6-1-73 Cases Heard in Nashua District Court

In cases heard yesterday in Nashua District Court during an unusually lengthy session which lasted until 8 p.m., Edward Miller Jr., 20, of 16 Central St., was ordered bound over for the September term of Superior Court on three counts of false pretenses following a probable cause hearing. Associate Justice Nicholas Pantelas ordered bail set at \$5,000.

Miller also pleaded innocent to failing to appear in court and was found innocent. A charge of burglary was dismissed when no probable cause was found.

He pleaded guilty to driving while intoxicated, second offense and was fined \$500, sentenced to 10 days in the House of Correction and his license was revoked for three years.

A fourth count of false pretenses and a disorderly conduct charge were dropped.

Ashley Flagg, 21, of 27 1/2 East Pearl St., was bound over for the September term of Superior Court on a charge of attempted rape following a probable cause hearing. He was ordered held without bail. He agreed to return to Maine voluntarily to face charges of a moral offense and robbery on a fugitive justice charge.

David McKeen, 18, of 14 Millbrook Drive, was bound over for the September term of Superior Court on charges of larceny from the person and attempted larceny from the person following a probable cause hearing. Bail of \$3,000 was continued.

Glenn Fuller, 22, of Coram, N.Y., pleaded innocent to possession of a controlled drug, marijuana, and was found innocent. He pleaded innocent tounkenness, but was found guilty after trial and fined \$50.

John Parker, 43, of Pelham, pleaded innocent to driving

while intoxicated, but was found guilty after trial and fined \$200, \$50 suspended, and his license was revoked for 90 days. He appealed the case.

In cases heard today by Chief Justice Kenneth F. McLaughlin and Associate Justice Pantelas, Russell St. Onge, 25, of 3 Kinsley St., pleaded innocent to driving while intoxicated and trial was ordered for June 14 with bail of \$200 set.

Robert Bishop, 44, of 4 Laton St., pleaded no contest to a moral charge and was fined \$150, sentenced to three months in the House of Correction, suspended, placed on probation for one year and ordered to the Community Council.

Malcolm Bois, 20, of 9 Williams St., pleaded guilty to operating a motorcycle without a motorcycle license and was fined \$25. He pleaded no contest to excessive noise and was fined \$25. Bois pleaded guilty to a one-way street violation and was fined \$15.

Robert Morse, 17, of 19 Beacon St., pleaded guilty to driving without a license and was fined \$25.

John Taylor, 45, of Merrimack, pleaded no contest to driving with an uncovered load and was fined \$50, suspended.

David Anderson, 20, of Rindge, pleaded guilty to driving with an uncovered load and was fined \$25.

Carl Letendre, 17, of 157 Lake St., pleaded guilty to speeding and was fined \$30.

Dennis Michaud, 17, of 17 Hobbs Avenue, pleaded guilty to speeding and was fined \$30.

Glenn Laponsee, 48, of 44 King St., pleaded guilty to driving with defective equipment and was fined \$25.

LITCHFIELD CASES:

Pleading guilty to possession of beer by minors and fined \$25 each were Marc Beebie, 17, of 66 Marine Avenue; Arthur Lachance,

17, of 35 Haines St.; and James Taylor, 17, of 75 Vine St.

Donald St. Pierre, 17, of 3 Blossom St., forfeited \$25 bail for possession of beer by a minor.

Brian Hightower, 18, of Lowell, Mass., pleaded guilty to possession of beer by a minor and the case was filed without a finding. He pleaded guilty to evading a fare and was fined \$10.

Robert Bartlett, 18, and William Chase, 18, of Derry, pleaded guilty to evading fares and were fined \$10 each.

Daniel Beaudry, 18, of 50 Underhill St., pleaded guilty to possession of beer by a minor and was fined \$10.
