



Boy Scout counselor charged in incident

A counseior at a local Boy Scout camp was arrested on charges of lewd and taseryious acts after a weekend incident involving a sc out at the camp

Putnam County Sheriff's Department investigators also are looking into allegations of a second incident. They were told Thomas lones III of Hastings revealed himself to a oor on Friday, just two days before he is believed to have improperly touched another voungster at the camp on Baden-Powed Road just after midnight Sugnay

According to a report on the latter incident. Jones laid down on the poy's oed, saving he wanted to listen to music and take a nap. The report and Jones then improperly toursed the roy

grasp and left the room, the report said. He reported the incident to another camp counselor, who noti-Bed the camp director. The camp arector, in turn, contacted author

During interviews with those at the camp, officers discovered that Jones may have revealed minself to another boy earner. He has not neen charged in connection with into incident.

When questioned about the charge, Jones reportedly told in vestigators that he was just "norseplaying" with the youth. He denied that he intentionally touched the voungster's private areas.

Jones was being neld on \$5,004 bond at the county jail.

Monday's incident marked the second time in a little more than a month that an adult cour leader has been charged with sexual abuse of a minor

Jake Gary Hersey, 26 was arrested May 15 and charged with three courts of sexual nattery and one count of lewer and assertions assault upon a could. The incidents involving Hersey were alleged to have occurred on scout outings

Camp officials would not comment on Monday's incident, directing an questions to the Boy Scout neadquarters in Jacksonville.

Steven Moore, director of support services for the North Florida Council of the Boy Scauts of America there, issued a statement denouncing the alleged abuse and saving the Boy Scouts would offer their full cooperation to the State

Attorney's Office.

"The Boy Scouts are extremely aggressive toward youth protection and we will not tolerate or condone anything like this," he said, noting that the organization runs awareness programs aimed at educating children and adults about now to spot lewd behavior

Moore also defended the organization's hiring practices and said that, despite the two recent incidents, there are few acts of apuse.

"If people have a propensity toward children they are going to go, naturally, to groups where children are." Moore said. He added, "We feel it was caught early on before major issues occurred. Had it not been caught early, there might have been real damage.
