





- 5. Finally, we noted that a letter with these directives regarding has been sent to each registered family of the post and troop.


After bringing each item up to the three leaders I asked if it was clear on each point, there was no dispute.

- 4) The nature of the injury complained of or the right that is in need of protection, is described as the right of The Chicago Area Council to hold scouting functions and activities and to prevent accerfrom attending said activities because previously plead guilty to the charge of aggravated criminal sexual abuse, a Class 2 Felony, on April 7, 1989, for the molestation of a minor boy involved in scouting. On May 15, 1990, Allen was arrested and charged with aggravated criminal sexual abuse for molesting a minor girl, and is currently free on bond. Notwithstanding the fact that The Chicago Area Council Boy Scouts have previously suspended Robert Allen, he continues to seek an association with minor scouts in scouting activities and has, in fact, been present at recent Chicago Area Council activities involving minor children. Said presence was unauthorized. Given the fact that Allen is currently free on bond, his persistence in associating with minor children involved in CAC scouting activities and his past criminal activities involving the molestation of children, it is likely and probable that Robert Allen may seek to molest certain other minor children who are members of The Chicago Area Council Boy Scouts.
- The remedy at law is not adequate, and irreparable harm will occur if the Temporary Restraining Order is not granted because should Robert Allen molest or abuse any minor child who is a member of The Chicago Area Council, the Chicago Area Council and its members will be irreparably harmed and damage will occur:

#### VERIFIED COMPLAINT FOR INJUNCTIVE RELIEF

Comes now the Plaintiff, CHICAGO AREA COUNCIL, BOY SCOUTS

OF AMERICA (CAC), by and through its attorneys, BULLARO, CARTON

& STONE, and complaining of Defendant, states as

follows:

- 1. Plaintiff, The Chicago Area Council, Boy Scouts of America, hereinafter referred to as "CAC" is an Illinois Corporation engaged in the business of promoting the program of scouting through the organization and registration annually of units and their personnel; providing leadership and supervision of all program activities within the territory covered, namely the Chicago area, and insures compliance with the provisions of the bylaws of the Boy Scouts of America and the rules and regulations thereof.
  - 2. Defendant, resides at Chicago, Illinois 60638.
- 3. On April 7, 1989, pled guilty to the charge of Aggravated Criminal Sexual Abuse, a Class II felony. This charge arose out of the molestation of a minor boy involved in scouting. Judge Mary Jane Theis sentenced

four years probation with mandatory psychological counseling.

- 4. On May 15, 1990, Allen was arrested and charged with Aggravated Criminal Sexual Abuse for molesting a minor girl.

  Judge Bastone set bond at \$100,000.00. posted the requisite 10% (\$10,000) and is presently free on bond.
- 5. The Chicago Area Council suspended Remark who had been a registered volunteer, from any involvement with the Chicago Area Council, Boy Scouts after his conviction on April 7, 1989. Said suspension continues to be in effect.
- 6. Notwithstanding this suspension, continues to seek an association with minor scouts in Scouting Activities and has in fact been present at recent Chicago Area Council activities involving minor children. Said presence was funauthorized.
- 7. Given the fact that is currently free on bond, his persistence in associating with minor children involved in CAC scouting activities and his past criminal activities involving the molestation of children, it is likely and probable that a may seek to molest certain other minor children who are members of the Chicago Area Council Boy Scouts.
- 8. Should Remote molest or abuse any minor child who is a member of the Chicago Area Council, the Chicago Area Council and its members will be irreparably harmed and damage will occur: (a) to the reputation and good standing of the Chicago Area Council, Boy Scouts of America; (b) to the children involved in such scouting activities; and (c) by any

costs and judgments associated with future liability claims brought by children and their families against the Chicago Area Council, Boy Scouts of America for damages resulting from any such molestation by Robert Allen.

9. Plaintiff will continue to suffer irreparable injury for which it has no adequate remedy at law each time a molestation occurs unless the Defendant Robert Allen is restrained from any and all scouting activities held by the Chicago Area Council, Boy Scouts of America.

WHEREFORE, Plaintiff, CHICAGO AREA COUNCIL, prays that this Court grant the following relief:

- to restrain from any contact with or presence at any scouting activity involving minor children;
- b) Enter a Preliminary Injunction and permanent injunction enjoining the Defendant, Robert Allen from Chicago Area Council scouting activities.

### EMERGENCY MOTION FOR TEMPORARY RESTRAINING ORDER AND FOR PRELIMINARY INJUNCTION

Now comes the Plaintiff, THE CHICAGO AREA COUNCIL, BOY SCOUTS OF AMERICA (CAC), by and through its attorneys, BULLARO, CARTON & STONE, and pursuant to the Illinois Revised Statutes, ch. 110, sec. 11-101 moves this Court for a Temporary Restraining Order against to refrain from any activities associated with scouting functions which involve minor children, until such time as this cause may be set for prompt and expeditious hearing before the court. As grounds in support of said emergency motion, the Defendant states as follows:

#### I. MOTION FOR TEMPORARY RESTRAINING ORDER

1. Plaintiff hereby realleges Paragraphs 1 through 9, inclusive of the allegations contained in its Verified Complaint for Injunctive Relief as and for Paragraphs 1 through 9, inclusive of this Emergency Motion. A copy of the Verified Complaint for Injunctive Relief is attached and incorporated herein as Exhibit 1.

- 10. Plaintiff a not-for-profit, voluntary organization, has a clear and ascertainable right to conduct its activities in Illinois and to exclude certain persons from involvement in such activities.
- 11. The "public interest" of Illinois is to protect citizens and minor children from those who are predisposed to molest and abuse minor children. As such, the "public interest" clearly favors Plaintiff.
- 12. If Defendant restrained and is permitted to continue his association with and attendance at scouting functions, and the consequent probable molestation of children, Plaintiff will be immediately and irreparably damaged in the following respects:
  - a) Plaintiff's reputation and good standing will be severely injured and irreparably damaged each time Defendant associates with or is present at any scouting activity;
  - b) Plaintiff may be sued by parties molested, or injured as a result of Defendant's associations and conduct regarding scouting activities, thereby creating legal costs and potential money damages against Plaintiff;
  - C) Innocent children who attend Chicago Area Council Boy Scout functions will be harmed irreparably both physically and psychologically from said molestation.
- 13. Plaintiff is without an adequate remedy at law under these facts.
- 14. Plaintiff seeks only to preserve the status quo until there can be a final hearing on the merits., i.e. that children involved in Chicago Area Council Boy Scout activities and functions will be safe from contact with

remain unmolested. A final hearing on the merits can then be set for prompt and expeditious resolution before the court. Plaintiff will succeed in establishing said facts at trial.

- public welfare and criminal prosecution has proved ineffective or may in fact be ineffective, the court will enjoin the activity. City of Chicago vs. Festival Theatre Corporation, 88 Ill.App.3d 216, 410 N.E.2d 341 (1980). The hands of equity will not be bound merely because the activity sought to be enjoined also constitutes a criminal offense. Id. The courts of equity have power to enjoin criminal or immoral acts even though the offenders are amenable to prosecution and no property rights are involved, in order to protect citizens from public wrongs and to protect the public health and welfare. City of Aurora vs. Warner Brothers Picture Distributing Corp., 16 Ill.App.2d 273, 147 N.E.2d 694, (1968). In the instant case, the criminal laws may, in fact, prove to be inadequate in preventing molestation of children by

- 2. Upon the receipt of your written request, a committee will be appointed to review the situation.
- 3. You may attend the review hearing, but it is not adversarial in nature and neither the committee nor you will be represented by legal counsel. If you wish, you may be accompanied by no more than two other individuals if their testimony might assist the committee in discovering the truth and arriving at a correct decision.
- 4. The committee will review the facts as presented, and may interview any persons whose testimony might assist them in arriving at a correct decision.
- 5. You will receive a letter setting forth the decision of the committee.
- 6. If you disagree with the decision of the committee, you may request a review of this decision by the National Council of the Boy Scouts of America.




