

I have reviewed your note of Hovember 28, and the letter from Attorney James Reich dated Movember 25.

We have had a firm policy that we will not register a person in one position and refuce them registration in an other position. It is felt by our attorneys and our administration that you cannot separate these items, and it would very difficult to monitor and make certain a person was registered only in certain positions with the Boy Scouts of America.

Due to the circumstances at hand, we are, therefore, requesting that Mr. Peterson not be registered with the Boy Scouts. He would not be the role model that we would want for leaders of youth members.

Dear Mr. Terry:

After our telephone conversation prompted by my last letter to you. I had a lengthy talk with Rusty Peterson. I explained to him the attitude you expressed to me and, while he is disappointed and distressed, he asked me to again write to you and make a request on his behalf.

He understands that, other than filing a successful appeal of your decision, he is not going to be allowed to be associated with the Boys Scouts in the same manner he has in the past. However, he is most interested in retaining the privilege of his association with the Order of the Arrow. He has, for sometime, been involved in journalistic publications for that organization and hopes that his suspension or disassociation from the Boys Scouts can be modified to the point where he can continue those activities. It your concern is his contact with young scouts whom he might be able to improperly influence, I suggest that the activities with the Order of the Arrow will not involve such contact since the people he would be associated with are older scouts.

I would appreciate your advising me it this is possible under any circumstances and, it so, what restrictions or conditions you would place on same.

Thank you for your kind cooperation and attention to this matter.



Mr. Reicht stated that Rusty would be informed about all of his options including "capital felony" and opportunities for psychological help.





Dear Mr. Terry:

After your letter of October 8th, 1990, suspending Russell Peterson's registration with the Boys Scouts of America was delivered to him, he contacted me for assistance. I have your letter and the attachment explaining his right for a review of his suspension.

I acknowledge that Russell is not entitled to have an attorney assist him at any review proceeding but he must make a decision on whether or not he wants a review within the sixty (60) days set torth in your attachment and is unsure how to proceed. The biggest problem he is having is the failure of your letter to notify him of the basis for his suspension.

During our conversation, I asked Russell if he inquired as to the reason for the suspension and he replied that he was fold that. "It involved two male children." Russell has asked me to inquiry of you a more particular description of his misconduct and would appreciate your providing same to me.

My client has been involved with the Cub Scouts and Boy Scouts since he was tirst eligible for entry into Cub Scouts as a Bobcat. He has actively participated in scouting activities since that date and, through his diligence and desire to succeed, has attained Eagle Scout status. It occurs to me that this is a young man who, over the years, has demonstrated those qualities most admired and promoted by the Boy Scouts.

If his conduct has strayed from those ideals to the point that his separation from any association with Boy Scouts of America is necessary, he at the very least deserves to be told what it is that he has done that is unacceptable. As you might well imagine to someone who has been involved in scouting to the extent this young man has since childhood, scouting is an important part of his life and he does not want to lose the association.

After careful review, we have decided that your registration with the Boy Scouts of America should be suspended. We are therefore compelled to request that you sever any relations you may have with the Boy Scouts of America. A refund of your registration fee is enclosed.

You should understand that BSA membership registration is a privilege and is not automatically granted to everyone who applies. We reserve the right to suspend registration whenever there is a concern that an individual may not measure up to the high standards of membership the BSA seeks to provide for American youth.

If you wish to have this decision reviewed, please write to me within 60 days of the date of this letter, explaining your version of the facts supporting your claim that your registration as a BSA member should be granted or reinstated. The procedures for review are attached.

Subject: Russell S. Peterson, Scoutmasters Assistant Troop 196 Ocala

Christopher Goode Scoutmaster of Troop 196 had received a call from Howard Leary II, also an Assistant Scoutmaster from Troop 196 in Ocala, regarding Leary's concern with Russell Peterson.

Chris relayed to me that Howard Leary works at the hospital and shared a house with Russell Peterson. Leary indicated that on July 13 he had gone home at an unexpected time. Leary indicated that Peterson "always hangs around with younger guys" and that he had heard vulgar remarks coming from the bedroom upon his unexpected arrival at the house. He indicated that he had seen two young males approximately ten (10) and twelve (12) years of age exit the bedroom nude as a result of the telephone ringing. Following some conversation, Leary confronted Rusty and they had a mutual agreement that things would not be shared with anyone else and that this was his first time and that he was glad he was caught, Leary indicated at that time he would tell no one and he moved out of the house. Leary also had indicated that there were two (2) events on a prior occasion that some parents had some forward and made some remarks about Peterson and that the two (2) youth were pulled out of Scouting.

I made contact with Howard Leary at the Monroe Regional Medical Center and received the following comments from him regarding the incident.

Date of this conversation is October 8, 1990, 7:15 p.m.

Howard Leary indicated that he had been staying at this house with Russell Peterson. That between 4 and 5 p.m. he had gone home unannounced and had noticed bicycles in the driveway. He assumed that they were neighborhood kids as they had been there previously. The house doors were locked, the lights were off, the computer was left on and he heard voices in the hallway. The door to the hallway bedroom was closed. He heard someone say from the bedroom "wow you could rape someone with that" the next comment that he over heard was "who said anything about rape" the next comment "well, sit on it." At that time the telephone rang and Rusty came from the bedroom looking for the telephone and had a swim suit on. Rusty said "stay in the room." Howard said two (2) boys who wre completely nude came running from the room and subsequently got dressed and went on home.

Rusty told Howard "I'm sorry." Rusty had indicated that he had had these feelings before and that they had never gotten out of control, that this was the youngsters idea and that they were playing "truth of dare." Rusty asked, "have I lost a friend or are you going to help me?" He said, "I don't have any morals."

Howard had indicated that his conscience had bothered him considerably in the time that had elapsed since the incident until he spoke with Chris Goode about what had happened.

In that Howard Leary's father, was a Police Officer in Ocala. I suggested that Howard talk with his father about the incident. I subsequently talked with Officer Leary and offered our support in any investigation they felt was necessary.

After contact with District Chairman (Attorney) Bob Appleget I met him in his office at about 5:00 p.m., on Tuesday afternoon October 9. Chris Goode (Scoutmaster) was already present. Bob Appleget insisted on an early conversation with (Rusty's , now known as who is the District's Program Chairman for Scouting. He had invited to come to his law office and she arrived shortly. We indicated that we had a great deal of respect and feelings for her and that we felt there was information regarding Rusty that she should be aware of. I indicated that questions had been raised about her son's activities with younger youth by another adult, and we really had no option but to suspend Rusty as outlined by the Youth Protection Program of the Boy Scouts of America. reaction was as you would expect any mother's reaction to be, she was in disbelief and shock and was surprised that anything like this could possibly occur. Bob Appleget advised her to secure an Attorney and if she wished to encourage Rusty to proceed with the appeal process. Following departure in about ten (10) minutes Rusty Peterson arrived at the office of Bob Appleget. In conversation with Rusty Peterson I advised him that as a result of the activities on September 13 concerns had been expressed regarding his continued participation in Scouting and that we had no choice at this time but to suspend his registration. I read his letter, gave him \$4.20 as registration refund and his information on the appeal process. Although he denied the allegations he was not shocked and did not really have any reaction to the statements that were made.

Bob Appleget, who is an Attorney, indicated to Peterson that he was going to take his "Boy Scout hat" off and put his "Attorney" hat on. He advised Rusty to secure legal counsel and not to make any comments to anyone at all about the allegations.

Rusty S. Peterson has recently had his name changed to Russell S. Welch.

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
