



Eye Witness Statement by John M. Swanson, Camp Director

On Wednesday, August 3, 1966, Mr. Scoutmaster of Troop 186, Hoot Owl campsite, reported that Scout that Mr. Collier, our Rifle Range Instructor was acting "strange" to the boy when alone, and was "playing with the boy's privates."

I expressed disbelief, but asked that the bey, talk with me privately.

Thursday evening, August 4th, after evening campfire, I talked to He claimed Mr. Collier was "playing" with him when alone on the Rifle Range. We agreed that was to keep a Ment Badge appointment with Mt. Collier on Friday, and I would wetch hidden in the woods nearby.

At 1:30 PM Friday, August 5, I took up position in the woods near the range, and while hidden from their view, I find full view of the range shooting area. Mr. Collier was laying on a shooting mat seemingly asleep. They talked awhile, then picked up a rifle and began shooting on the range.

After shooting 10 minutes or so, Mr. Collier had lay on his back and Mr. Collier began to rub 's lower stomach and legs. He then bega to rub the boy's privates. At this point I interrupted by entering the range area.

We talked briefly about the range program and unrelated things, and I left saying I was going to visit a nearby campsite. I left the range and walked out of sight, then returned to hiding in view of the range shooting area again.

Observing again fired awhile on the range, and then again laid back. Mr. Collier tried to unbutton the boy's shorts. Being unsuccessful, Collier then ran his right hand under the boy's belt, and holding his privates begain to masterbate the boy.

At this point Flagain interrupted by returning to the range. I Remain with the boy and Mr. Collier until they had finished firing. I then walked the trail back to main camp with them.

Laid not at this time disclose my knowledge or findings to them.

- 1. Witnessed acts of Mr. Collier See statement.
- 2. Contacted Mr. Robert Reusch, Scout Executive by telephone out of camp. Informed Mr. Reusch of findings and discussed action to be taken.
- 3. Called Dr. of and requested he and his wife come immediately to camp for a conference on the situation. Dr. agreed to meet with me at 10 PM, Friday.
- 4. Contacted Mr. scoutmaster of the boy s troop in camp and requested he meet with me and the boy at Program Building #2 for a private discussion of findings and action to be taken.
- 5. Met with Mr. and the boy reviewed findings and made written statements.
- 6. Dr. arrived in camp early. Met with Dr. Mr. with our written statements. I informed Dr. of action presently being planned a. To discharge Mr. Collier from employment quietly, and b. to request National Council BSA to "flag" the man from future Scouting membership. I further informed Dr. of the right to prosecute under the law, and requested that he do so.

 Dr. concluded that he did not wish to procecute, but would cooperate with us in any way needed to prevent Mr. Collier from being in such a position with boys again. Meeting closed with agreement to quietly release Mr. Collier, and keep our knowledge private. Dr. remained in camp with his son's unit overnight.
- 7. Called Mr. Reusch land informed him of action to be taken Agreed.
- 8. Out of camp, called Mr. R. Yerrick of Owosso, informing him of Mr. Collier's discharge and requested he come to camp to provide transportation for Collier at 1:30 PM on Saturday. (Mr. Yerrick being a personal friend of Mr. Collier and myself, no explaination for my actions was necessary for Mr. Yerrick to respond.)
- 9. No contact on discussion was made with Mr. Collier during any of the above procedure.
- 10. Informed Mr. C. Troupe, Camp Ranger, of impending discharge of Mr. Callier in morning, and requested his presence as witness and use of bis home for the meeting. Agreed.

Informed 1. 8:45 AM - Met with Mr. Collier & Mr. Troupe in Ranger's homes a. He was discharged from camp

b. He was to pack his gear this morning and Mr. Yerrick would provide transportation at 1:30 PM to Owosso.

was not going to prosecute him

d. That information known would be forwarded to the Nationa Chauncil BSA.

(Note: We did not actually state what information we were referring to nor did we actually state WHY he was being discharged.)

Mr. Collier expressed no surprize, moreover immediately broke down withou any accusations being expressed. He stated he was sorry and asked forgiveness. He stated: "He thought he had it licked - You don't know how hard I've tried - I just can't help myself

Collier then expressed his thanks that Dec did not wish to prosecute. In tears he asked what he should do. I told him he should quietly leave camp, say nothing to the staff, and make arrangements for medical assistance.

He responded that he would. I told him I would help him if I could. He expressed agreement, but then stated he was going to "take-off". Our meeting then ended.

- 2. Mr. Collier returned to his tent, packed his gear, and remained in his tent without lunch. (one check found him sleeping.)
- 3. Mr. Yerrick camp to camp, and at 1:30 PM, we loaded Mr. Collier's gear
- aboard the stationwagon and he left camp.

 4. On Sunday, upon the return of the Camp Staff, I informed the Staff that Mr. Collier had left. To explaination was given, except: Think not you are an indispensible guy, for in graveyards many indispensibles Lie.


