On Monday, February 8, 1988 I met with [REDACTED] and his mother at the Hiawatha Council Service Center, [REDACTED] Syracuse, New York.

[REDACTED] and [REDACTED] wished to make a complaint about Richard L. Dickinson, Assistant Scoutmaster with Troop 65, Liverpool, N.Y.

[REDACTED] told me that three (3) years ago he was invited to spend the weekend at Mr. Dickinson's home. This was not a Scouting event.

Mr. Dickinson told [REDACTED] that he had a surprise for him. That night they watched TV til Mr. Dickinson's [REDACTED] went to bed. Mr. Dickinson then began asking [REDACTED] questions about sex and touching him. The same thing happened Saturday night.

At summer camp (Sabattis) that same year, [REDACTED] went to the showers with a group of Scouts and Mr. Dickinson came along. (It is the Troop's policy that one adult accompany the boys to the showers.)

[REDACTED] said that the entire time he was taking his shower, Mr. Dickinson was watching him. That night at the campfire program, Mr. Dickinson was telling other people about [REDACTED] taking his shower, and what he looked like.

[REDACTED] told me that the Sheriff's Department told her that Mr. Dickinson had to leave Ohio because of this same problem. She also said that it bothers her to hear other mothers (of the boys in the Troop) talking about Mr. Dickinson doing things with their sons. (Meaning - - activities, etc. alone with the boy).

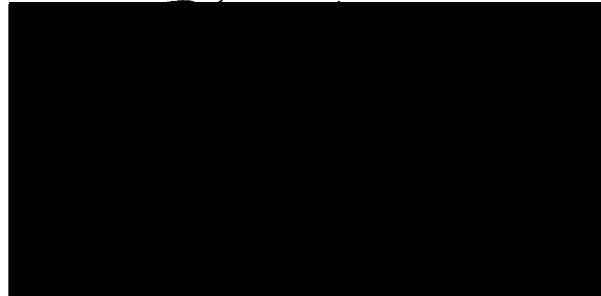
Three years ago I was sexually abused by one of the scout leaders in Troop 65. His name is Mr. Dickenson.

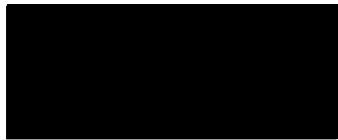

Dear Mr. Dickinson:

After careful review, we have decided that your registration with the Boy Scouts of America should be suspended. We are therefore compelled to request that you sever any relations that you may have with the Boy Scouts of America. A refund of your registration is enclosed.

You should understand that BSA membership registration is a privilege and is not automatically granted to everyone who applies. We reserve the right to suspend registration whenever there is a concern that an individual may not meet the high standards of membership which the BSA seeks to provide for American youth.

If you wish to have this decision reviewed by a Council review committee, please write to me within 60 days of the date of this letter, explaining your version of the facts supporting your claim that your registration as a BSA member should be reinstated. The procedures for a review of this decision are attached.

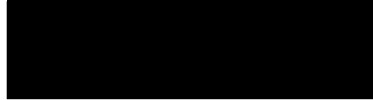
APPLICANT PROCEDURE FOR REQUESTING REVIEW OF DECISION

DENYING REGISTRATION

1. If registration is refused, the applicant may request a review of this decision. This request must be in the form of a written request from the individual which includes his or her version of the facts supporting the claim that registration should not have been denied.
2. Upon receipt of the written request for review, the president of the local council shall appoint a committee to review the situation.
3. The appointed committee should review the facts as presented, and, in addition, may interview any persons whose testimony might assist the committee in discovering the truth and arriving at a correct decision.
4. A confidential report will be given to the applicant setting forth the decision of the committee.
5. The applicant may - if he or she does not agree with the decision - request a review from the Regional Director.
6. If the Regional review does not satisfy the applicant, he or she may ask for further review by the National Council. The decision by the National Council is final.



Mr. Kruger read the letter of suspension as well as the procedure for requesting a review to Mr. Dickinson.

Mr. Dickinson indicated that he was not reregistered with the Troop, therefore, should not receive a refund of a registration fee.

He questioned the reason for the suspension. Mr. Kruger and Mr. Blacker indicated that it was due to evidence of improper personal actions with youth, and that any specifics were confidential. His right to request a review was restated. Mr. Dickinson indicated that he had a right to know what he was being charged with. We stated that no charge was being made, but that the Boy Scouts of America has the right and responsibility to determine who will serve as leaders. The review process was pointed out to him again.

He indicated that because of time problems, he was probably going to quit anyway, but is not happy about leaving in this manner and then he walked out without making any indication as to whether or not he would request a review.

SUBJECT: Richard J. Dickinson

Dear Don:

This is in response to your letter of February 16 concerning the above-named individual. I think any incident should be carefully investigated in order to make certain that we protect the youth who are involved in Scouting.

I am concerned about the length of time since the incident and also the fact that only one youth is involved. Do you know if there are any other youth who would make statements related to this type of situation?

I believe you should have the Scoutmaster or chartered organization discreetly make some other investigations into this type of situation. We certainly do not want to take the statement of one individual lightly, but why did they wait for three years in order to make charges? Has something recently happened that would cause them to do this? Has [redacted] remained an active member of Troop 55 for this entire time or did he drop out of Scouting three years ago?

If you feel that this family is reliable and that the charges are no doubt true, then I believe we should establish a file. We certainly want to protect youth in the future.

I am enclosing a Confidential Record Sheet which you could complete so that we may identify Mr. Dickinson. I believe we are in our rights to suspend registration and a letter should be sent to him indicating that. He should also be given the choice for a review.

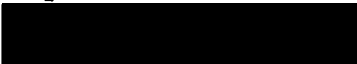

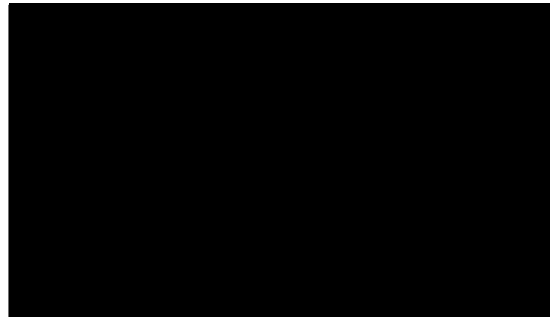
