Because there is no question of the original wrong-doing, a fact which you, yourself, readily admit, we believe that our decision in your case is consistent with our leadership selection standards.

I guess I shall never be able to forget or forgive myself for this.

It would most probably be quite hard for you, a gentleman of your character to imagine how I feel as the years go by, wanting to be in Scouting after so many happy years of action in Philadelphia, Pat & Monmouth, N.J.

Arriving here in Pawtucket, R.I. I took a big chance, although realizing the odds may have been against me.

I was highly recommended to Narragansett Council to start my own Scout Troop.
