
In regards to your letter of July 12th inquiring on the status of Robert W. Steinbach.

Detective suspended in sex case

Chief Cliff Stanley. Steinbach was suspended Tuesday, Stanley said.

A 20-year veteran Denver police detective has been suspended for 10 days pending an investigation of allegations that he sexually assaulted [REDACTED] police said yesterday.

Pat Sullivan, Arapahoe County sheriff, said deputies look evidence earlier this week from Steinbach's home in Arapahoe County. He said juvenile members of Steinbach's police Explorer program also are being questioned in the investigation.

Robert W. Steinbach, co-sponsor of the department's youth Explorer program, could lose his pay during the suspension if felony charges are filed against him by the Arapahoe County Sheriff's Department. This week, said Assistant Police

Sullivan said the alleged attack involving Steinbach occurred over a period of time several years ago. He would not reveal what prompted the probe. Steinbach has not been arrested.
