Dear Mr. Sleik:



As a former Boy Scout myself, I fully understand your concern, but as I recall, when I was a Boy Scout there was also a concern over the Constitution of the United States, the Constitution of the State of Florida, and preserving to each person in this country the right to be considered innocent until proven guilty. At this time I cannot explain Mr. Oldroyd's version of the facts to you as there are pending, though not filed, criminal charges against Mr. Oldroyd. Until those are resolved in his favor, I ethically cannot consider any statements by Mr. Oldroyd being given to you. I do think that Mr. Oldroyd's registration as a member of the Boy Scouts of America has been wrongfully and hastefully suspended as there are no allegations against Mr. Oldroyd of any validity and there certainly has been no proof against him in a Court of law.

In asking the Council Review Committee to review your decision to suspend his membership, I am simply asking the Committee to give the benefit of the doubt to someone who has been a valued and loyal member of the Boy Scouts of America for a reasonable amount of time, and who has done great service through his membership for youths in the Central Florida Community. I am sure that the Council Review Committee realizes that in our system of government, where we have an absolute Constitutional Right to free speech, anyone can be accused of anything, but proof is quite a different matter.

By way of compromise, I would request that you reinstate Mr. Oldroyd's registration with the Boy Scouts of America, but place it on an inactive status wherein he would still be a registered member until such time as his actions have been proven not to measure up

to the high standards of membership of the Boy Scouts of America, or he is cleared of the allegations against him. In an inactive status, he would not take any action on behalf of the Boy Scouts of America nor act in any way which would affect the Boy Scouts of America, but still would be a registered member. This is something he is extremely proud of and deems to be very important in his life.

Thank you for your consideration of these matters.

Police dispatcher charged with sex assault on teen

State prosecutors Friday charged an Apopka police dispatcher with lewd and lascivious assault on a 15-year-old member of the department's Explorer post.

Robert Oldroyd, 25, is off the job without pay. The investigation started when the boy's parents complained in mid-March of "a possible sexual" relationship between their son and the dispatcher, who advises the Explorer post.

Mark Blechman, one of Oldroyd's attorneys, said the dispatcher "categorically denies each of the charges, 100 percent. He's ing to fight."

he investigation into Oldroyd's

conduct triggered an inquiry that led to the resignation of Deputy Tom Woodard from the Orange County Sheriff's Office.

During questioning about the boy last month, Oldroyd said he had had an affair with Woodard.

Woodard is not accused of wrongdoing with children.

Both men admitted during the sheriff's internal affairs investigation that they had a homosexual encounter about 1½ years ago. Woodard said he resigned under pressure on April 27 but is seeking reinstatement. His attorney is expected to file a lawsuit on his behalf next week.

Three weeks later, Oldroyd asked to be relieved of his position as supervisor of communications and placed back on a regular dispatcher shift.

Oldroyd, a graduate of Winter Park High School, has a clean work record that contains two letters of commendation for his handling of an incident involving a stolen car.

Oldroyd worked for Apopka police from 1984 to 1986 but left for a better-paying job. In January 1987 the department hired him away from the Orange County Fire Department.
