- a. Allowing her husband, Defendant Robert J. Vehoski, to commit the assaults and batteries upon Plaintiff;
- b. Failing to warn Plaintiff about the dangerous propensity of Defendant Robert J. Vehoski to commit sexual assaults on minors.
- c. Otherwise failing to use reasonable care to protect the safety of its guests.
- 17. That the Defendants, Joe Wyckoff, Tom
  Trainer, Juanita Ferguson, Boy Scouts of America Detroit
  Area Council, and William S. Ford Memorial United Methodist
  Church owed a duty to Plaintiff, in particular to maintain a ...
  safe environment for members of Scout Troop #526.

- 18. That notwithstanding said duty, Defendants did violate same by:
- a. Failing to properly select a leader for Scout Troop #526.
- b. Failing to train and educate Plaintiff and other members of Scout Troop 526 to use reasonable care and caution when confronted with said acts by their scout leader.
- c. Failing to properly supervise, direct and control the activities of Defendant scout leader of Troop #526.
- d. And otherwise failing to take reasonable precautions and to protect the safety of its scouts.
- 19. That the Defendant Robert J. Vehoski was acting both as an individual and as a Scout Leader of the Defendants of America and thus the Defendants Joe Wyckoff, Tom Trainer, Juanita Ferguson, Boy Scouts of America and William S. Ford Memorial United Methodist Church are vicariously liable for the actions of Defendant Robert J. Vehoski.
- 20. That as a direct and proximate cause of the negligence of all Defendants, Plaintiff has suffered severe headaches, physical illness, nightmares, and embarrassment, humiliation and mental anguish. Further that Plaintiff has expended sums of money for medical treatment and therapy.

WHEREFORE, Plaintiff prays for judgment against all defendants or against those defendants whom the court determines to be liable to the Plaintiff under the facts determined, in whatever amount greater than Ten Thousand (\$10,000.00) Dollars the trier of fact shall deem he be entitled to and granting such other relief as may be just and equitable.

#### COUNT II

#### False Imprisonment

Plaintiff repeats and reallege paragraphs 1 through 20 as though set forth herein.

- 21. That on the dates and at the locations set forth in paragraph 10, 11 and 12, Defendant Robert J. Vehoski, then and there imprisoned Plaintiff, by threat of force and assertion of authority causing Plaintiff to yield to that force.
- a. by staying outside the door of the bedroom which Plaintiff was required to use while at Defendant Robert J. Vehoski's residence.
- b. by utilizing the same tent, at the camp site, which Defendant Robert J. Vehoski had assigned Plaintiff.
- $\hbox{c. by forcing Plaintiff to maintain secret}\\$  the assaults and batteries committed by Defendant Robert J. \\ Vehoski.
- 22. That The imprisonment was against the will of Plaintiff and was without any reasonable cause whatsoever.
- 23. That the Defendant, Mary Ann Vehoski owed a duty to Plaintiff while an invited guest in her residence, in particular to maintain safe premises.
- 24. That notwithstanding said duty, Defendant Mary Ann Vehoski, did violate same by:
- a. allowing her husband, Defendant Robert J. Vehoski, to commit the act of false imprisonment against Plaintiff.
- b. failing to use reasonable care to protect Plaintiff from those acts which she knew or should have known would result in the imprisonment of Plaintiff by her husband Defendant Robert J. Vehoski.

- c. and otherwise failing to take reasonable precautions and to insure the freedom of Plaintiff.
- 25. That Defendants Joe Wyckoff, Tom Trainer, Juanita Ferguson, Boy Scouts of America and William S. Ford Memorial United Methodist Church owed a duty to Plaintiff, in particular to maintain a safe, free environment for Plaintiff, a member of Scout Troop \$526.
- 26. That notwithstanding said duty, defendants did violate same by:
- a. Failing to properly select a leader for Scout Troop #526.
- b. Failing to train and educate Plaintiff and other members of Scout Troop #526 to use reasonable care and caution when confronted with said acts by their scout leader.
- c. Failing to properly supervise, direct and control the activities of defendant Scout Leader of Troop #526.
- d. and otherwise failing to take reasonable precautions and to protect the safety and freedom of movement of its scouts.
- 27. That the Defendant Robert J. Vehoski was acting both as an individual and as a Scout Leader and thus who the defendants Joe Wyckoff, Tom Trainer, Juanita Ferguson, Boy Scouts of America and William S. Ford Memorial United Methodist Church are vicariously liable for the actions of Defendant Robert J. Vehoski.
- 28. That as a direct and proximate cause of the negligence of all defendants, Plaintiff has suffered severe headaches, physical illness, nightmares, and embarrassment, humiliation and mental anguish.

Further that Plaintiff has expended sums of money for medical treatment and therapy.

WHEREFORE, Plaintiff prays for judgment against all defendants or against those defendants whom the court determines to be liable to the Plaintiff under the facts determined, in whatever amount greater than Ten Thousand (\$10,000.00) Dollars the trier of fact shall deem to be entitled to and granting such other relief as may be just and equitable.

- 29. That on the dates and at the locations set forth in paragraph 10, 11 and 12, the acts of Defendant Robert J. Vehoski were extreme and outrageous in particular the:
- a. touching, rubbing and massaging of Plaintiff's back, thighs, buttocks and penis,
  - b. false imprisonment,
- c. use of force, assertion of authority in committing the acts,
- $\mbox{ d. violation of trust between Scout Leader} \\ \mbox{ and Scouts.}$
- 30. The acts of Defendant Robert J. Vehoski were intentional.
- 31. The acts of Defendant Robert J. Vehoski were of the type to cause any reasonable person severe emotional distress.

- 32. Plaintiff did suffer severe emotional distress as a result of Defendant Robert J. Vehoski's acts. Further said Defendant should have realized that his conduct involved an unreasonable risk of causing the distress and from the facts known to him should have realized that the distress might result in illness or bodily harm.
- 33. That the Defendant Mary Ann Vehoski owed a duty to Plaintiff while an invited guest in her residence, in particular to maintain an environment free from extreme and outrageous and negligent conduct.
- 34. That notwithstanding said duty said defendant did violate same by:
- a. allowing her husband, Defendant Robert J. Vehoski, to commit the sexual acts causing the mental distress against Plaintiff.
- b. failing to use reasonable care to protect Plaintiff from those acts which she knew or should have known would result in severe mental distress.
- c. and otherwise failing to take reasonable precautions and to protect Plaintiff from the abnormal acts committed upon Plaintiff while an invited guest in her residence.
- 35. That defendants Joe Wyckoff, Tom Trainer, Juanita Ferguson, Boy Scouts of America and William S. Ford Memorial United Methodist Church owed a duty to Plaintiff, a member of Scout Troop #526.
- 36. That notwithstanding said duty, defendants did violate same by:
- a. failing to property select a suitable leader for Scout Troop #526.
- b. failing to train and educate Plaintiff and other members of Scout Troop #526 to use reasonable care

and caution when confronted with said acts by their scout leader.

- c. failing to properly supervise, direct and control the activities of defendant Scout Leader of Troop #526.
- d. and otherwise failing to take reasonable precautions and to protect the mental and physical health of Plaintiff while a member of Troop #526.
- 37. That the Defendant Robert J. Vehoski was acting both as an individual and as a Scout Leader and thus, the defendants, Joe Wyckoff, Tom Trainer, Juanita Ferguson, Boy Scouts of America and William S. Ford Memorial United Methodist Church are vicariously liable for the actions of Defendant Robert J. Vehoski.
- 38. That as a direct and proximate result of the negligence of all defendants, Plaintiff has suffered severe headaches, physical illness, nightmares, and embarrassment and humiliation and mental anguish.

Further that Plaintiff has expended sums of money for medical treatment and therapy.

WHEREFORE, Plaintiff prays for judgment against all defendants or against those defendants whom the court determines to be liable to the Plaintiff under the facts determined, in whatever amount greater than Ten Thousand (\$10,000.00) Dollars the trier of fact shall deem to be entitled to and granting such other relief as may be just and equitable.

#### COUNT IV

#### Negligence

Plaintiff repeats and realleges paragraphs 1 through 38 as though set forth herein.

- 39. Prior to the commission of the wrongful acts by Defendant Robert J. Vehoski, each of the remaining defendants knew or should have known of said defendants propensity and/or predisposition to commit such wrongful acts.
- 40. Further, each of the defendants possessed the power to prevent, or aid in preventing, the commission of such wrongful acts by said defendant Robert J. Vehoski, and accordingly owed a duty to the Plaintiff to prevent, aid in preventing and/or attempt to prevent the commission of such wrongful acts.
- 41. Notwithstanding such knowledge and powers, the defendants breached their duty by neglecting, failing and refusing to prevent, aid in preventing or attempt to prevent the commission of such wrongful acts.
- 42. As a direct and proximate result of such neglect, failure and refusal of the individual defendants, Plaintiff suffered the injuries previously set forth and Plaintiff is entitled to the damages previously set forth.

WHEREFORE, Plaintiff prays for judgment against all defendants or against those defendants whom the court determines to be liable to the Plaintiff under the facts determined, in whatever amount greater than Ten Thousand

(\$10,000.00) Dollars the trier of fact shall deem to be entitled to and granting such other relief as may be just and equitable.


