Judge sentences two men to Orient reception center

Two men were sentenced to the Correctional Reception Center in Orient by Pickaway County Common Pleas Court Judge William Ammer Wednesday.

Wyatt E. Geyer, 24, 4800 Duvall Road, Ashville, pleaded guilty to two counts of receiving stolen property.

He was sentenced to a year on each count to be served concurrently.

Joseph W. Armbruster, 39, Athens, pleaded guilty to passing bad checks on Sept. 25, 1986. At that time he was placed on three years, probation. At his hearing yesterday, he was found to have violated the terms of the probation and was sentenced to serve six months in the Correctional Reception Center.

Troy D. Harrison, 20, Washington Court House, pleaded guilty to two counts of breaking and entering and two counts of theft. He was sentenced to 18 months in the Mansfield Reformatory for Men on each count. The sentence was suspended and he was providing he make restitution, seek counseling, stay out of Pickaway county and not possess or use drugs.

Pre-sentence reports were ordered for four defendents. David W. Griffin, 18, Mount Sterling, pleaded guilty to theft; Jerry W. Barker, 40, Lockbourne, pleaded guilty to gross sexual imposition: Ralph R. Gloyd, 56 35 Cromley St., Ashville, pleaded guilty to gross sexual imposition; Thomas G. Pierce, 34, 7989 State Route 752. Ashville, pleaded guilty to theft.

A hearing will be set at a later date for James L. Wolford, 41, 351 Barnes Ave., who pleaded innocent to a charge of sexual battery.

Ashville Council member resigns for personal reasons

Ashville Village Council member Balph Gloyd, 56, resigned his post Monday during the regular village council meeting.

Council went into a closed-door executive session immediately after roll call opened the meeting. Councilman Don Forquer was absent

Approximately 25 minutes after the council, Mayor Marvin Hicks and the council clerk left the room, Glove returned. He put on his coat, pia up his notebook and left the Hosse Memorial Building without comment.

Council returned to open session a few minutes later and spent more than two hours discussing other items on its agenda before reaching the end of its meeting. Hicks then left the room and returned with a small, yellow sheet of paper, from which he read what he said was Gloyd's resignation, dated that day.

"I, Ralph Gloyd, resign from Ashville Village Council for personal reasons," Hicks read.

Village officials offered no other comment on the resignation. Gloyd, of 85 Cromley St., Ashville, recently pleaded guilty in Pickaway County Common Pleas Court to a charge of gross sexual imposition.

The Herald contacted the Pickaway County Prosecutor's office late this morning, but details of the case were not available at press time.

After Hicks. read Gloyd's resignation, a council member asked if a vote was needed. Councilman Frank Weish said council har ready voted that evening to ac the resignation, but Hicks noted the Ohio Sunshine Law, or Open Meetings Law, listed as Chapter 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code, does not permit votes during executive sessions.

"Okay, we'll make it official, then," said Councilman Albert Johnston. I could not (compare) the figures to Johnson's bid."

Jointiton said Johnson Disposal bid a flat rate, which would not change as state fees for trash haulers were imposed under the new solid waste laws. Rumpke, he said, bid on a sliding scale which would vary according to the solid waste fees.

"Re-advertising won't accomplish a thing," Johnston said. "I do not feel Johnson has a bad bid."

"The question is, do we want to handle this or do we want to forget it? If you want to forget it, fine, (but) don't re-advertise this and go through this again."

A long debate ensued between representatives of both trash firms over whether Rumpke had submitted a bid as required in the advertised specifications. Welsh and Hosier clashed over whether the franchise should include provisions for commercial and industrial customers, instead of just the residential customers in the proposed contract.

After, lengthy debate, council voted 4-0 to award a five-year contract to Johnson Disposal, at a cost to the village of \$5.65 per customer per month. The Rumpke officials promptly left the meeting.

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Johnson representatives said they would be contacting village businesses to set up trash collection agreements.

Discussion then turned to the village's surcharge for handling the trash billing along with the water and sewer accounts. After some debate, council roted to accept Welsh's recommendation of a surcharge of 85 cents per month, making the monthly rate to customers a total of \$6.50.

Welsh said the surcharge would generate approximately \$44,000 over the five years of the contract. The funds remaining after paying the clerical costs of trash billing will be earmarked for street paying and repairs, Welsh and Johnston said.

In other action Monday, council:

·Heard a report from Village Engineer John Grosse that Gernini Construction, the firm working on the north end sewer project, will halt installation of new main lines and concentrate on street repairs and installing smaller service lines.

Grosse said all other portions of the project will be completed before the firm starts laying lines along Station Street. He said that work willprobably start in early December.

 Heard a report from Hicks that a proposed Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) will be use storm sewer improvements. Hall Street, South Street and nearby alleys. He said the pr would not get underway until spring if the grant is approved.

•Heard a report from deve Mark Leatherwood on a planns split in the Ashville Comm Center project, located alone village's far west side.

Discussed plans to erect 5 speed limit signs along st where sewer lines are under struction and heard from F Chief Chuck Wise that motorists have been ticketed trying to drive through st closed for the project.

•Voted to advertise for big insurance.

• Adopted an ordinestablishing fees for the four-coolid waste management districtions.

•Voted to permit rental of the shelter house during the cowinter, on a trial basis.

•Discussed plans to create a village employee position, primfor groundskeeping duties.

Approved a leave of absenred
 Johnston.

- 1. Within 60 days, you must request in writing a review of this decision. Your request should be sent to the regional director, East Central Region, BSA. In your request you may include your version of what occurred in support of your claim that your registration should not have been denied.
- 2. Upon the receipt of your written request, a committee will be appointed to review the situation.
- 3. You may attend the review hearing, but is not adversarial in nature and neither the committee nor you will be represented by legal counsel. If you wish, you may be accompanied by no more than two other individuals if their testimony might assist the committee in discovering the truth and arriving at a correct decision.
- 4. The committee will review the facts as presented, and may interview any persons whose testimony might assist them in arriving at a correct decision.
- 5. You will receive a letter setting forth the decision of the committee.
- 6. If you disagree with the decision of the committee, you may request a review of this decision by the National Council of the Boy Scouts of America.
