After careful review, we have decided that your registration with the Boy Scouts of America should be terminated. We are therefore compelled to request that you sever any relations that you may have with the Boy Scouts of America. A refund of your registration fee is enclosed.

You should understand that BSA membership registration is a privilege and is not automatically granted to everyone who applies. We reserve the right to refuse registration whenever there is a concern that an individual may not meet the high standards of membership which the BSA seeks to provide for American youth.

If you wish to have this decision reviewed by a BSA regional review committee, please write to the regional director within 60 days of the date of this letter, explaining your version of the facts supporting your claim that your registration as a BSA member should be reinstated. The procedures for a review of this decision are attached.

The following information is provided should you desire a review by the <u>Western</u> Region, BSA, of the decision to deny your registration.

- 1. Within 60 days, you must request in writing a review of this decision. Your request should be sent to the regional director, <u>Western</u> Region, BSA. In your request you may include your version of what occurred in support of your claim that your registration should not have been denied.
- 2. Upon the receipt of your written request, a committee will be appointed to review the situation.
- 3. You may attend the review hearing, but it is not adversarial in nature and neither the committee nor you will be represented by legal counsel. If you wish, you may be accompanied by no more than two other individuals if their testimony might assist the committee in discovering the truth and arriving at a correct decision.
- 4. The committee will review the facts as presented, and may interview any persons whose testimony might assist them in arriving at a correct decision.
- 5. You will receive a letter setting forth the decision of the committee.
- 6. If you disagree with the decision of the committee, you may request a review of this decision by the National Council of the Boy Scouts of America.

INCIDENT REPORT

Shortly before, or around, July 4, 1990, was contacted by Robert Tubbs and invited to come over to his home to work on some Scouting related activities. For some time prior to the reported incident Bob had shown a special interest in Scouting.

While at Bob's home, videos, which agreed to. After watching together for a while Bob excused himself to change into something more comfortable. He returned later in a pair of bikini briefs. Bob then offered a pair and invited him to do the same. After some encouragement complied by removing his clothes and putting on the briefs as Bob watched. They then returned to watching videos until Bob suggested they change back into their regular clothes. After redressing excused himself and went home.

No report was made of this incident by at that time, but when Bob called some time later and invited him over again told his parents of the incident.

The incident was reported to the Boy Scout Office, Sept. 12, 1990, by Phyllis Johnson of the Regional Treatment Center for Sex Abuse, and on September 13, 1990, this oral report was heard and recorded by "J" Dean Anderson, District Executive, who fielded the initial report and Tom Bird, Assistant Scout Executive, of the Lake Bonneville Council.



TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

On October 15, 1990, I held a personal meeting with Mr. Robert Tubbs. This meeting was requested by myself in order to discuss our desire to deny Mr. Tubbs membership as an adult leader in the Boy Scouts of America. Our office was informed by a state case worker that Mr. Tubbs has been charged with sexual abuse. The case did not merit his arrest because the abuse charge was dropped due to lack of evidence.

However, I personally know Mr. Tubbs and he knew it was a close call and also knew I was required to withdraw his membership. I told him that I had helped him years ago get back into Scouting and that this time I was sorry but he would now have to give up any work with boys or adults in the Boy Scouts of America.

He did not question my reason and understands this is the best thing to do for both of us. He hopes to solve his problems in counseling and therapy. We departed knowing that I was taking immediate action to withdraw his membership.
