treatment and into prison for an incident that occurred before his previous convictions.

Although Penoyar suspended the 28-month prison term, he ordered Hicks to undergo an additional two years of treatment, for a total of four years. If he re-offends, he could be ordered to serve the earlier 20-month prison sentence and the later 28-month term consecutively.

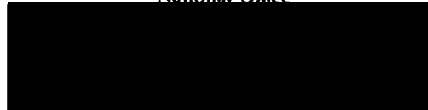
Hicks' November 1990 conviction was for molesting 13-year-old and 15-year-old foster children between December 1989 and May 1990. His later conviction was for indecent liberties he committed with a 10-year-old girl in 1987.

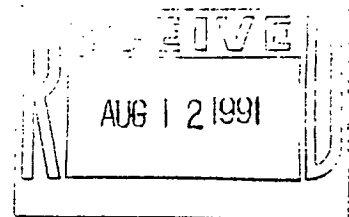
