SUMMARY OF CONVERSATIONS AND ACTIONS
RELATED TO TROOP 410
AND A FORMER LEADER

On December 6, 1989, [REDACTED] of [REDACTED], of the city, called and asked who was in charge of Scouting. He asked that I return his call.

Before I returned his call he called again and asked to speak to whoever was in charge of units in the city, specifically Westhampton United Methodist Church. He spoke then to Lanny Anderson, Senior District Executive and reported that he had been abused while a Scout in Troop 410, in the late 60's and early 70's. The Troop was chartered to Westhampton until 1983. The abuser was Thomas B. Hampton, Scoutmaster. Mr. [REDACTED] wanted to know if there was some way we could check to see if Hampton was still involved with Scouting. He felt that Hampton had left the state some time ago and should be in his late 50's or 60's by now.

I returned Mr. [REDACTED] call that morning and while he said he had already talked with Mr. Anderson, he seemed eager to talk to me more. He reiterated the same facts (above) to me and added that he worked at Elk Hill Farm, a facility for boys with behavioral problems. He wanted to know what we do to protect Scouts today from abuse. I told him of the education for unit leaders, parents, and youth, especially the video, "A Time To Tell". He asked why we didn't do police background checks on all our leaders and stated that he had to go through one when he worked with Family and Childrens' Services. I explained the new leader selection process and the "Unfit for Leadership" File maintained by the National Council. I also explained that such checks rarely show past abuses because most of them are never reported to the BSA or authorities and that our new application with subsequent background checks by the charter partner catch discrepancies which demand further checks, and in some cases, non-acceptance. He seemed "satisfied" and that point did not surface again. In closing, I suggested that he might like to view the materials we currently use with our adults and youth.

On Friday, December 8, I asked Mr. Anderson to check the historical files for any records. He found an empty file jacket. The Office Manager searched on Monday, 12/11, and found some files for the Pack and on Tuesday found the files for the Troop. My study of the files on 12/13 confirmed that Thomas B. Hampton served as Assistant Scoutmaster from 9/20/67 to 11/14/68, Scoutmaster from 11/14/68 to 1/31/72, and Member of the Troop Committee from 1/31/72 to 1/31/73. They also show that [REDACTED] was a Scout from 12/68 until 2/71 and was a Star Scout at the time he left at charter renewal 2/71.

On Wednesday, 12/13, someone called the Registrar and asked who the Scoutmaster for Troop 410 had been 1965 to 1970. I intercepted the message and held it for a future call-back.

Wednesday, 12/20, I learned of a personal ad that was placed in STYLE Weekly, a weekly newspaper in Richmond, which said that Troop 410 had been led by a pedofile (sic) and that "if you were a victim and want to talk about it please write...." to a certain box at the newspaper. That same day I placed a call to Paul Ernst to inquire if Thomas B. Hampton was registered anywhere in the BSA. He was out but upon his return on 12/21, he called and said that Hampton was not registered and that the Robert E. Lee Council had placed him on the BSA Confidential List in December 1972. Our action was precipitated by a signed statement from another Boy Scout concerning something Hampton had done to the Scout in June of 1972. Apparently Hampton did not appeal the decision and we know nothing more about him.

On Thursday, December 21, I returned the call of 12/13 to our Registrar and found that the caller was the Secretary of Westhampton United Methodist Church who had called by request of the minister. She reported that her initial call was in response to the newspaper ad. I briefed her on what I had found. The letter to [REDACTED] was reviewed by the Council's General Counsel Mike Lowden, and mailed with Blind Copies going to the following:

ADDENDUM TO 12/12/89 STATEMENT

The church, Westhampton United Methodist did not acknowledge receiving the package I sent. The newspaper ads continued for at least one month and then ceased. There was no further contact with [REDACTED] until April 4, 1990.

On April 4 I received a letter from [REDACTED] along with a bill for \$4,150 for counseling he had received on an apparently regular basis since December of 1986.

The letter has been sent, along with this summary and other related correspondence (for background) by UPS Overnight Mail to the Southeast Region Office, attention to Jim Wilson.

Dear Mr. Terry,

Our conversation last December was a significant step in working through Mr. Hampton's abusive conduct. Your interest and understanding helped me move through the fear of reporting this. Before I called, I feared that the scouts would not want to hear my story. If I could have changed one thing, it would have been to report Mr. Hampton to the authorities twenty years ago. His expertise at manipulating left me feeling guilty and shamed, which prevented me from bringing this out. The man that was to lead and challenge me as a boy becoming a young man, turned me into his object of sexual pleasure. When I joined the Boy Scouts of America as a place for growth, my family and I expected a safe environment. My problems occurred in that organization because it was not safe.

Three years later, I was diagnosed as suicidal, and on my fifteenth birthday was placed in a mental institution. Unfortunately, I got no help there. Another institution had failed me. I spent two months behind locked doors and barred windows. The next several years I was expelled from school, charged with theft and running away from home.

My life has turned around in the last few years, though. I began three years ago healing myself through individual and group therapy. I'm beginning to feel alive again. Last year I completed an undergraduate degree in English and this fall I plan to go for a Masters in Counseling. I've been a volunteer for the "Family and Children's Services" since the fall

of 1988 and presently employed at Elk Hill Farm, working with juvenile adolescents.

I have included with this letter bills from Commonwealth Professional Services, totalling \$4,150. CPS was one of many places where my recovery took place. I do not want to gather the bills for every hour in therapy or place a large claim against the scouts, however, I am requesting that the bills here be paid as a form of acknowledgement. If you would like to discuss this in person, I will be happy to meet with you. My address is [REDACTED], Midlothian, VA 23113 and telephone number is [REDACTED].

Thank you for your kind response on the phone and your letter. I am happy that Mr. Hampton was evicted from the Boy Scouts, but sad for those like myself who didn't get the opportunity to process this twenty years ago.

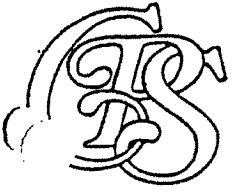

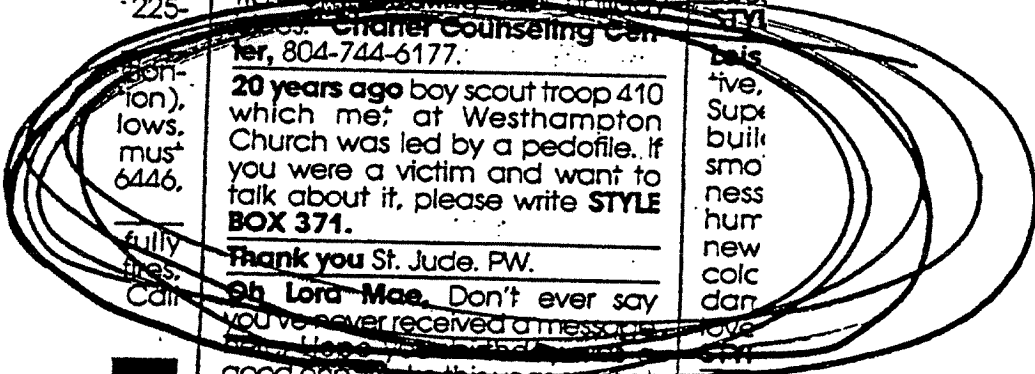


Thomas B. Hampton was placed on the BSA Confidential List in December of 1972 and has not served in any Scouting unit since then. The BSA placed him in our "unfit for leadership" file based on a statement from a Scout concerning an experience he had with Mr. Hampton earlier in the year. Mr. Hampton was immediately suspended by the Robert E. Lee Council and the Council requested that the BSA dismiss him - which they did.

As I mentioned in our conversation, the BSA's attack on child sexual abuse is multi-faceted. It includes the following:

1. Education at all levels, including youth members.
2. Strengthened leader selection to deter abusers.
3. Creating barriers to sexual abuse.
4. Prompt reporting.
5. Swift action and removal.

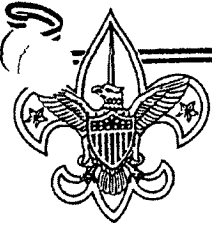




