Two leaders from Scott's troop visited with a committee from the Hawk Mountain Council on January 21, 1990.

The leaders informed us that Scott had been making sexual overtures to one of the Scouts in particular. He had been spending a great deal of time individually with the boy, helping with homework, buying him things. Scott was sending letters regularly with sexual references. The committee personally reviewed these letters and weighed them heavily in determining to remove Scott Rickert from Scouting.

To our knowledge, there was no physical contact between Scott Richert and any of the Scouts.

The state was notified as to the incident. No follow-up was required at this time.

Dear Scott:

After careful review of information provided to us, we have decided that your registration with the Boy Scouts of America should be suspended. We are, therefore, compelled to request that you sever any relations you may have with the Boy scouts of America. A refund of your registration fee is enclosed.

You should understand that BSA membership registration is a privilege and is not automatically granted to everyone who applies. We reserve the right to refuse registration whenever there is a concern that an individual may not measure up to the high standards of membership the BSA seeks to provide for American youth.

If you wish to have this decision reviewed, please write to me within sixty (60) days of the date of this letter, explaining your version of the facts supporting your claim that your registration as a BSA member should be granted or reinstated. The procedures for review are attached.

The following information is provided should you desire a review by the Northeast Region, BSA, of the decision to deny your registration.

- 1. Within 60 days, you must request in writing a review of this decision. Your request should be sent to the Regional Director, Northeast Region, BSA. In your request you may include your version of what occurred in support of your claim that your registration should not have been denied.
- 2. Upon the receipt of your written request, a committee will be appointed to review the situation.
- 3. You may attend the review hearing, but it is not adversarial in nature and neither the committee nor you will be represented by legal counsel. If you wish, you may be accompanied by no more than two other individuals if their testimony might assist the committee in discovering the truth and arriving at a correct decision.
- 4. The committee will review the facts as presented, and may interview any persons whose testimony might assist them in arriving at a correct decision.
- 5. You will receive a letter setting forth the decision of the committee.
- 5. If you disagree with the decision of the committee, you may request a review of this decision by the National Council of the Boy Scouts of America.
