Thank you for all the material you recently sent concerning the above named individual. This is most helpful to our file, and certainly will prevent him from registering in the future.

We contacted the Transatlantic Council related to this matter. We do find that Mr. Dilley was registered with Troop 347, in Athens, Greece as an Assistant Scoutmaster and Committee Member from December 1981 through February 1984. His wife was also registered as a Committee Member during 1983.

The council could not get any information on his discharge. The military indicated that if he had received a dishonorable discharge, he would have been automatically entered on the F.B.I. listing. This is all the material they had.

We do appreciate all your work and hope this can be settled soon, so that you no longer have a problem with it. We have never received any information on this individual prior to your information coming to us. We would like the outcome of the legal action in your council, once it is completed.

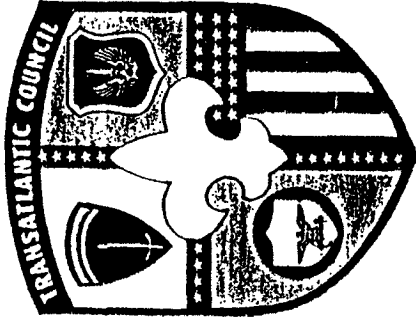
Thanks so much for your help. We will refuse any registration that comes to us from anywhere in the country in the future.

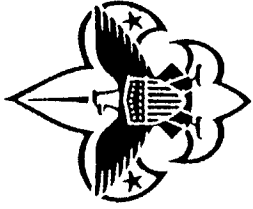

Dear Bob:

The above named individual has recently surfaced in Seattle, WA. He has been arrested for child sexual abuse. He had sexual relations with some fourteen and fifteen year old youth members who have been involved in Scouting.

The newspapers have been playing havoc with us in that they have discovered that Mr. Dilley was discharged from the Navy in 1983. This discharge was dishonorable and it was indicated in newspaper articles that he had sexual contact with boys at that time. This all occurred while he was a Scoutmaster in Greece.

We do not have any information in our file related to this individual. I wondered if you could do some checking and determine whether or not Mr. Dilley was registered as a Scoutmaster in Greece during the years of 1980, 1981, or 1982, before his discharge in 1983.

Any information you can give me would be most helpful in protecting the Boy Scouts of America.

After careful review, we have decided that your registration with the Boy Scouts of America should be denied. We are therefore compelled to request that you sever any relations that you may have with the Boy Scouts of America. A refund of your registration fee is enclosed.

You should understand that BSA membership registration is a privilege and is not automatically granted to everyone who applies. We reserve the right to refuse registration whenever there is a concern that an individual may not meet the high standards of membership which the BSA seeks to provide for American youth.

If you wish to have this decision reviewed by a BSA regional review committee, please write to the regional director within 60 days of the date of this letter, explaining your version of the facts supporting your claim that your registration as a BSA member should be reinstated. The procedures for the review of this decision are attached.

PROCEDURES FOR REVIEWING DENIAL
OF MEMBER REGISTRATION

The following information is provided should you desire a review by the Western Region, BSA of the decision to deny your registration.

1. Within 60 days, you must request in writing a review of this decision. Your request should be sent to the regional director, Richard Harrington, Western Region, BSA PO Box 3464, Sunnyvale, CA 94088-3464. In your request you may include your version of what occurred in support of your claim that your registration should not have been denied.
2. Upon receipt of your written request, a committee will be appointed to review the situation.
3. You may attend the review hearing, but it is not adversarial in nature and neither the committee nor you will be represented by legal counsel. If you wish, you may be accompanied by no more than two other individuals if their testimony might assist the committee in discovering the truth and arriving at a correct decision.
4. The committee will review the facts as presented, and may interview any persons whose testimony might assist them in arriving at a correct decision.
5. You will receive a letter setting forth the decision of the committee.
6. If you disagree with the decision of the committee, you may request a review of this decision by the National Council of the Boy Scouts of America.

Bid to free suspect in slayings of three on Bainbridge Island

Attorneys for a man charged with last year's slayings of three young people on Bainbridge Island asked yesterday for a dismissal of the charges based on "governmental misconduct."

A hearing on the motion is scheduled to resume today, said Eric Lind, attorney for Douglas Stanfield.

Stanfield is accused of the March 17, 1989, killing of Ty McCollough, 19, JayDee Phillips, 23, and Ann Rice, 19. The three were killed by gunshots as they

sat in a pickup truck in a remote area near Port Blakely.

Lind said the Kitsap County prosecutor's office committed numerous violations in preparation for the trial, which is set to begin next week.

For example, he said, the prosecution submitted a list of 37 witnesses last Tuesday and another 10 yesterday, not giving the defense enough time to prepare for them.

Attorneys for the prosecution could not be reached for comment.

The defense has also asked the

Kitsap County Superior Court to make the prosecutor's office pay \$6,000 for added legal fees in the event the motion for dismissal is denied.

Lind previously had asked the court to dismiss the charges against Stanfield saying the sheriff's and prosecutor's offices had leaked too much information to the media. That motion, filed in March, was denied.

Stanfield first became a suspect in November 1989, a few days after he contacted Kitsap County authorities to offer evidence in the case.

Three die in collision; road traffic delayed

A fiery head-on collision yesterday morning claimed the lives of three people and closed a portion of State Route 18 for three hours, the Washington State Patrol said.

The victims were identified as Rodney Givens, 22, of Kennewick; Lorraine M. Howell, 21, of Tacoma, a passenger in his car; and Billy Bailey, 51, of Puyallup.

Bailey was eastbound on the highway when his pickup truck

was struck by the car driven by Givens, who apparently crossed the center line, according to the Washington State Patrol.

Both vehicles burst into flames and all three victims were pronounced dead at the scene of the accident, a patrol spokeswoman said.

The accident closed traffic on State Route 18 between Interstate 5 and Hobart Road, the spokeswoman said.

Boy Scout leader charged

The leader of a Burien-area Boy Scout troop sponsored by the Mormon Church was charged with third-degree child rape yesterday in King County Superior Court.

Bail was set at \$25,000 for Richard Lloyd Dilley, 31, who remained in the county jail last night.

Dilley was arrested last Wednesday after a two-week in-

vestigation by King County special assault detectives.

The investigation began after a member of Dilley's scout troop told his parents about acts of child molestation and rape over the past two years, police said.

Tony Burt, King County police spokesman, said the investigation is trying to determine if there are more potential victims.

New chief for parks in county

A senior King County official has been named manager of the county's Natural Resources and Parks Division.

Barbara Wright, deputy director of the department that oversees parks, will be responsible for the 250-employee division.

The agency provides park and recreation services and manages 9,500 acres of natural areas.

The appointment, made by Executive Tim Hill, is effective tomorrow.

Before joining King County government 18 months ago, Wright served as director of Omaha Parks and Recreation.

In her new post, Wright said she will emphasize interpretative nature programs and building a strong network of volunteers.

CERTIFICATION FOR DETERMINATION OF PROBABLE CAUSE

2 That Scott A. Peterson is a Deputy Prosecuting Attorney for King

7 That this case contains the following upon which this motion for

9 [redacted] was born on [redacted] and is 14 years old.

11 Defendant Richard Lloyd Dilley was born January 12, 1959 and is 31
12 years old.

13 [redacted] and [redacted] are members of Boy Scout Troop 965 associated
14 with a Mormon church in Burien. Defendant has been Boy Scout Master
15 of that troop for the past two years. According to [redacted] defendant
16 has touched his penis 30 or 40 times while [redacted] was sleeping.
17 [redacted] said this happened sometimes while they were camping, but
18 usually at defendant's apartment in Burien when he was spending the
19 night there. [redacted] said that defendant masturbated him with his hand
20 and put his mouth on [redacted] penis on several occasions.

21 According to [redacted] defendant also touched him at defendant's
22 apartment in Burien while he was sleeping there. He said that
23 defendant reached underneath the blankets and rubbed his penis over
24 his clothing almost every time that he stayed there and that this
25 happened 30 or 40 times. He said that defendant reached underneath
his clothes to touch his penis at least once. He said that he woke
up when defendant touched him, but pretended to be asleep.

On August 22, 1990, King County Police Detective Susan Tucker
interviewed defendant. Defendant admitted touching [redacted] and
on the penis while they were sleeping. He said that he touched
[redacted] penis at least three times over his clothes while [redacted]
was sleeping. He admitted that he masturbated [redacted] eight or ten
times. He also admitted sexual contact with another boy in the troop.

Defendant told Detective Tucker he was a boy scout leader for a
troop in Greece where he committed a similar offense with a boy there.
He told Detective Tucker that he has difficulty controlling his urge
to reoffend.

We do not have any information in our file related to this individual. I wondered if you could do some checking and determine whether or not Mr. Dilley was registered as a Scoutmaster in Greece during the years of 1980, 1981, or 1982, before his discharge in 1983.

Any information you can give me would be most helpful in protecting the Boy Scouts of America.
