Dear Mr. Klock:

First of all, thank you very much for your comprehensive letter of January 19, 1989. It included all the information I needed.

I have supervised John Sherman on Parole for Marsachusetts and New Hampshire for 2 years. On August 22, 1984 John was convicted of Aggravated Felonious Sexual Assault in the Grafton County Superior Court, and was sentenced to 5 to 15 years. On February 6, 1984 John Sherman was convicted of Rape of a Child in the Middlesex County Superior Court and sentenced to  $4\frac{1}{2}$  to 3 years. He was paroled on February 19, 1987 with several spec at conditions, one of which was no contact with children under the age of eighteen.

John's offenses stemmed from his involvement with the Boy Scouts in Massachusetts.

I want to thank you for cooperating with the Pine Tree Council, Boy Scouts of America in the matter concerning Robert John Sherman. The purpose of my recent inquiry about Mr. Sherman was to verify rumors of a previous child abuse conviction. We work very closely with chartering institutions of Scout Troops and Cub Packs to protect children. BSA denies membership to convicted child abusers.

On November 21, 1988 Mr. Sherman applied for membership as the Committee Chairman of Scout Troop #154 of Fryeburg-Lovell Kiwanis Club and began conducting meetings and planning camping trips with the boys. On a December camping trip several parents became uncomfortable with his relationship with the boys. They requested a background check by the Kiwanis Club and the Scout Council.

Our background check revealed that Mr. Sherman falsified a great deal of information on his Scout Membership Application. This concealed the fact that his BSA membership had been revoked for reasons of sexual child abuse convictions in the Algonquin Boy Scout Council in Framingham, Mass. several years ago. A copy of his membership application is enclosed for your file.

On January 11, 1989, Robert Denlinger, Scout Executive of the Pine Tree Council, placed a personal phone call to Mr. Sherman ordering him to cease all activities and relationships with the Boy Scouts of America. He has also been informed in writing that his application for membership has been denied.

We reserve the right to suspend registration whenever there is a concern that an individual may not measure up to the high standards of membership the BSA seeks to provide for American youth.

If you wish to have this decision reviewed, please write to me within sixty (60) days of the date of this letter, explaining your version of the facts supporting your claim that your registration as a BSA member should be reinstated. The procedures for review are attached.

# Man admits to child-porn middlesex news

CAMBRIDGE — A former Framingham youth leader admitted in court Wednesday that he took nude photographs of four Framingham boys and raped two of them earlier this year.

John Sherman, 32, changed his plea Wednesday at Middlesex Superior Court and admitted his guilt on charges of rape of a child, indecent assault and battery of a child, and distribution of obscene material.

Superior Court Judge Richard S. Kelley said he will sentence Sherman on Dec. 16. Middlesex Assistant District Attorney Paul Kelley said he will recommend a six- to eight-year sentence at Walpole State Prison for Sherman.

William Homans. Sherman's defense attorney, deferred making a sentencing recommendation until the sentencing hearing next month. Homans said his client will be examined by a psychiatrist before sentencing.

Sherman refused to enter a guilty plea to a charge of rape of a child by force, and that charge will be filed without a change of plea.

Sherman also pleaded no contest to a charge that he iraudulently took two boys on a New Hampshire camping trip last May 13 with the intention of sexually assaulting them.

Although he admitted that he took the boys on the trip and took photographs of them in the nude. Sherman said he did not intend to harm the boys when he took them on the trip.

The charges involve four youths, all of whom are boys 12 and 13 years of age, Paul Kelley said in court.

Sherman admitted to the charge of rape of a child — which carries a maximum sentence of life imprisonment — when he admitted that he performed oral sex on two of the victims last June 3 in Framingham. He also admitted that he encouraged the same boys to perform sexual acts with each other as he took nude photographs of them on June 3.

Wearing a suit and a tie, Sherman spoke in a quiet voice as he answered questions from Judge Kelley. Paul Kelley read aloud from written records of victims' statements in court. The victims were not present in the courtroom, but the parents of two of the boys were there.

The parents submitted a letter from their family counselor to Judge Kelley for consideration prior to sentencing.

Sherman, whose permanent residence is in North Woodstock. N.H., lived in Framingham prior to his arrest June 9.

Sherman was a Cub Scout den leader and assistant Boy Scout leader for many years in Framingham. Additionally, he is a former volunteer tutor at the Potter Road Elementary School, where each of the victims was a student, according to Paul Kelley. Sherman is also a former youth group leader in the YMCA.

Sherman has also been indicted by a grand jury in New Hamshire on two charges of committing illegal sexual acts with two 12-year-old Framingham boys. He has pleaded innocēnt to those charges and is expected to appear in court next week.

# Request to suppress evidence denied

CAMBRIDGE — An accused child molester suffered a legal setback Wednesday when a Middiesex Superior Court judge refused to suppress evidence senzed during his arrest.

Attorneys for John Sherman, 22, of Framingham had filed a motion to suppress evidence seized during his arrest and also to disallow any statements he

may have made to police during his arrest.

Sherman, a well known Framingham youth leader, was indicted earlier this year by a Middlesex County grand jury on 12 charges of sex offenses against five Framingham boys.

In a written opinion, Judge John Paul Sullivan threw out that request and ordered a trial date set, according to Assistant District Attorney Paul Kelley. He added that a trial date should be known within the next few days and that the state is ready to proceed at any time.

Sherman is also scheduled for trial in New Hampshire during the week of Oct. 31.

Sherman is a former youth group leader in the YMCA and scouting, and a former elementary school tutor.

The five alleged victims were 11 and 12 years old and all of the alleged offenses took place in Framingham, according to the

### indictments.

The 23-person grand jury issued the following indictments: rape of a child by force on June 3; three counts of statuatory rape of a child on June 3 and other unspecified dates; and indecent assault and battery on a child under 14 years old on June 3.

Also, five counts of enticing for uniawful sexual intercourse on March 12, May 13, and May (Continued on 4B)

20: and two counts of posing a child in nudity — taking photographs of two children on June 3.

An arraignment date has not been set.

Sherman is currently free on \$3.000 bail set by Framingham District Court on charges stemming from a June 9 arrest by Framingham police, who.charged hum with enticing. A week later, he was charged with 11 other sex offenses against youngsters.

He has also been indicted by a grand jury in New Hampshire on two charges of committing illegal sexual acts with two 12-year-old Framingham boys. Sherman pleaded innocent at arraignment in June. He posted \$5,000 bail set by that court.

A resident of 445 Potter Road, Framingham, until his arrest, Sherman has been charged with enticing local boys to his New Hampshire bome for sex and taking photographs of nude boys.

Local police said they seized a camera containing photos of nude boys performing "explicit sexual acts" during a search of Sherman's Framingham home. Sherman was a Cub Scout den leader and assistant Boy Scout leader for many years.

## Trial set in boy enticement

FRAMINGHAM — A local man pleaded innocent Friday to charges that he enticed two 12-year-old boys to his New Hampshire home for sex.

Join Sherman. 32, of 445 Potter Road. Framingham. and also of Lost River Road. North Woodstock. N.H., was arraigned on two counts of enticing a person for prostitution or sexual intercourse at Framingham District Court Friday morning.

Judge Anthony DiBuono set bail at \$5.000 surety or \$500 cash: Sherman opted for the \$500 bail and was released, according to a court official. A trial date was set for June 17.

Sherman was arrested on a warrant at his Framingham home late Thursday night.

Police said that Sherman had enticed two boys from the Framingham area to visit his home in New Hampshire sometime in May. The youths did not tell their parents about the alleged incident until earlier this week, and the police were notified on Tuesday.

No money was believed to be exchanged, police said.

# Soliciting prostitution alleged

FRAMINGHAM — A local in man was jailed Thursday night on charges of enticing two area boys for prostitution, according

to police. John Sherman. 32, of 445 Potter Road, Framingham, and Lost River Road. North Woodstock, N.H., was arrested at 445 Potter Road at 11:30 p.m. on a warrant from Framingham District Court.

Police said the arrest stemmed from complaints by parents of two 12-year-old boys trom the Framingham area that Sherman had attempted to entice the boys to visit his home

in New Hampshire.

The incident allegedly took place in May, police said. The boys did not tell their parents until early this week, police said.

The warrant charged him with enticing a person for the purpose of prostitution or sexual intercourse and enticing a person away for the purpose of prostitution or sexual intercourse.

Sherman was held overnight and was scheduled to be arraigned today at Framingham District Court. police said.
