# Guilty plea precludes scheduled trial

Robert O. Broddle was scheduled to go on trial in Hopkins Circuit Court yesterday.

Broddle was indicted June 24, 1986, for one count of second-degree sodomy and two counts of second-degree sexual abuse of a minor.

However, as the jury gathered in the courtroom, a guilty plea was being arranged behind the scenes.

At about 10 a.m., Hopkins Circuit Judge Thomas Spain was notified that a plea agreement had been reached, and the court moved to Spain's chambers out of the jury's earshot.

Commonwealth Attorney Al Spenard told the court that, according to the plea-bargain, the sodomy count would be amended to fourth-degree assault and the other two counts would be dismissed.

Spenard recommended that Broddle's sentence be fixed at 12 months in the Hopkins County

Detention Center. The commonwealth attorney also said he would recommend that the defendant be placed on intensive probation, that he have no contact with the victim or his family, that he not participate in any Scouting or programs in-

# Dying to be thin

Wife: 'My body image was so distorted I thought I was so much heavier'

If Karen hadn't gone on a diet, she might never have succumbed to the eating disorders called anorexia and bulimia.

"My problem started out as a simple diet, when I went from 160 to 110 pounds," she said.

When she weighed about 120 pounds, Karen said, she decided she wasn't losing enough weight. "I had gotten to where I was so thin that I felt I'd just explode

"I got to where I exercised too much, I was making myself throw up, using diuretics and laxatives." Her brain and body weren't receiving enough nutrients to function properly, Karen said, and the chemical imbalance began to impair her memory.

Severe dieting deprives the brain of chemicals, she said, and you don't even realize it is happening. Vomiting, or purging after eating is especially hazardous. It depletes the body's potassium, a major electrolyte, and the end result could be

Two persons were treated last night at Regional Medical Center for injuries police said were sustained in a fight at the Hunters Club on Hopewell Avenue.

John Arthur Leavell of 405 Hopewell was listed in "fair" condition this morning at RMC. John Stafford of 251 W. Noel was released from the hospital after emergency treatment for cuts and stab wounds, according to police.

Investigating officer J. Denton Stewart said the fight broke out over a cigarette lighter. He said Stafford sustained a cut from mid-ear under his right ear, but "not very deep," and that he was stabbed in the lower back and right side. The fingers of his right hand were also cut,

Conditions of his probation include 30 days in the Hopkins County Detention Center, on work release, 100 hours of community service, and he is prohibited from participating in the

the hijackers would keep the royal family members as "a winning card."

It was not clear exactly why the talks had been suspended or when they would resume.

When the talks reached an impasse Wednesday night, they were suspended to let all parties rest, the Algerian official said. Algeria set up a high-level negotiating committee, divided into two teams, led by Interior Minister Hedi Khediri.

Snial Hamdani, one of Algeria's most experienced diplomats and secretary general of the Foreign Ministry, headed the team responsible for contacts with the Kuwaiti delegation, led by Deputy Foreign Minister Mohammed Al-Osaimi. Hamdani was involved in the successful negotiations of Algerians for the release of the

Boy Scouts or any youth organization. He is also not to be alone with anyone under 18.

He and others placed on probation will pay all applicable fees and court costs.

Janice Adams was originally charged with four counts of second-degree rape, and four counts of second-degree sodomy. She pleaded guilty to two counts of rape, and the other six counts were dismissed. Her sentence was fixed at five years on each count with a recommendation they run concurrently.

Because the victim was a minor, she was not eligible for probation and was sentenced to serve the sentences for a total of five years.

Danny Ray Ipock, under sentence for three counts of second-degree possession of a forged instrument, was placed on probation for five years.

Condition for probation includes that he employ contractors or abstain from sexual intercourse. Ipock has three children that he is paying child support, and one child out of wedlock.

Other conditions include 15 days in the DC, restitution, and no association with the victim. Spain has imposed the contravention/abstinence requirement before, but this is the first time it has been given to a male in Circuit Court.

Jimmy Lee Jones was placed on intensive probation for two years for possession of

less than eight ounces of marijuana, and receiving stolen property valued at less than \$100.

Conditions of his probation include 30 days in the DC on work release, abstinence from all marijuana and drug use, continued counseling, and to share what smoking marijuana had done to him with young people.

Johnny C. Minor, under a year's sentence for second-degree assault under extreme emotion disturbance, was denied probation, and was sentenced.

William F. Sullivan Jr. was placed on probation for five years. He had pleaded guilty to second-degree burglary. Probation conditions include 30 days in the DC, work release if he's called back to work, restitution of \$200.60, no association with his co-defendants.

Dennis Stone was granted shock probation for three years. He had been serving a year for third-degree burglary. Conditions include restitution, and no association with his co-defendants.

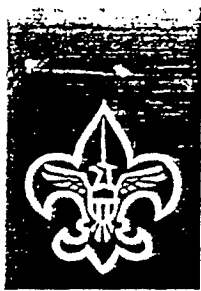

PROCEDURE FOR REQUESTING REVIEW  
OF DECISION DENYING REGISTRATION

1. If registration is refused, the applicant may request a review of this decision. This request must be in writing from the individual and must include his or her version of the facts supporting the claim that registration should not have been denied.
2. Upon receipt of the written request for review, the president of the council shall appoint a committee to review the situation.
3. The appointed committee should review the facts as presented, and in addition, may interview any persons whose testimony might assist the committee in discovering the truth and arriving at a correct decision.
4. A confidential report will be given to the applicant setting forth the decision of the committee.
5. The applicant may - if he or she does not agree with the decision - request a review from the regional director.
6. If the regional review does not satisfy the applicant, he or she, may ask for further review by the National Council. The decision by the National Council is final.
