Dear Paul,

I am enclosing a confidential record sheet on a Phillip K. Rimmasch of Salt Lake City, Utah.

On September 28, 1988, I received a phone call from a deputy county sheriff advising me that Mr. Rimmasch was currently serving as a Scout leader in one of our Cub Scout packs. He further advised me that Mr. Rimmasch had been convicted of

over a period of 3 to 4 years. During the past two weeks we have investigated this and have visited in confidence with the Bishop of the L.D.S. ward that sponsors the Cub Scout pack. The Bishop was disturbed that this matter has risen again stating that the man had paid for the alleged offense and his life was in order. He also told us that the case was under appeal to the Supreme Court and they felt would be over turned. We told the Bishop that where a conviction had taken place we were obligated to present a letter to Mr. Rimmasch informing him of his removal from Scouting. I have indicated in his letter that we were aware of the appeal and that if he was found to be innocent of the charges we would invite him to appeal the discission.

I am also submitting a confidential record sheet on a Mr. Randy C. Bailiff of Woods Cross, Utah. Approximately one month ago it was brought to my attention that Mr. Bailiff had written many personal checks on a Varsity Scout unit account. Several of these checks, approximately 90, had not cleared the bank because of insufficient funds. It was also brought to my attention that Mr. Bailiff had been displaying the Order of the Arrow distinguished service knot which he claims to have received while living in the Orange County Council in California. Some of the members of the Order of the



Arrow checked into this at the National Conclave and found that he had never been presented this award. Mr. Bailiff is one those adults who is obsessed with patch trading and while serving as a leader at the recent Order of the Arrow conference spent most of his time trading patches with young people.

I visited with Mr. Bailiff in my office and confronted him with the statements. He claimed that he did not know he was doing wrong in writing personal checks on the Varsity Scout account, claiming to have placed his personal money in the account to cover what checks he had written. He also said that he thought he had been presented the distinguished service award but had since learned differently.

I checked with the chief of police in Mr. Bailiff's town, and was told confidentially that he had been arrested on March 28, 1986 and convicted for retail theft. For this conviction he received a one year suspended sentence, 22 days probation and a \$500 fine. On September 8, 1986 he was arrested and convicted for theft of an automobile. There have also been numerous complaints of a human nature regarding his conduct these charges been through litigation and more than one year has expired, the police department will not share these records with us. In the past 2 weeks I have had 3 reports from adults claiming that Mr. Bailiff is a strong suspect in the theft of patches and memorabilia items which he showed great interest in and had disappeared shortly after.

Mr. Bailiff is now telling people that we are removing him from Scouting because of his patch trading activities with our youth. It is my recommendation that Mr. Bailiff be places on our confidential file and I will, this next week, deliver a letter to him suspending his activities in Scouting and refunding his \$1 registration fee.

Thank you for your help in our continuing effort to have quality leadership of character for our youth.
