Dear Mr. Belk,

On May 12th 1989 I requested to be reinstated as Scoutmaster of troop 436, Port Orange, Florida.

On May 21st 1989 I received a letter from Southeast Region stating the procedures for reinstatement. Since this time I have been requesting this memorandum of decision and all I have been receiving is form letters for response to this mysterious memorandum of decision, of which I finally received, four months later, on September 7th 1989, from Central Florida Council.

In reading the memo I wonder why Mr. Marvin Hardy's occupation was not stated as the other review committee members were. Could he be an attorney? He attended my review with Mr. Ron Carroll, who stated that all attorneys had left the room.

When it came to my name and occupation, it was stated as if I were merely a bloor sweeper, and what bearing does my age have to do with the situation? If age is such a factor, why wasn't the ages of the committee members and the adult Waltons' stated?

I am employed by the K-Mart Corporation and have been for the past 24 years. Presently I hold the position of Processing Center Manager.

I am a member of St, Paul's Catholic Church, St. Paul's choir, member of Knights of Columbus.

My scouting achievements are, 5 year webelos den leader, 5 year District Training Committee, Woodbadge Trained, Catholic Religious Award, Vistrict Award of Merit, Scouter's Key, Trained Scouters Award, Trained Cub Scout Award, Optimist Friend of Youth Award, Order of the Arrow Vigil Award, and also have advanced 28 scouts to the rank of Eagle. All of the above awards I list with great pride, so I cannot see why I can't be reguarded as "nice folks and a good citizen". It seems to me that you are more than a little bias. There is no listing of names or occupations of the sive persons who supported me at the review, also there seems to be no mention of the numerous letters and phone calls made to council on my behalf. I also read in the memorandum that the Walton boys and parents were interviewed in the comfort of their home, where I was summoned over to Certral Florida Council and not afforded the same consideration. If the Waltons are as knowledgeable about scouting as you claim, why don't they make mention of this rule about a Scoutmaster not having a scout in his house, in his car, on the scout bus, in a tent, or at a meeting hall, one on one? This is the first time I have heard of this rule and in talking with other scouters throughout the State, not one of them had any knowledge of this rule. Scout Executives have been known to have had one on one conferences with scouts.

I resent your implication that I was responsible for both the Walton boysnot receiving their advancement in the troop, to refresh your memory, I had already been terminated, besides which it was the responsibility of the troop committee.

It greatly disturbs me that my file has been reviewed by Mr. Richard Parkinson, State's Attorney's Office of Orange County, Florida, along with many others.

Mr. Ron Carroll has, on many occasions, stated emphatically, that my file would be kept confidential at all times.

In the memorandum it clearly states that "this review is an administrative civil review and not a criminal proceeding". If indeed this is true, my question is, why is Mr. Richard Parkinson being consulted. This is a question I also intend to take up with the State's Attorney's Office, Volusia County, Florida. It has become apparent to me that B.S.A. does not abide by the laws or Constitution of the United States, and believes that the States Attorney's Office of Volusia County, Florida has acted in an incompetent manner reguarding my situation.

Gentlemen, I do not know what further steps I can take to disprove the allegations that have been leveled against me, other than I was never approached or charged by the Daytona Beach Police Dept. of the crime I was supposedly accused of. The States Attorney's Office of Volusia County has never filed any charges (because there is no truth to the ir accusations).

My troop committee has sent letters of my credibility, also the Pastor and Associate Pastor of the Port Orange United Methodist Church, and letters from Eagle Scouts.

If it is possible I will bring a lawsuit against the Waltons for defamation of character, mental anguish, and for the depletion of my savings, and bills that have to be paid for trying to clear my name.

Gentlemen, I have made mistakes in the past, as Mr. Carroll has so pointedly stated, by using B.S.A. Stationary to request reinstatement to scouting, but a mistake I have never made is the one I stand accused of, as God is my witness.

In the beginning I believe that the two boys were interviewed improperly. By not separating the boys and interviewing them separately then comparing their stories, and I know council would have a different opinion of my position.

During this whole ordeal, Central Florida Council has treated me as if I were guilty, and not innocent until proven guilty.

DEAR BIR.

WE WOULD LIKE TO PRESENT OUR STATEMENT OF WHAT TRANSPIRED FROM THE ONSET OF THIS INCIDENT. SINCE WE WERE THE FIRST PERSONS OUTSIDE OF THE FAMILY TO SECOME AWARE OF THE PURPORTED INCIDENT. WE WILL REFRAIN FROM MAKING LOGICAL JUDGEMENTS AND CONCLUSION AT THIS TIME AND JUST PRESENT A TRANSCRIPT OF WHAT OCCURRED.

AT APPROXIMATELY NINE O'CLOCK ON THE EVENTING OF SEPTEMBER 04.1983 MR. CLIFF HARTLEY, A COMMITTEE MEMBER OF TROOP 435 RECIEVED A CALL FROM EXPRESSING HIS CONCERN OVER THE STORY HE HAD GOTTEN FROM HIS SONS. RELEVANT TO AN INCIDENT WHICH HAD SUPPOSEDLY OCCURRED THE PREVIOUS SATURDAY WHILE THE BOYS WERE INDIVIDUALLY AT MR. ROY GORSKI'S HOME, COMPLETING ADVANCEMENT REQUIREMENTS FOR AN UPCOMING COURT OF HONOR TO BE HELD WITHIN THE NEXT TWO WEEKS.

AFTER THE STORY WAS RELATED TO MR. HARTLEY. WAS TOLD HE WOULD CHECK INTO IT AND CALL HIM BACK IN A FEW DAYS. MR. HARTLEY THEN PROCEEDED TO CALL ME TO LET ME KNOW THAT WE HAD A PROBLEM AND DETERMINE HOW WE SHOULD PRECEED IN HANDLING THIS SITUATION. THE DECISION WAS MADE THAT WE SHOULD GO TO THE THE FOLLOWING EVENING TO TALK WITH THE PARTENTS AND THE BOYS TO DETERMINE WHAT WAS REALLY TRANSPIRING (THE DETAILS WERE VERY SKETCHY AT THAT TIME FROM WHO SEEMED TO BE FAIRLY EMOTIONAL). MR. HARTLEY THEN CAME TO TO MY HOME AND FILLED ME IN ON WHAT HE HAD BEEN TOLD. THE WARE CALLED AND GAVE US PERMISSION TO COME OVER AND TALK TO THE BOYS TO GET THEIR STORY. IN GETTING THE STORY FROM THE BOYS. IT WAS BROUGHT OUT THAT THE BOYS HAD NOT TOLD THEIR PARENTS FRELY, BUT HAD TO BE COAXED FROM THE BOYS BY THEIR MOTHER.

WE WENT TO THE HOME AND SAT DOWN WITH THE PARENTS AND THE TWO BOYS. WHEN WE ASKED THE OLDER BROTHER FOR HIS STORY, HE WAS QUITE RELUCTANT TO SAY ANYTHING: HIS STORY WAS FILLED WITH UMS AND AAHS AND IT WAS VERY DIFFICULT TO GET A STRAIGHT ANSWER OUT OF HIM SO WE THEN ASKED THE YOUNGER BROTHER. HE WAS OPEN IN RELATING HIS STORY, AND ALL THROUGH HIS TELLING OF THE STORY, THE OLDER BROTHER WOULD JUST SIT THERE AND SAY "SAME FOR ME", REGARDLESS OF WHETHER HE WAS RELATING INCIDENCES OR RELATIVE TIME FRAMES. THE PRIMARY INGREDIENT HERE IS THEY WERE AT MR. GORSKI'S AT DIFFERENT TIMES!

THE DETAILS OF THE STOR, AS PRESENTED TO WAS IS AS FOLICHS:
THE OLDER SROTHER WAS THE FIRST TO ARRIVE. THE REST OF THE
FAMILY WENT OVER TO A LOCAL COLLEGE AND PLAYED TENNIS WHILE
WAS AT MR. GORSKI'S. THE PARENTS AND MR. GORSKI HAD AGREEDED THAT
IT WOULD REQUIRE ABOUT AN HOUR TO COMPLETE THE REQUIREMENTS THEY
NEEDED FOR THEIR ADVANCEMENTS.

UPON ARRIVAL, THEY SPENT FIFTEEN OR TWENTY MINUTES WORKING ON THE MATERIAL THEY NEEDED TO COMPLETE FOR ADVANCEMENT. THEY THEN BEGAN TO WATCH A VIDEO TAPE MOVIE WHILE WAITING FOR THEIR FAMILY TO COME BACK. SOMEWHERE DURING THE MOVIE, THEY BEGAN WRESTLING: HOW IT BEGAN AND WHO INSTIGATED IT WE DO NOT KNOWN. HOWEVER, THE POINTS THAT THE BOYS MADE WERE: "HE(MR. GORSKI) HAD ME IN A SCISSORS LOCK AND WAS HUMPING AGAINST ME" AND "HE HAD ME PINNED AND WAS HOLDING ME BY THE SHOULDERS AND WAS LAYING ON ME". AGAIN THE POINT NEEDS TO BE MADE THAT THE YOUNGER BROTHER IS RELATING THE STORY AND THE GLDER SROTHER IS SITTING THERE SAYING "THE SAME FOR ME".

AFTER THIS WE FOUND OUT HOW THE PARENTS FOUND OUT ABOUT THE STORY. APPARENTLY THE MOTHER WAS WALKING PAST THE BOY'S BEDROOM AND OVERHEARD THE BOY'S TALKING ABOUT WRESTLING. SHE THEN CONFRONTED THEM TO FIND OUT WHAT THEY WERE TALKING ABOUT SINCE THE PARENTS DID NOT ALLOW THEM TO PARTICIPATE IN "ANY" SPORTS ACTIVITIES WHICH INVOLVE PHYSICAL CONTACT. I.E. FOOTSALL, WRESTLING. STC. IT WAS AFTER THE PARENTS TALKED ABOUT IT THAT MR. HARTLEY WAS CALLED AND WE GOT INVOLVED.

SO WE HEARD THIS STORY, AND AS WE WERE ABOUT TO LEAVE, THE MOTHER INFORMED US THAT THEY HAD ALREADY CALLED THE POLICE AND HAD FILED A COMPLAINT (WHICH HAS SUBSEQUENTLY BEEN DROPPED BY THE POLICE). AT THIS POINT, WE DECIDED IT WOULD BE BEST FOR US TO ABSTAIN FROM ANY FOLLOW-UP ACTIVITY AND INQUIRED OF THE DISTRICT COMMISSIONER WHAT LIABILITIES. IF ANY. WE MAY HAVE BROUGHT UPON OURSELVES. THE TROOP. OR BEA BY INTERVENING IN THE ISSUE.


THE FOLLOWING NIGHT, MR. GORSKI HAD A VISIT AT HIS HOME BY CENTRAL FLORIDA COUNCIL AND WAS GIVEN A CHECK FOR HIS REGISTRATION AND HIS MEMBERSHIP WAS "REVOKED" NOT SUSPENDED. HOWEVER, ALL SUBSEQUENT CORRESPONDENCES FROM COUNCIL DIRECTED HIS ACTIVITIES AS IF HE WAS ON SUSPENSION, NOT REVOCATION OF HIS MEMBERSHIP.

ON A PERSONAL NOTE, WE FEEL MR. GORSKI HAS BEEN MISTREATED BY THE LOCAL COUNCIL. HIS REINSTATEMENT WOULD GO FAR IN EASING THE CONCERN THE VOLUNTEER LEADERSHIP OF THE HALIFAX DISTRICT HAS TOWARD THE CENTRAL FLORIDA COUNCIL. AND MORE SPECIFICALLY. TO CITE ONE ISSUE WHICH HAS THE ENTIRE TROOP IRATE, THE COUNCIL EXECUTIVE IN ONE LETTER THREATENED TO REVOKE THE MEMBERSHIPS OF ALL THE ADULT VOLUNTEERS AND DISBAN THE TROOP IF WE DID NOT REFRAIN FROM ASKING QUESTIONS IN SUPPORT OF MR. GORSKI'S POSITION. THIS IS SOMETHING WHICH WE FIND DIFFICULT TO BELIEVE THAT NATIONAL BSA CONDONES.

HEMORANDUM OF DECISION

A review committee consisting of William A. Barwick, C. Jonathan Champion and Marvin Hardy, was appointed in March of 1989 by Jon Sleik, President of the Central Florida Council, B.S.A., to review the suspension of registration of Roy Gorski and to determine whether the registration of Roy Gorski should be reinstated.

is a who serves as Treasurer of the Central Florida Council of the Boy Scouts of America. He was in the Boy Scouts as a boy and has been a member of the Troop Committee of Troop 24, sponsored by the First Presbyterian Church of Orlando.

C. Jonathan Champion is in the insurance business in Winter Park, Florida. In March of 1989, Mr. Champion served as Vice-President of Properties of the Central Florida Council of the Boy Scouts of America. Mr. Champion now serves as the Central Florida Council's Vice-President of Finance. Mr. Champion achieved the rank of Eagle as a Boy Scout and has two sons who achieved the rank of Eagle. Mr. Champion served three years as a Scouting professional, serving as District Executive in Lake County, Florida. He served seven years as Scoutmaster of Troop 625, sponsored by the Episcopal Church of the Good Shepherd, in Maitland, Florida. Mr. Champion has also served several years on the Woodbadge training staff.

Marvin Hardy, who was appointed chairman of the review committee, achieved the rank of Eagle, and has two sons who have achieved the rank of Eagle. In March of 1989, Mr. Hardy served as Vice-President of Administration of the Central Council of the Boy Scouts of America, and is now Council Commissioner. Mr. Hardy has been a member of the Troop Committee of Troop 24, sponsored by the First Presbyterian Church of Orlando. Mr. Hardy served three years as a District Chairman in the Central Florida Council of the Boy Scouts of America.

Mr. Roy Gor i has served as Scoutmaster of Goop 436, sponsored by the Port Orange United Methodist Church. Mr. Gorski has been involved in Scouting for about thirteen years. Mr. Gorski is about 45 years old and is employed as a stockroom worker by K-Mart, at in Daytona Beach. Mr. Gorski's registration in the Boy Scouts of America was suspended on September 8, 1988 after two boys of Troop 436, and filed a complaint on September 5, 1988, concerning Mr. Gorski. The complaint was filed with the Daytona Police Department. A copy of the letter which suspended Mr. Gorski's registration, and which was delivered to Mr. Gorski on September 8, 1988, is attached to this Memorandum of Decision.

The three members of the review committee talked with Mr. Roy Gorski at a Review Hearing that was held on Thursday, March 23, 1989. The Review Hearing was held at the Council Headquarters of the Central Florida Council. The review committee also heard from five persons who accompanied Mr. Gorski to the Review Hearing. Two of the persons who spoke at the Review Hearing are members of the Port Orange United Methodist Church, which sponsors Troop 436. The review committee also considered letters from the Pastor and Assistant Pastor of Port Orange United Methodist Church. Copies of the letters from the Pastor and Assistant Pastor are attached.

Mr. L. J. Gillard, Jr., P.E., of Ormond Beach, who is an active Scout worker, also spoke to the chairman of the review committee in support of Mr. Gorski. The review committee has also considered two letters from Mr. Gorski, one dated November 29, 1988, and the other dated March 1, 1989, copies of which are attached. The review committee has considered a letter from Paul J. Dubbeld, attorney at law, dated February 21, 1989.

All three members of the review committee have interviewed the two boys, and and who will with the Daytona Beach Police Department. The parents of the two boys, and have also been interviewed by all three members of

the review committee. The interview of these four meters of the family occurred on Wednesday, April 5, 1989 at the home in Port Orange.

Mr. Roy Gorski invited to come to his home on Saturday, September 3, 1988, to work on some advancement requirements. Mr. Gorski stated that he would be out of town the next week and he wanted to complete some advancement requirements with

The parents of dropped at Mr.

Gorski's house at about 6:30 P.M. on September 3. After going over some advancement requirements, Mr. Gorski engaged in wrestling and pinned to the floor.

Mr. Roy Gorski violated a policy of the Boy Scouts of America by having in his home alone. One-on-one activities between an adult and a youth member of the Boy Scouts are not authorized by the Boy Scouts of America. The Boy Scouts of America has a policy that there should be a buddy system of boys meeting with an adult. The Boy Scouts of America also requires two deep adult leadership for all trips and outings.

At about 7:30 P.M., was picked up from Mr. Gorski's house and was dropped off at Mr. Gorski's home. After going over some requirements with Mr. Roy Gorski also engaged in wrestling, and pinned to the floor. Mr. Gorski again violated a policy of the Boy Scouts of America by having visit the Scoutmaster alone in the Scoutmaster's home.

Mr. Roy Gorski. date of birth is was 12 years old when Mr. Gorski engaged in a wrestling match. weighs 93 pounds and stands about 4'8" tall.

when Mr. Gorski engaged in wrestling with on September 3,

1988. weighed about 115 pounds on April 1989, and probably weighed less than 115 pounds on September 3, 1988.

As of September 3, 1988, had progressed to the rank of First Class and was having a Scoutmaster's conference prior to an upcoming Board of Review. He was anticipating promotion to Star Scout. As of September 3, 1988, had progressed to the rank of Star Scout and had completed the requirements for promotion to the rank of Life Scout. He was having a Scoutmaster's conference in anticipation of being promoted to Life.

was reported to have passed the Board of Review for Life but Troop 436 did not award him his Life Scout badge after Mr. Gorski's registration was suspended.

is reported to have passed his Board of Review for Star Scout but Troop 436 did not award him his Star Scout badge after Mr. Gorski's registration was suspended.

Mr. Roy Gorski admitted at the Review Hearing that wrestling with the boys in his troop is something in which he engages. Mr. Gorski admitted at the Review Hearing that pinning to the floor occurred during the wrestling at his home on September 3, 1988.

The statements of and and indicate that a lewd assault occurred upon the two boys while the boys were alone with Mr. Gorski on September 3, 1988. Each boy states that he was pinned with his back to the floor and while on the floor Mr. Gorski got on top of the boys and ground his groin area in an up and down motion against the groin area of each of the boys. The boys state that they were held on the floor for a long time against their will.

States that Mr. Gorski also moved Mr. Gorski's groin area in an up and down motion in areas of body above groin area.

and state that they have not retracted the statements they gave to the Daytona Beach Police Department.

The review semmittee has been unable to determine any motive or reason why the members of the family would make false statements about Mr. Gorski. The four members of the family interviewed by the committee appear to be nice folks and good citizens with no motive to go through what they have been through except that the actions complained of actually occurred.

and was a Brownie as a youth. Moreover mother was a Girl Scout leader. States that her brother received his Eagle Scout Award and his God and Country Award in Coral Gables, Florida, and states that her brother has been encouraging and to continue in Scouting.

The matters that and related to the members of the review committee have been reviewed with Richard Parkinson, who serves as a prosecutor in the Child Abuse Division in the State Attorney's Office of Orange County, Florida. Mr. Parkinson states that he would have prosecuted Mr. Roy Gorski if the events of September 3, 1988 related by and by had occurred in Orange County, Florida. He would have prosecuted for lewd assault in violation of Section 800.04, Florida Statutes. A copy of Section 800.04,

The fact that the State Attorney's Office of Volusia County did not prosecute Mr. Gorski, and the fact that the Police Department of Daytona Beach did not forward the charges to the Office of the State Attorney, do not provide grounds to reinstate Mr. Gorski's membership. This review is an administrative civil review and not a criminal proceeding.

Florida Statutes is attached.

The Boy Scouts of America has sought to maintain high standards of adult leadership. Scouting seeks to provide admirable adult role models for the youth involved in Scouting.

wrestling adults with boys is nowhere sugarted in the literature of the Boy Scouts of America as a means of relating to youth or of providing leadership to youth. Wrestling one-on-one by a Scoutmaster with a boy at the Scoutmaster's home, and pinning the boy and keeping him on the floor for a long period of time, is conduct that seriously undermines or compromises the high standards of conduct expected of Boy Scout leaders. The events of September 3, 1988 at Roy Gorski's home at the very least gave the appearance of serious impropriety.

The review committee finds that Roy Gorski does not meet the high standards required of adult leaders of the Boy Scouts of America.

Mr. Roy Gorski's judgment and actions have been such that his membership or his registration in the Boy Scouts of America should not be reinstated.



Dear Mr. Carroll:

Please be advised that this law office has continued to represent the interest of Mr. Roy Gorski regarding the frivolous allegations that were filed against him by two (2) individual members of the boy scout community. I have had continued contact with Debbie Bramlett, Detective with Daytona Beach Police Department regarding her investigation and I have found it to be totally lacking. I say this as both a seasoned prosecutor and also as a certified instructor for the law enforcement community. I have repeatedly attempted to get Detective Bramlett to conclude her investigation and either announce the rightful finding that Mr. Gorski has done no wrong and that the case would not be further processed or, alternatively, forward the matter to the Office of the State Attorney in order that we might have either additional investigation and/or a more judicious finding. I have finally prevailed upon Detective Bramlett to dismiss the case; translated to the Boy Scouts of America this means that the case did not even pass the initial threshold of investigation. While I am delighted that this has occurred on Mr. Gorski's behalf, I am somewhat concerned as to any future repercussions Mr. Gorski may suffer as a result of the ridiculous statements issued by the two (2) young invididuals. I can parenthetically state to you that I issue this concern as a current Eagle Scout (1970).

My experiences both as prosecutor and as a defense attorney lead me to conclude that allegations such as those which Mr. Gorski faced are so easily issued yet so hard to disprove. I would again underscore to the Boy Scouts of America that it is rare for allegations of this gravity to be summarily dismissed by the police department. Members of the law enforcement community tend to be more strict and less judicious in their evaluations of these cases. Therefore, if

the law enforcement community summarily dismisses the same, the Boy Scouts of America can verily believe that there was not one (1) iota of veracity as to the allegations which were issued.

I certainly hope that this assists the Boy Scouts of America in re-instating Mr. Gorski immediately as to his position over the course of our conversations and my background checks of Mr. Gorski, I certainly believe that Roy is a tremendous asset to the Scouting movement. I am personally delighted at having met his acquaintance and at the prospect of benefit which Roy can provide to the scouting movement. If I might be of any other assistance on this matter regarding the underlying charges, or any questions regarding Roy's dedication to the Scouting movement, please do not hesitate to contact me.

APPENDIX D

APPLICANT PROCEDURE FOR REQUESTING REVIEW OF DECISION DENYING REGISTRATION

- 1. If registration is refused, the applicant may request a review of this decision. This request must be in the form of a written request from the individual which includes his or her version of the facts supporting the claim that registration should not have been denied.
- 2. Upon receipt of the written request for review, the president of the local council shall appoint a committee to review the situation.
- The appointed committee should review the facts as presented, and, in addition, may interview any persons whose testimony might assist the committee in discovering the truth and arriving at a correct decision.
- 4. A confidential report will be given to the applicant setting forth the decision of the committee.
- 5. The applicant may—if he or she does not agree with the decision—request a review from the regional director.
- 6. If the regional review does not satisfy the applicant, he or she may ask for further review by the National Council. The decision by the National Council is final.

APPENDIX D

APPLICANT PROCEDURE FOR REQUESTING REVIEW OF DECISION DENYING REGISTRATION

- 1. If registration is refused, the applicant may request a review of this decision. This request must be in the form of a written request from the individual which includes his or her version of the facts supporting the claim that registration should not have been denied.
- 2. Upon receipt of the written request for review, the president of the local council shall appoint a committee to review the situation.
- 3. The appointed committee should review the facts as presented, and, in addition, may interview any persons whose testimony might assist the committee in discovering the truth and arriving at a correct decision.
- 4. A confidential report will be given to the applicant setting forth the decision of the committee.
- 5. The applicant may—if he or she does not agree with the decision—request a review from the regional director.
- 6. If the regional review does not satisfy the applicant, he or she may ask for further review by the National Council. The decision by the National Council is final.

Dear Sirs:

On or about Saptember 1, 1988, Boy Scout Master Roy Gorsky, Troop 436 of the Central Florida Council, contacted us concerning our son who was then a member of the troop. He stated that it would be necessary for to visit his. Gorsky's, home to be interviewed prior to the up-coming Board of Review, pursuant to being promoted to the rank of Star Scout. He stated that this Scout Master's Conference was necessary for to be promoted.

My wife.

agreed to bring to Gorsky's home on September Third at approximately 6:30 p.m.

As planned, we delivered to the Scout Masters home. While there it was agreed that we would return in approximately one hour to retrieve and, at that time would leave our oldest son. for a Scout Master's Conference. had completed the requirements for promotion to the rank of Life Scout. We went from there to a nearby public park so that we would be close by.

At approximately 7:30 p.m. we picked up and dropped off at the Scout Master Roy Gorsky's home. We picked up at 8:20 and went home.

Later that night. and related their experiences at Gorsky's home to their mother. At that time she, was quite concerned but decided not to mention their accounts to me. Two days later, after some thought, she changed her mind and had and tel me of their experiences, which I will now try to relate in

this letter. The first few minutes of the time at Gorsky's house were used to go over the requirements of advancement and asking a few questions. Gorsky then engaged each boy in a wrestling match. He pulled to the floor from behind and lay with his body over the boy's. twelve years old at that time. Gorsky told to "wiggle out" of the hold. Then Gorsky proceeded to grind his groin against said he did not want to wrestle and asked if they could watch television. Gorsky ignored the request and continued his actions. After about 15 minutes convinced Gorsky that he did not want to wrestle any more. told Gorsky that his parents would be there to get him at any minute. Gorsky then allowed to watch television. told us that after this Gorsky was very friendly to him.

When was left there and retrieved, he, received the same treatment. Both boys have told us they were frightened, that they tried to avoid the contact and that they were anxious for us to return.

This was the first and only time either boy was left alone with this individual, whom, at that time. we trusted.

Immediately after hearing the boy's accounts and seeing their enactments of the physical motions involved. I took them to the Daytona Beach Police Department where we filed a complaint against Gorsky.

Some questions asked by the police and their answers should be recorded for fairness and clarification:

- Q: Did at any time the individual touch your private parts with his hands?
- A: No.
- Q: Did the individual ever use vulgar or obscene language or remarks?
- A: No.
- Q: Did the individual ever expose any part of his private parts to you?
- A: No.

I do not believe that the negative responses to these questions reveals a lack of harmful intentions on Gorsky's part. In any case we feel fortunate that the situation was not more damaging to our sons than it was. We certainly do not feel that there could be any justification for such an individual to remain in the position of Scout Master.

Almost as distressing as the imprudence of the Scout Maste

and were called before the board of review. At that time they had told of the above mentioned events to the police and also to two of the committee members. Tom Bradshaw and Cliff Heartly. and were both advised by the board that they would be promoted at the next Court of Honor.

The boy's grand-parents and I took them to the Court of Honor. By this time the police were talking to other boys in the troop and there were many rumors circulating. The boys were told that they were going to get a surprise. The surprise was that neither boy was given his promotion.

It has come to our attention that Roy Gorsky wishes to resume his activities as a Boy Scout Master. My main purpose here is to advise you of his actions in the past. As stated above, we real this would be unconscionable.

In addition, we are interested in having the boys receive the ranks which they have earned. They did lose interest in scouting as a result of these experiences, but we have recently become aware, through Mike Towns, of a new troop in the area and the boys are willing to give scouting another try.





FACTS RELATING TO THE ROY GORSKI SITUATION

- 1. On Thursday, September 8, 1988, Mr. Sisco Dean, a committe member of Troop 436 in Ormond Beach, the District Commissioner for the Halifax District, and the State Commander for the American Legion, came to my office with information relating to Scoutmaster Roy Gorski, Troop 436. Sicso advised me that parents in the Troop had filed formal charges against Mr. Gorski charging him with molesting their two sons who are members of that Troop.
- 2. I prepared the standard letter suspending Mr. Gorski from membership in Scouting as prescribed by the National Council, Boy Scouts of America.
- 3. I advised Council President, Jon Sleik, of this action, since he is the proper party to sign off such letters.
- 4. Jon Sleik and I met with Sisco Dean on the evening of September 8th at the Holiday Inn Surfside in Daytona Beach at which time we discussed the situation in detail and asked that he confirm the charges.
- 5. Mr. Dean called the parents of the two boys in question in the presence of Jon, myself, and Council Program Director, Craig Willis. Parents confirmed that they were most distressed with Mr. Gorski's action and that they had indeed filed charges with the police.
- 6. Jon Sleik, Sisco Dean and I proceeded to Roy Gorski's home at which time we did deliver the letter of suspension (copy attached).
- 7. We accused Mr. Gorski of no wrong doing, nor did we explain to him the reasons for our actions. This is the policy established by the National Council of the Boy Scouts of America.
- 8. Sisco Dean, being a member of the Troop Committee, said he was willing and in fact desired to remain and discuss the situation with Mr. Gorski. As a member of the Troop Committee this was certainly his perogative.
- 9. Since the suspension, Mr. Gorski has not applied to this Council for reinstatement or asked to appeal his dismissal.
