Thank you for the detailed information sent concerning the above Scouter. This case has been reviewed with our attorney and is now on our permanent Ineligible Volunteer File.

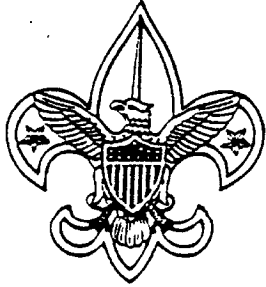

Enclosed is a copy of a letter I sent to Howard Burnett when he was the Council President back in 1983. Attached is the original of a resignation letter given to me by Mr. R. Martin Johnson, MD.


Dr. Johnson acknowledged in my presence (and I think in the presence of Jack Caldwell) that he had had inappropriate relations with young boys which would disqualify him from ever serving as a volunteer in the scout organization. My recollection of the meeting is somewhat clouded by the nearly 8 years which have passed, but I do recall having advised Dr. Johnson that if he did not resign from his positions with the scouts (including his service on the Executive Board and with the Health and Safety Committee and as an adult member of the Boy Scouts of America) that I would institute whatever action was necessary to have him removed.

The enclosed resignation was the result of that meeting.

As I was going through my old scout files I found this letter and wondered if we have Dr. Johnson listed on some permanent kind of listing that would keep him from being accepted in any connection with a Boy Scout assignment.

I recommend you give the Region and National notice so we don't have Dr. Johnson showing up working with scouts again.
