I acknowledge receipt of your letter to me dated 29 August 1988. It was delivered to me the same day by the Patowomek District Executive. I hereby request reinstatement of my registration with the Boy Scouts of America upon your thorough review of the relevant facts.

You will find that I have been accused of sexual abuse of a sixteen year old, who is a known liar and trouble maker. The New York State Police, in order to attempt corroboration of the story, added a second charge of similar nature, against one . The accusations are untrue and unjust.

I believe it is indeed unfortunate that you have decided, without any investigation into the facts, to withdraw my registration with the Boy Scouts. You will find that I have been active for over thirty years in the BSA, from Cub Scouts through Eagle Scout — on staff at Otetiana Council Camp for three years, an Assistant Scoutmaster in College and in the military in Germany — Scoutmaster of a troop in Germany and here in Reston, Virginia, etc. You will also find there has never, in this entire scouting career, been any hint of abuse or misdeed. I invite you to ask any scout or scouter with whom I have been in contact.

The basic facts of this case are:

was a member of the Scout Camp Staff. as was I, during this past summer. He was the Trading Post Clerk until he was fired from the position on 23 July 1988. Although he was originially to be sent home on that date, he pleaded with the camp director to remain. He was granted permission, and was demoted to kitchen staff aide. He was dismissed 5 days early from camp, on 14 August 1988, due to staff threats against his person resulting from the cumulative multitude of mischievous activities with which he had been associated - including some which brought injury to other staff members. Prior, on 29 July 1988, he related a story to the Camp Reservation Director, and later the State Police, that I had three times "sexually assualted" him between 17 and 23 July. This was impossible, as can be seen from my very busy schedule as Camp Program Director, his schedule at the Trading Post, together with periods of my absence from camp - and the majority of the week spent with my wife, relatives, and friends.

2 - About two weeks after accusation occurred, the

State Police investigator, based on questioning CIT member of the camp staff, made a second accusation. This accusation was based on exceedingly flimsy evidence that I made "near sexual contact" during rewrapping of injured

knee! When I reviewed the camp first aid log book with Dick Trier (Reservation Director) on 18 August, there was a single entry when I rewrapped knee - he claims there were four times, including on dates, as stated above, I was absent from camp! The way the statement reads is that the Police investigator was leading in a way to make things "sound fishy."

I invite your thorough investigation into the allegations and pledge my cooperation in in way that I can. In order to assist in your initial process, I am enclosing herewith several documents and sworn affidavits. Any that are not signed I received prior to their being signed — but are accurate and were later signed.

APPENDIX C

APPLICANT PROCEDURE FOR REQUESTING REVIEW OF DECISION DENYING REGISTRATION

- 1. If registration is refused, the applicant may request a review of this decision: This request must be in the form of a written request from the individual which includes his or her version of the facts supporting the claim that registration should not have been denied.
- 2. Upon receipt of the written request for review, the president of the local council shall appoint a committee to review the situation.
- 3. The appointed committee should review the facts as presented, and, in addition, may interview any persons whose testimony might assist the committee in discovering the truth and arriving at a correct decision.
- 4. A confidential report will be given to the applicant setting forth the decision of the committee.
- 5. The applicant may—if he or she does not agree with the decision—request a review from the regional director by submitting a written request for such a review within 30 days of the receipt of the local council decision.
- 6. If the regional review does not satisfy the applicant, he or she may ask for further review by the National Council by submitting a written request for such a review within 30 days of the receipt of the regional decision. The decision by the National Council is final.

Jim Case, Rochester, N.Y., telephoned August 29, 1988, to report the arrest of Camp Program Director, Lt. Col. Ray B. Toland, Ret., for sexual abuse on July 29, 1988.

The required report of the alleged incident was made to the Health Department the same day. Mr. Toland was removed from camp and has not returned. His son, also a camp staff member, chose to remain and did complete the summer session.

Mr. Toland is a registered member of the BSA in the National Capital Area Council, Bethesda, Md., and gives his permanent address as Virginia.

He was arrested for a misdemeanor/third degree sexual abuse for fondling a minor, leading to communal masturbation. Contact was made to the family of the minor staff member who was involved. Help was offered the family and psychiatric help was offered the staff member. It is Jim Case's understanding that the staff member has received psychiatric counselling in the past.

Mr. Toland was released on bail and was to appear in court August 18th.

I notified Claire in Paul Ernst's office. Paul Davis is delivering the letter suspending registration and will advise you.

The information collected by Jim Case has been received in the regional office. Perhaps you should acknowledge receipt and reinforce my request that any further information regarding the matter should be forwarded immediately to you.

This is prepared after discussions with the following individuals:

Staff member of Camp Mountaineer and alleged victim, age 15; Bonnie Yopp, Camp Nurse; Richard Trier, Director of Camps; Dr. Baxter partner of Dr. Burt Kay, pediatrician of proposition of proposition of proposition of proposition of proposition of proposition. Over a period of several weeks in July, apparently made several visits to an adult who indicated that he (the adult) could help him with insect bites. The bites were on his leg and the treatment consisted of the application of various lotion and oil preparations, first on the bites, then on subsequent visits, on areas of his proximal legs, then followed fondling of his genitals, mutual fondling and mutual masturbation.

Past history: According to the patient he had tried twice to kill himself, had been in outpatient psychiatric care and in inpatient care. According to his psychiatrist he had not tried to kill himself.

Family history: The patient comes from a family in which the mother has had emotional problems, and his family environment is characterized as an emotional vaccuum. He apparently dislikes his mother and likes his father. That apparently had to contend with the disruption caused by two periods of separation of his parents. His father is a supervisor at

At camp is said to be "flaky", "hyperactive", and sometimes "mouthy". He feels that he has good relationships with all but one of his peers. He feels that his relationships with adults at camp are "good". He feels particularly good about the supportive relationship he has established with Mr. Trier ("Uncle Dick").

Summary of events of the past week: Since the alleged sexual abuse came to light a week ago, there have been numerous events of consequence. Among them are the following.

- 1. Firing of the alleged perpetrator
- 2. Investigations by numerous "authorities".
 - a. State Police
 - b. State Health Department
 - c. Camp Director (assisted by many members of his staff), including the Camp Nurse, and
 - d. <u>attorney</u> for the alleged abuser
- Visitsvto the Camo Director and Health Staff for purposes of providing general support.
- 4. Phone calls
 - a. to his parents who felt it was in best interest to stay at Camp.
 - b. to his pediatrician who knew of his mother's emotional problems, but not of history of emotional problems.
 - emotional problems, and the care he had received, including a year of hospitalization for depression and out-patient mental health services for several years, including recent appointments at monthly intervals. Permission to communicate with school and pediatric providers had not been given by the parents. During the past week has met with Dr. Emami and plans have been made for a visit with and his parents on the 20th of August following return to

Rochester.

d. between and Dr. Emami; and between Dr. Emami and myself resulting in agreement that remaining in camp is in best interest, and that follow-up care on the 20th of August will be helpful to and his family.

Summary:

- 1. has had a significant history of emotional problems, unknown to the Camp Director or his pediatrician, which are known to his psychiatrist.
- 2. family life has been significantly disrupted for many years.
- in his staff role. He can be expected to continue to function adequately.
- 4. Camp resources, especially those of the Camp Nurse and Camp Director, are adequate to meet his needs until the end of the camp.
- 5. The family has withheld permission for psychiatrist to communicate with other helping professionals inappropriately.

Suggestions:

- Continue to provide adequate support to for the rest of the camping session. Communicate with Dr. Emami as needed.
- 2. Encourage family to follow through with health care upon return to Rochester.



- During the period of employment, the staff member's full time is at the disposal of the camp. Each day presents certain opportunities for personal recreation and program participation. One full day (24 hours) off a week will be arranged with the camp director. Special evening privileges are available with the permission of the camp director.
- while the specific functions designated on the reverse side may be the chief duties, the staff member agrees to help carry forward the entire program and objectives of the Boy Scouts of America, as determined by the Otetiana Council, its Camping Committee, and camp manager. Assistance in other than chief duties, such as program assistance, fire details, duty assignments and others, will be determined by the camp director.
- 3. The camp exists for the Scout, his patrol, and his troop. The home troop leader is responsible for his Scouts. The camp staff exists as program service to the unit, and exercises supervision and control over any group of Scouts, through the unit's own leadership, whether adult or boy-elected.
- 4. The official summer Boy Scout uniform will be the official uniform of the Scout Camps. This includes the Scout or Explorer short-sleeved shirt, khaki short pants, long stockings, and belt. One such complete uniform is required, and is worn at retreat, supper, Saturday and Sunday. A minimum of two are recommended. Certain staff members may wear other prescribed clothing, such as doctors, chefs, and kitchen workers, as directed by the director of camping. At all other times, a modified summer camp uniform may be worn, as determined by the Director of Camping.
- 5. Conduct of a staff member, both in camp and outside, will be of the highest standard, whether in uniform or civilian clothes, and should not interfere with camp morale, or undesirably influence the camp reputation in the community. Lack of good conduct may be considered as cause for dismissal. Staff living quarters will be inspected regularly to assure clean, safe and sanitary conditions.
- 6. ALCOHOL BEVERAGES/CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE: No use of any of the aforementioned will be permitted by staff members on the Reservation. Violation of this will constitute grounds for immediate dismissal.
