# men seized on morals charge

WAUKESHA, Wis. — Five men, including two Boy Scout leaders, have been arrested on morals charges for alleged attacks on a large number of young boys.

Waukesha District Atty. Richard McConnell said the arrests stemmed from an investigation of the suicide of a prominent Waukesha hospital administrator after a May scouting campout at his rural Geneva home.

McConnell said a total of 67 charges were filed against the five men.

He said most of the alleged attacks took place at the bachelor home of Robert M. Jones, 43, a hospital administrator who died of carbon monoxide poisoning July 7, the day after a party at his home involving about 30 men and boys.

AN INVESTIGATION of the death, which authorities ruled was a suicide, led to the five arrests Tuesday.

The charges against the men included a variety of felonies and misdemeanors, including exhibiting obscene films to children, sexual perversion and taking indecent liberties with a child.

The boys involved ranged from 10 to 15 years old, McConnell said.

Some of the alleged attacks took place at a Boy Scout

campout at the home of Jones, a bachelor, May 17 to 19, McConnell said.

Those arrested were Jack Keating, 32, a Scout troop leader, of Gousser; and four De-  
waukee men: Patrick Prudlow, 29, an assistant Scout troop leader; Fred Foley, 32; Dean Slater, 35, and Mark Federats, 23.

Four Waukesha County men were charged in criminal court here today with a total of 52 moral offenses involving young boys, cases arising out of a John Doe hearing.

A fifth Waukesha county man is being sought on nine other morals charges.

They are:

Patrick P. Prudlow, 29, of N29-W27521 Peninsula Drive, Pewaukee, 17 counts, 13 of which are felonies punishable by a prison sentence.

Dean Slater, 35, of N30-W23523 Peterson Drive, Pewaukee, 17 counts, all of them felonies, all indecent behavior with a child.

Jack Keating, age unknown, S55-W29593 Holiday Road, town of

Genesee, 16 charges of contributing to the delinquency of children and indecent behavior with children.

Fred Fohey, 32, of N2233 Highway SS Pewaukee Town, one count of contributing to the delinquency of a child and one count of exposing a child to harmful materials (a stag film).

In announcing the end of the investigation into circumstances relating to the death of Robert M. Jones, Waukesha Memorial Hospital president, District Attorney Richard McConnell said late this morning if he had known before the death what he knows now, he would have charged Jones, also, with "contaminating little children."

Most of the incidents concerning the charges filed today occurred at

the Jones residence at S57-W29637 Saylesville Road in the town of Genesee.

Two of the men, Keating and Prudlow, were Boy Scout leaders, and some of the incidents occurred during Scout outings at the Jones residence during the last three years.

About Jones, the DA said he had known him as a "highly competent and respected hospital administrator, admired by his peers."

"But apparently he led two lives. Even his close friends and co-workers didn't know he was a homosexual. If he had done this only with other consenting male adults, I wouldn't even mention his name here.

"But it became necessary to men-

tion it because he was violating little children along with the others.

"I was personally shocked when I learned he was contaminating little children."

McConnell cleared the hospital and the Boy Scout organization of any blame for the behavior of the men. And he said none of the juveniles will be taken into court except to be referred to Juvenile Court and Social Services Department for psychiatric treatment as a result of what the adults did to them.

All of the cases called this morning were adjourned to allow lawyers to file motions. County Judge William Callow continued the bail amounts set earlier by Circuit Court Judge William G. Gramling. They range from \$5,000 to \$15,000.

orities learned Jones threatened to  
commit suicide the night of July 5  
during an all-male party at his  
home.

Three brothers aged 10, 14 and 15  
were there, and spent part of the  
time tending bar. McConnell ex-  
plained today Jones argued with  
Prudlow and Slater about them  
taking the 10-year-old and 15-year-old  
to their respective homes.

There was no criminal activity at  
the Jones party that night, McCon-  
nell said, but Jones "became very  
upset" when he learned the boys  
wanted to leave.

That's when he cleared the house  
of all guests after threatening to kill  
himself. His body was found the next  
day in his car in his garage. The  
coroner ruled it suicide by carbon  
monoxide poisoning.

At a press conference after the  
court session, McConnell went  
through the cases one by one. He  
said that, at his request, Judge  
Gramling had closed the Doe probe  
about 4 p.m. Monday after four more  
witnesses were quizzed.

The DA stressed, however, that if  
anyone has information about law  
violations "by living persons," his of-  
fice or the sheriff's office should be  
contacted.

A total of 25 persons were ques-  
tioned in four sessions, including one  
held Saturday — without notice to  
the press, he said. All those ques-  
tioned Saturday are juveniles, he  
explained. The Saturday session was  
held to accommodate family vaca-  
tion schedules, he said.

He and part of his staff worked the  
rest of Saturday, all Sunday and all  
Monday sifting through the evidence  
to come up with what will total 61  
charges against five men.

Details of how Jones and Keating  
took indecent liberties with young  
Boy Scouts in Jones' sauna bath  
were brought out. They occurred at a  
Scout campout at the Jones house  
May 17-19 of this year.

There is another count of taking  
the same boy to other stag films  
there and furnishing him with  
brandy and sour. Connected with  
that are charges of indecent acts.

Slater — He described himself in  
court as being divorced, a resident of  
this area for 30 years and who is a  
manufacturers representative selling  
equipment for schools with electrical  
and electronics laboratories.

He faces 17 felony counts, all in-  
decent behavior with a child, begin-  
ning in August 1971 when he lived  
with Jones. Slater told the judge he  
lived with Jones from Aug. 1, 1971 to  
September, 1972.

His offenses are indecent acts with  
a boy, the DA claims. He also fur-  
nished brandy and sour for a 16-year-  
old boy he took to Fohey's house for  
film showing homosexual activities,  
McConnell charges.

Keating — An employe of Kuetner  
Oldsmobile in Waukesha, Keating  
was Scoutmaster of Troop 63 at  
Lawrence School when his offenses  
occurred. At the same time, two of  
his sons were in the same troop, Mc-  
Connell said.
