

At your request, we have investigated actual court records of the case wherein Raymond Porter Michael was convicted in juvenile court:

He took an 11-year class girl into his house and took nude photos of her posing in suggestive positions. He admitted taking the pictures, according to the statement made by arresting officers. The physician's report attached to the court record indicated there was no particular evidence of "deviation."

The sentence was \$250 fine with \$200 suspended, and 60 days in jail suspended.

The sponsoring organization removed him from the post, although parents had removed their boys promptly on the first announcement. The sponsor is now engaged in reorganizing the post.




The Explore Post is due to reregister in March. We hope to be able to reorganize it but climate is not good.
