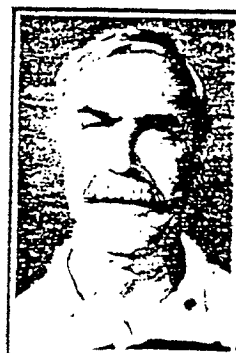

The Yosemite Area Council has received information from [redacted] accusing him of sexually molesting [redacted].

A statement from [redacted] is attached, as is an article she was interviewed for.

Information from [redacted] including a specific request to deny registration for [redacted] is attached.

Interviews with [redacted] indicate problems and corresponding physiologic counseling in a number of cities were he was stationed during his tenure in the military.

His most recent physiologist was Dr. Swanke in Modesto Ca.

[redacted] fears that upon his return to the United States from Saudi Arabia he will attempt to re-register in Scouting. They expect he will settle in Florida, probably the Fort Lauderdale area.

Huber said, the abuse ranges from fondling, to rape to seduction. Emotional sexual abuse is almost as destructive if not worse, she explains. These are the fathers who lurk possessively around their daughters wanting to attempt a sexual overture but never having the nerve.

His daughter is subconsciously aware of this sexual threat and remains constantly alert and tensed. "It's like waiting for the other shoe to drop," Huber said.

Unfortunately parents usually vehemently deny this abuse, she explains. The fathers feel either it's their right, or they rationalize by saying their daughters enjoy it or really don't see their sexual overtures as abuse.

These victims grow up constantly subconsciously tense and "on the alert," when men are present.

Usually their parents have severe personality disorders and were abused as children. They have probably subconsciously sought out abusing mates, according to Huber.

The women frequently are dependent, dysfunctional individuals who simply cannot risk losing their security by dealing with the problem.
