Ex-scoutmaster gets jail term in sex case

A former Lincoln Park scoutmaster who admitted engaging in sexual conduct with a boy over a two-year period was sentenced yesterday to a 364-day term in the Morris County Jail.

Superior Court Judge Stephen Smith imposed the jail sentence, along with five years probation, on Roy Franklin, 28. The judge disregarded recommendations that the defendant not be incarcerated, stating he had "serious reservations" about treating the matter so leniently.

Franklin, who could have been sent to prison for five years, pleaded guilty to endangering the welfare of a minor, according to Morris County Assistant Prosecutor James Porfido. He said the victim in the case, now age 15, no longer lives in the state and did not want to pursue more serious charges.

The victim was abused between August 1989 and April, Porfido said.

Porfido and Joel Harris, Morris County's deputy public defender, had

urged the judge to impose a probation term on Franklin, along with a requirement he perform supervised labor. They acknowledged Franklin had himself been a sexual abuse victim as a youngster and was undergoing counseling.

Smith balked at a non-custodial sentence, however, explaining he felt it would be sending the wrong message to other persons who abuse their positions when involved with supervising young people.

The judge ordered Franklin to undergo a psycho-sexual evaluation and any recommended therapy as part of his probation. He also barred the man from having any further contact with the victim in the case or becoming involved in other child-oriented organizations.

"I think this is a minimal sentence as far as such an offense is concerned," Smith said.

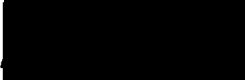

After careful review, we have decided that your registration with the Boy Scouts of America should be denied. We are therefore compelled to request that you sever any relations that you may have with the Boy Scouts of America. A refund of your registration is enclosed.

You should understand that BSA membership registration is a privilege and is not automatically granted to everyone who applies. We reserve the right to refuse registration whenever there is concern that an individual may not meet the high standards of membership which the BSA seeks.

If you wish to have this decision reviewed by a BSA regional review committee, please write to the regional director with 60 days of the date of this letter, explaining your version of the facts supporting your claim that your registration as a BSA member should be granted. The procedures for a review of this decision are attached.

1. Within 60 days, you must request in writing a review of this decision. Your request should be send to the Regional Director, B.S.A. In your request you may include your version of what occurred in support of your claim that your registration should not have been denied.
2. Upon receipt of your written request, a committee will be appointed to review the situation.
3. You may attend the review hearing, but it is not adversarial in nature and neither the committee nor you will be represented by legal counsel. If you wish, you may be accompanied by no more than two other individuals if their testimony might assist the committee in discovering the truth and arriving at a correct decision.
4. The committee will review the facts as presented, and may interview any persons whose testimony might assist them in arriving at a correct decision.
5. You will receive a letter setting forth the decision of the committee.
6. If you disagree with the decision of the committee, you may request a review of the decision by the National Council of the Boy Scouts of America.
