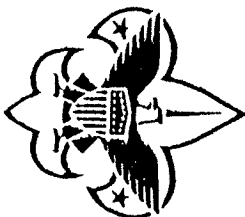

Ex-Scout official gets jail

The second of two former Boy Scout officials charged with sexual abuse charges has been sentenced to prison.

Thomas Jones III received a 14½-year prison term last week. Circuit Judge Robert Perry ordered that Jones serve 4½ years of the sentence in prison and the remaining 10 years on probation. During probation, Jones will not be allowed contact with anyone under the age of 18.

Court records state the maximum sentence Jones could have gotten for the crime was 15 years in prison and a \$10,000 fine.

In November, Jones entered a no contest plea to the charge of lewd and lascivious assault on a child. The plea means Jones neither admits to nor denies the charge. Judge Perry ruled Jones guilty.

Jones, 23, of Hastings, is a former counselor at the Baden-Powell Road Boy Scout Camp. The charge on which Jones was sentenced stemmed from an incident at the camp on June 26. The court file indicates Jones improperly touched a 15-year-old boy.

Jones was the second Scout official linked to improper behavior with Scouts. Last summer Jack Gary Hersey, 26, of Palatka, was arrested on similar charges and later sentenced to prison time by Perry.

Dear Mr. Jones:

This is to inform you that the Department of Health and Rehabilitative Services has determined that you are absolutely disqualified because you failed to initiate the amendment/expunction process for a specific abuse referral dated June 26, 1989.

Your potential disqualification shall now be considered absolute, which in effect, shall disqualify you from your current position or from seeking a sensitive position involving the care of children, developmentally disabled, disabled adults, or aged persons. Your only recourse is to seek an exemption from disqualification, which involves an examination of your character so that the department can make a determination whether there is clear and convincing evidence to support a reasonable belief that you shall not now nor in the future present a danger to the well-being and safety of children or developmentally disabled individuals under your care.

Exemptions will be granted only when the department has clear and convincing evidence to support a reasonable belief that good character exists to justify an exemption. The District Administrator shall convene a review team to consider your request for exemption. The inquiry shall focus upon whether you present a danger to the safety or well-being of children. Among the factors to be considered are:

1. The circumstances surrounding the incident;
2. The time period elapsed since the incident;
3. The nature of the harm to the victim;
4. Your history since the incident;
5. Other information indicating whether you present a danger to the safety or well-being of children.

It is your responsibility to present sufficient evidence of rehabilitation including but not limited to the factors listed above. You have the right to appear before the review team with an advocate of your choice or you may submit all your evidence in writing. The review team will submit its recommendation regarding your request for exemption to the District Administrator for a final decision.

To request such an exemption hearing, you must within 15 days of receipt of this notice of absolute disqualification submit a written request to the local District Screening Coordinator at [REDACTED] Jacksonville, Florida 32231-0083. If you are dissatisfied with the department's decision on your exemption, you have the right to request an administrative hearing under Chapter 120, Florida Statutes.

If the exemption is granted by the District Administrator, you shall be notified accordingly. If the exemption is denied, you will be notified by certified letter. You may appeal the denial of an exemption through the formal hearing procedure under ch. 120 of the "Florida Administrative Procedures Act." Your written request for a ch. 120 hearing must be received no later than thirty (30) days after receipt of the Department's denial of exemption letter at the following address:

Failure to timely request the exemption hearing within fifteen (15) days shall result in your permanent disqualification from employment with children or the developmentally disabled. Effectively immediately, you shall have no direct contact with children or the developmentally disabled in your current position pending the outcome of any appeal you initiate.

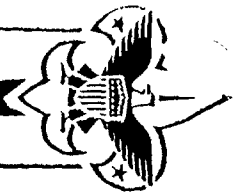

I received a call from Jim Recor, reference a "Child Abuse" report from "C.I.T." [REDACTED], about Thomas Jones III, A cook employed at Camp Shands. I advised Recor to call the Sheriff Department and departed for Shands about 3:00 a.m.

About 4:30 a.m.

I met Putnam County Sheriff Sergeant Rick Ryan on the road into Antelope. Stopped and talked; found that Thomas Jones III was in the car under arrest for lewd and lascivious assault on a person under 16 years of age (a third degree felony).

I went on to Antelope Lodge, met Putnam County Deputy T. L. Beutien who had completed getting written statements from: [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]

Thomas JonesIII.

I secured copies of statements of above people.
Case number assigned is 890-5278.

I reviewed statements and clarified some parts with [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. All of these young people appear to have no ill effects from the experience.

About 8:30

Mr. Wade Priestster, protective investigation from HRS arrived as a result of a call to the Abuse Registry from Sgt. Ryan.

Jim Recor and I updated Mr. Priestster. Mr. Priestster requested to visit with [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. I took Mr. Priestster to the Dining Hall and introduced Mr. Priestster to the two youths.

I had previously called [REDACTED] ([REDACTED] mother) to set an appointment to visit her in Keystone Heights.

I arrived at the [REDACTED] residence about 10:00 a.m. and updated [REDACTED] on the occurrence. She called her husband in Gainesville and [REDACTED] chose to come on home. I waited on [REDACTED] arrival and updated him. [REDACTED] has had a previous relationship and support problem with Troop 109 and the council, related to ethics of Unit Leadership and his concern for quality of program. This issue was reviewed thoroughly and I anticipate no reflection of this concern to the abuse issue. We had a very pleasant and objective discussion. They will support prosecution. Counseling was offered if a need was indicated. I departed the [REDACTED] for Jacksonville about 1:30 p.m.

About 3:30 p.m.

From the office, I telephoned [REDACTED], [REDACTED] (mother) and up dated her. No problems anticipated. I agreed to send her a copy of her sons statement.

Last Friday afternoon me and a few guys were playing jokes on [REDACTED]. Then [REDACTED] asked to see my wallet. I gave it to him and then he asked me what was in my wallet. I told him rubbers. He then asked me if he could hold one. I asked him why. He said [REDACTED] he was going to put it on and act like he was going to try something on [REDACTED]. He got up and walked over to [REDACTED] then told him to get away and to leave him alone. They had a few words and then Tom walked away from him. After a little while we all apologized to [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] then seemed to accept our apologies so we let it drop with that.

When I heard him putting on a rubber and he walked over to my bed he had pulled out his penis and tried to put it on my head, and I blocked it with my pillow after a few minutes I grabbed my arrow and stood up and put the arrow in his chest and told him to backoff or I would put the arrow inside him. After that he told me not to tell the Camp Director or I will have to pack my things and leave and so I told John about it.

(1:30 a.m.) [REDACTED] I, Tom present.
I am laying on my bed and Tom is sitting there on my bed claiming to stay there until he has listened to the radio and took a short nap. Tom then held on to my feet tightly then slowly moving his arms to my crotch while placing my hand near his penis while he was rubbing my privates I pulled away and he did not leave so I decided to wait it out he then tried again and I tell him to stop he then tells me not to tell anyone next he ask me if he could masturbate in my bed. I say fine and I hurry and leave claiming to go to the bathroom. I go down to the Antelope Lodge and sit on the back porch resting deciding what to do. I then see the lights come on in the Beaver Lodge an I hurry to the side of the Antelope Lodge to see if Tom leaves. As soon as Tom left I ran to the Beaver Lodge by the lake front getting inside and stopped to wait on [REDACTED] I then talk to [REDACTED] about what happened and went to lay down about 15 minutes later [REDACTED] woke me up and brought me down to the camp area. At no time did Tom expose himself.

At approximately 01:25 I awoke and went into the kitchen and had a glass or orange juice and smoked a cigarette when Tom, one of the kitchen workers stepped in and stated that he was leaving for a while. I said OK, and he left. At approximately 01:33 [REDACTED] a C. I. T. for the Boy Scouts came in from outside and I said what's up? He ([REDACTED]) stated that he was just walking outside and I said that he could give me a better line that that. He hesitated for awhile and I could see that he was scared. Finally he said that Tom tried to molest [REDACTED] him. I ask him [REDACTED] to explain in his own words what had happened. He [REDACTED] stated that Tom was in his room listening to some music when Tom started to feel his thigh and genital area after pulling Tom's arm off, he (Tom) grabbed his hand and tried to make him masturbate him. He [REDACTED] told me that he [REDACTED] withdrew his hand. He ([REDACTED]) then stated that Tom said asked him if he [REDACTED] didn't mind if he (Tom) masturbated. At this time [REDACTED] got out of bed and said the he was going to the bathroom on his way out of the bedroom he left outside and ran into the woods. After hearing this report, I brought him ([REDACTED]) to the Camp Director to file a formal report.

Then we got up and went to the other room. We was sitting on the other bed I listened to a rap tape. Then I said I'm going to kick over and go to sleep. I layed down and he [redacted] laid down. He put his feet under my chin. I grabbed his feet. I guess I nodded off. Then I woke up and I said "Hell man, If I touched you or anything, I'm sorry". He said oK. Then I got up and left. Later I came back [redacted] said that boy is scared. I said for what. I didn't touch that [redacted] In his statement he told [redacted] touched him. I said well [redacted] get him and I'll apologize to him.
Q. Did any part of your body, touch his body?

A. Probably

Q. What do you think touched him?

A. My hand was already on his feet. His feet were under my hand for a pillow. If I touched him it was accidental.

Q. Did you touch his penis?

A. I don't know if I did it was accidental. I remember pulling the sheet across me.

Q. Were you sleeping in the same bed with [redacted]

A. Yes

Q. There is a question about you putting on a condom, Did You?

A. Yes, there was [redacted] and myself wait, [redacted] wasn't in there. It was a joke we was messing with [redacted] pulled out the condom and I said hand it to me. I put it on and went over to where [redacted] was laying down and walked up behind his head.

Q. Did you touch him at all?

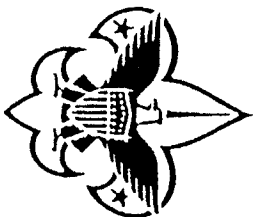

Dear Mr. McCullar:

Thank-you for the opportunity to express my concerns regarding the Scoutmaster of Troop #109 with Arvil Bud, Barney Barco and you at our meeting August 19th at the Parish Hall in Melrose. After all the rhetoric, personal thoughts, opinions and philosophical historic review, I hope you will keep in mind my major areas of concern as you make your recommendations. I feel you value my opinion since you asked what my recommendations would be to clarify the situation.

My recommendations would be:

1. That Mr. Boehnlein be encouraged to deal directly, honestly and straightforwardly with the boys and parents of Troop #109.
2. That the Scoutmaster, when questioned on matters not walk away but that he either discuss the topic at the time or set up a time convenient to both parties to discuss the issue and that he deal with the discussion in an attentive and reasonable manner.
3. That the Scoutmaster set into practice the excellent training principles he has been exposed to.
4. That regular and announced Committee Meetings occur.

These recommendations alone will go far towards promoting and enhancing communications, good relations and will head off problems well before they become angry confrontations.

Also keep in mind I was told I could have my audience with Mr. Boehnlein before I left Mr. Bud's home. Mr. Bud had outlined a meeting with the majority of the adult leaders where he would act as neutral moderator and apply very strict rules of conduct, such as requesting recognition to speak by raising one's hand and allowing only one person to speak at a time. I agreed that this would be a most fair approach and that I would adhere to it...

What actually happened was something quite different. At the August 8th meeting, Mr. Bud had only contacted Barney Barco, ruling out the other relevant adult leaders. When I inquired where the other members were, Mr. Bud stated, "Mr. Taylor was on the In-active list and would not be called". Remember he was the one who also caught the Scoutmaster in a lie about his [redacted] attending Camp Boone and pressed the issue after the Court of Honor you attended at the Parish Hall. My concern at the time was how could anyone be put on "in-active status" for not attending meetings that had been suspended for the summer. I heard the excuse about his job as you did. I think the person to ask if he has any input would be Mr. Taylor. When I asked about Mr. Flynn, you heard as I did, "he now lives in Ocala". That is inaccurate. I think the person to ask if he has any input would be Mr. Flynn. I did not mention at our meeting on August 19th, that Mr. Flynn is the one who told Bob Cooper, First Assistant Scoutmaster, he thought Mr. Boehnlein was running "a dictatorship." When I asked about Mrs. Flynn, you heard as I, "she was never considered to be an Assistant Scoutmaster". She was the one that didn't think the Senior Patrol Leader (at that time the Scoutmaster's son) or any other boy should curse at the boys nor use intimidation as a management and communications style. Then there's me. You have a copy of my letter dated August 10th, stating my position and a copy of Mr. Bud's letter removing me as an Assistant Scoutmaster because I had the courage to speak to him about my [redacted] treatment.

It strikes me as rather deliberate that BEFORE summer camp, when Mr. Boehnlein needed adults to transport scouts and equipment five hundred miles to Camp Daniel Boone, North Carolina, we are considered invaluable to the troop; but, now that a new season is about to begin all four of us have been discredited when the scoutmaster's motives and actions are under question.

Mr. Taylor, Mr. and Mrs. Flynn, and I met on two occasions to discuss our differences with Mr. Boehnlein. As a group we agreed to forego addressing the issues we had until after Boone Summer Camp in order not to disrupt or cause any disharmony in the group of boys we serve.

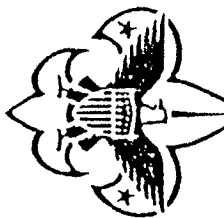
It was our intention to broach the matter upon return, in the proper order and protocol during the summer months so as not to jeopardize the unity and spirit of the boys of Troop #109.

Thank you once again for your time and attention to this matter. I regret we came to such an impasse.

Ex-Scout official gets jail

The second of two former Boy Scout officials charged with sexual abuse charges has been sentenced to prison.

Thomas Jones III received a 14½-year prison term last week. Circuit Judge Robert Perry ordered that Jones serve 4½ years of the sentence in prison and the remaining 10 years on probation. During probation, Jones will not be allowed contact with anyone under the age of 18.

Court records state the maximum sentence Jones could have gotten for the crime was 15 years in prison and a \$10,000 fine.

In November, Jones entered a no contest plea to the charge of lewd and lascivious assault on a child. The plea means Jones neither admits to nor denies the charge. Judge Perry ruled Jones guilty.

Jones, 23, of Hastings, is a former counselor at the Baden-Powell Road Boy Scout Camp. The charge on which Jones was sentenced stemmed from an incident at the camp on June 26. The court file indicates Jones improperly touched a 15-year-old boy. Jones was the second Scout official linked to improper behavior with Scouts. Last

summer Jake Gary Hersey, 26, of Palatka, was arrested on similar charges and later sentenced to prison time by Perry.

Dear Mr. Jones:

This is to inform you that the Department of Health and Rehabilitative Services has determined that you are absolutely disqualified because you failed to initiate the amendment/expunction process for a specific abuse referral dated June 26, 1989.

Your potential disqualification shall now be considered absolute, which in effect, shall disqualify you from your current position or from seeking a sensitive position involving the care of children, developmentally disabled, disabled adults, or aged persons. Your only recourse is to seek an exemption from disqualification, which involves an examination of your character so that the department can make a determination whether there is clear and convincing evidence to support a reasonable belief that you shall not now nor in the future present a danger to the well-being and safety of children or developmentally disabled individuals under your care.

Exemptions will be granted only when the department has clear and convincing evidence to support a reasonable belief that good character exists to justify an exemption. The District Administrator shall convene a review team to consider your request for exemption. The inquiry shall focus upon whether you present a danger to the safety or well-being of children. Among the factors to be considered are:

1. The circumstances surrounding the incident;
2. The time period elapsed since the incident;
3. The nature of the harm to the victim;
4. Your history since the incident;
5. Other information indicating whether you present a danger to the safety or well-being of children.

It is your responsibility to present sufficient evidence of rehabilitation including but not limited to the factors listed above. You have the right to appear before the review team with an advocate of your choice or you may submit all your evidence in writing. The review team will submit its recommendation regarding your request for exemption to the District Administrator for a final decision.

To request such an exemption hearing, you must within 15 days of receipt of this notice of absolute disqualification submit a written request to the local District Screening Coordinator at P.O. Box 2417, Jacksonville, Florida 32231-0083. If you are dissatisfied with the department's decision on your exemption, you have the right to request an administrative hearing under Chapter 120, Florida Statutes.

If the exemption is granted by the District Administrator, you shall be notified accordingly. If the exemption is denied, you will be notified by certified letter. You may appeal the denial of an exemption through the formal hearing procedure under ch. 120 of the "Florida Administrative Procedures Act." Your written request for a ch. 120 hearing must be received no later than thirty (30) days after receipt of the Department's denial of exemption letter at the following address:

Failure to timely request the exemption hearing within fifteen (15) days shall result in your permanent disqualification from employment with children or the developmentally disabled. Effective immediately, you shall have no direct contact with children or the developmentally disabled in your current position pending the outcome of any appeal you initiate.

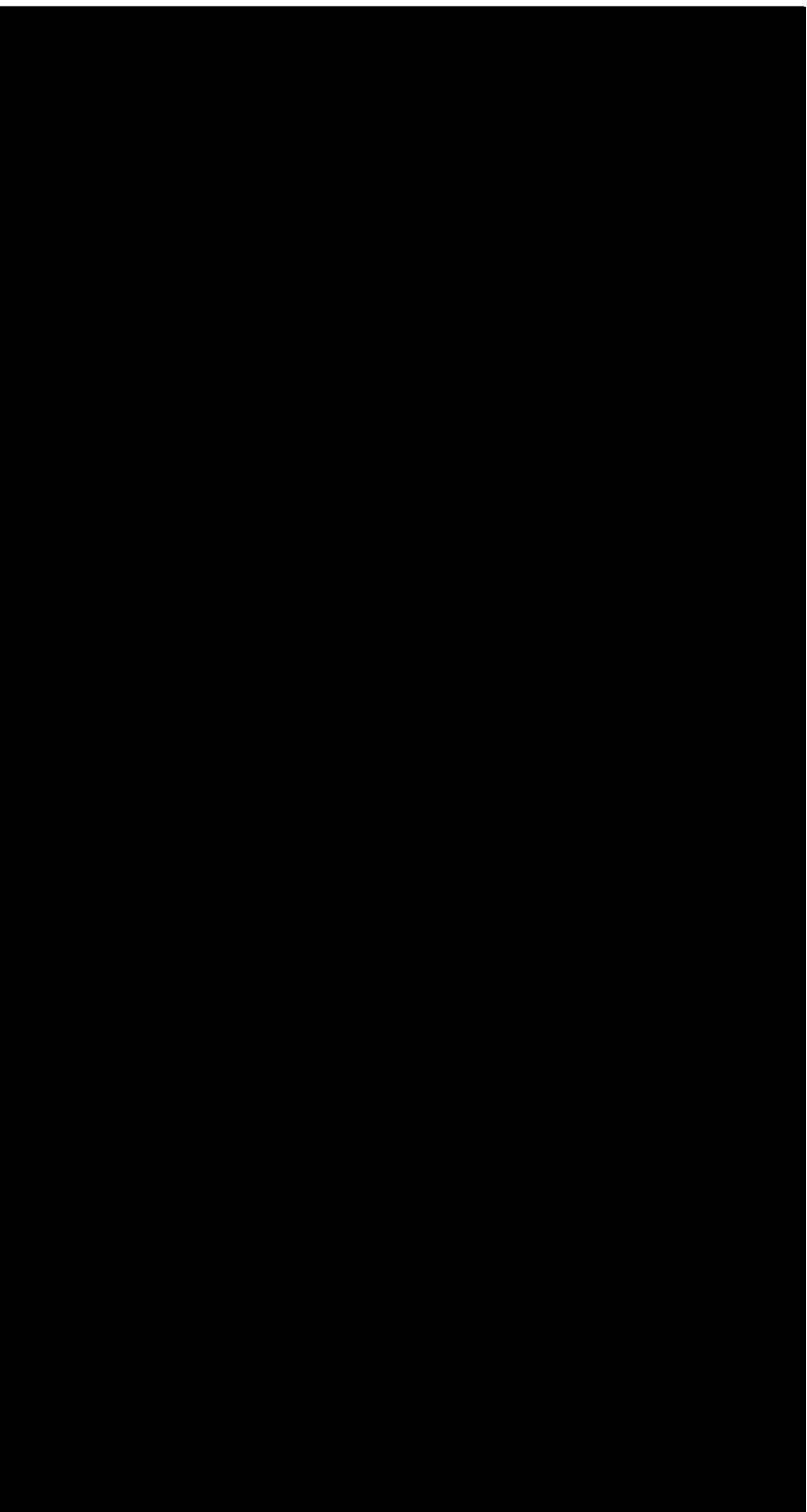

Boy Scout counselor charged in incident

A counselor at a local Boy Scout camp was arrested on charges of lewd and lascivious acts after a weekend incident involving a scout at the camp.

Putnam County Sheriff's Department investigators also are looking into allegations of a second incident. They were told Thomas Jones III of Hastings revealed himself to a boy on Friday, just two days before he is believed to have improperly touched another youngster at the camp on Baten-Powell Road just after midnight Sunday.

According to a report on the latter incident, Jones laid down on the boy's bed, saying he wanted to listen to music and take a nap. The report said Jones then improperly touched the boy.

The youth broke free of Jones'

grasp and left the room, the report said. He reported the incident to another camp counselor, who notified the camp director. The camp director, in turn, contacted authorities.

During interviews with those at the camp, officers discovered that Jones may have revealed himself to another boy earlier. He has not been charged in connection with this incident.

When questioned about the charge, Jones reportedly told investigators that he was just "horseplaying" with the youth. He denied that he intentionally touched the youngster's private areas.

Jones was being held on \$5,000 bond at the county jail.

Monday's incident marked the second time in a little more than a

month that an adult scout leader has been charged with sexual abuse of a minor.

Like Gary Hersey, 26, was arrested May 15 and charged with three counts of sexual battery and one count of lewd and lascivious assault upon a child. The incidents involving Hersey were alleged to have occurred on scout outings.

Camp officials would not comment on Monday's incident, directing all questions to the Boy Scout headquarters in Jacksonville.

Steven Moore, director of support services for the North Florida Council of the Boy Scouts of America there, issued a statement denouncing the alleged abuse and saying the Boy Scouts would offer their full cooperation to the State

Attorney's Office.

"The Boy Scouts are extremely aggressive toward youth protection and we will not tolerate or condone anything like this," he said, noting that the organization runs awareness programs aimed at educating children and adults about how to spot lewd behavior.

Moore also defended the organization's hiring practices and said that, despite the two recent incidents, there are few acts of abuse.

"If people have a propensity toward children they are going to go, naturally, to groups where children are," Moore said. He added, "We feel it was caught early on before major issues occurred. Had it not been caught early, there might have been real damage."

Dear Mr. Bud:

After my meeting with you and Mr. Barco, and for awhile including Father Yerkes, there have been few things that have disappointed me more.

At your acknowledgment of my rights to express my concerns and differences I have with our scoutmaster, I submitted a list of relevant questions requested by you.

I had previously explained to you the inequitable way the scoutmaster appoints positions that "in the book" calls for these positions to be determined by the electoral process carried out by the boys. It does state "in the book" that a NEW scoutmaster may appoint any and all positions ONCE. I think this is a good policy and have no problem with accepting it as a part of the guidelines. As I pointed out to you, I think two and one half years is long enough and that he should now adhere to the guideline's recommendations for democratic process.

I further explained to you how on many occasions I have had difficulty understanding why one man has TOTAL control as to how the guidelines are to be interpreted or even IF the guidelines are to be followed at all. I cannot understand why the democratic process has been suppressed and replaced with "Anything-I-Say-Goes-Because-I-Am-the-Scoutmaster" as a matter of practice.

I tried to explain my feelings to you and tried to convince you to start holding regular and publicized Troop Committee Meetings so we could get on with being what Scouting is all about. I pointed out to you that the group of boys we call Scouts are in a prime setting to learn first hand what democracy is all about and ALL the official BSA literature I have read bears this out and the training I have been required to take indicates that this is expected of us as adult leaders. There are numerous books written by the BSA "to be used as guidelines"; and because it is worded that way does not give us the latitude to disregard them nor to apply ONLY what ONE man wants enforced if the "guidelines" are to be applied at all.

You acknowledged and I concurred that this was the first time except for an incident involving the High Springs canoe trip, I have ever said anything to you about any difficulty I have had with Mr. Boehnlein and that he has not spoken to you about any difficulties with me. I further explained to you that I was not addressing these issues with you on my own behalf, but on behalf of the boys.

At your encouragement, I then confided in you about a situation that happened between Mr. Boehnlein and me that ultimately had an effect on one of the scouts in our troop, my son, [REDACTED]. I informed you that Mr. Boehnlein wanted the scout to pay for some tools that had been loaned to him which he had failed to return.

On a Saturday, a day planned to give the boys their physicals for Boone summer camp, our scoutmaster asked [REDACTED] for the tools he had provided him to teach a class with at the last meeting. While the scout was out of the room to get the tools, the scoutmaster turned to me and explained that he really had the tools and intended to tell the boy he had lost them and was responsible for replacing the tool value of \$12.50 and requested me to keep quiet about his plan. When I questioned him as to why it wouldn't be more appropriate to deal with the forgetfulness and not resort to deceiving the boy into thinking that he had been responsible for either the loss or theft of somebody else's property, he stated he "wanted to teach him a lesson". He also informed me that he not only wanted the \$12.50 for the tools but wanted to tell the scout how he was to work to pay off the debt. Our conversation ended soon after that as we were attending other things.

I also informed you that between the time of my conversation Saturday with Mr. Boehnlein and the following Monday night, Court of Honor, [REDACTED] my son, was relieved of his position as Senior Patrol Leader and the scoutmaster had not had the decency to call him on the phone to inform him that he had been replaced much less offer an explanation as to why he had been removed.

I concluded by telling you that the evening of Court of Honor I approached Mr. Boehnlein and attempted to address his decision to punish [REDACTED] for something he hadn't "really done". He informed me that he had spoken to [REDACTED] about his plans to make him pay for the tools and that [REDACTED] had responded that "if this has anything to do with the tools, you need to talk to my father about the matter". He then asked me "why did you tell him. Only you and I knew." I took great exception to the entire incident, especially after I expressed my concern that the whole thing was deceptive and dishonest. Mr. Boehnlein got up on left after I told him I could not support his lying to any of the boys.

I also shared with you an incident where both my son and I had been lied to by one of the assistant scout masters and supported in the lie by the scoutmaster by his actions. My son wanted to take an Eagle required merit badge class at Shands summer camp. We were told by the assistant scoutmaster that that particular merit badge class was not being offered. When I showed them that it WAS listed as being offered, they insisted "they knew for a fact that it was NOT". However, at the end of summer camp, it turned that the particular class had INDEED been offered and the scoutmaster's son, as a product of his participation in that class at camp, had earned that badge.

You are aware I presented other issues in our discussion at your home. You made notes of our meeting and referred to them at our meeting with Mr. Barco and Father Yerkes on August 8th at the Parish Hall.

Mr. Bud, as I told you August 4th at your home and August 8th at the Parish Hall -- I tell you again. I, as a parent, have some things to say and some questions to ask of our scoutmaster, and I will not be satisfied with anything less than an audience with him and the other assistant scoutmasters and whomever else you deem important to attend the meeting. I do believe and contend that I have such a right.

While I was not totally surprised at your decision rendered at the August 8th meeting, what impresses me most is the way you interpret the responsibility of your position as Committee Chairman of Troop #109, Melrose.

After our lengthy discussion, when I first called and came to your house at your invitation to voice my concerns, you carefully explained to me that while you must remain neutral you also agreed I did have a right as a parent to have an audience with Mr. Boehnlein.

If you insist upon forcing me to leave the unit because I have the courage and responsibility to speak out for the basic concepts of truth and fair play in dealing with all the boys of our troop, I DO NOT RECOGNIZE YOUR AUTHORITY TO DO SO and will seek that you show me somewhere in official black and white Boy Scouts of America guideline manuals where it invests such excessive proprietarian authority to do so. Then, and only then, should I feel obliged to honor such authority. If you do find documentation that supports your authority, I expect it to be applied equally throughout the membership of the troop.

Dear Mr. McCullar:

Thank you for the opportunity to express my concerns regarding the Scoutmaster of Troop #109 with Arvil Bud, Barney Barco and you at our meeting August 19th at the Parish Hall in Melrose. After all the rhetoric, personal thoughts, opinions and philosophical historic review, I hope you will keep in mind my major areas of concern as you make your recommendations. I feel you value my opinion since you asked what my recommendations would be to clarify the situation.

My recommendations would be:

1. That Mr. Boehnlein be encouraged to deal directly, honestly and straightforwardly with the boys and parents of Troop #109.
2. That the Scoutmaster, when questioned on matters not walk away but that he either discuss the topic at the time or set up a time convenient to both parties to discuss the issue and that he deal with the discussion in an attentive and reasonable manner.
3. That the Scoutmaster set into practice the excellent training principles he has been exposed to.
4. That regular and announced Committee Meetings occur.

These recommendations alone will go far towards promoting and enhancing communications, good relations and will head off problems well before they become angry confrontations.

Also keep in mind I was told I could have my audience with Mr. Boehnlein before I left Mr. Bud's home. Mr. Bud had outlined a meeting with the majority of the adult leaders where he would act as neutral, moderator and apply very strict rules of conduct, such as requesting recognition to speak by raising one's hand and allowing only one person to speak at a time. I agreed that this would be a most fair approach and that I would adhere to it...

What acutally happened was something quite different. At the August 8th meeting, Mr. Bud had only contacted Barney Barco, ruling out the other relevant adult leaders. When I inquired where the other members were, Mr. Bud stated, "Mr. Taylor was on the in-active list and would not be called". Remember he was the one who also caught the Scoutmaster in a lie about his son's attending Camp Boone and pressed the issue after the Court of Honor you attended at the Parish Hall. My concern at the time was how could anyone be put on "in-active status" for not attending meetings that had been suspended for the summer. I heard the excuse about his job as you did. I think the person to ask if he has any input would be Mr. Taylor. When I asked about Mr. Flynn, you heard as I did, "he now lives in Ocala". That is inaccurate. I think the person to ask if he has any input would be Mr. Flynn. I did not mention at our meeting on August 19th, that Mr. Flynn is the one who told Bob Cooper, First Assistant Scoutmaster, he thought Mr. Boehnlein was running "a dictatorship." When I asked about Mrs. Flynn, you heard as I, "she was never considered to be an Assistant Scoutmaster". She was the one that didn't think the Senior Patrol Leader (at that time the Scoutmaster's son) or any other boy should curse at the boys nor use intimidation as a management and communications style. Then there's me. You have a copy of my letter dated August 10th, stating my position and a copy of Mr. Bud's letter removing me as an Assistant Scoutmaster because I had the courage to speak to him about my son's treatment.

It strikes me as rather deliberate that BEFORE summer camp, when Mr. Boehnlein needed adults to transport scouts and equipment five hundred miles to Camp Daniel Boone, North Carolina, we are considered invaluable to the troop; but, now that a new season is about to begin all four of us have been discredited when the scoutmaster's motives and actions are under question.

Mr. Taylor, Mr. and Mrs. Flynn, and I met on two occasions to discuss our differences with Mr. Boehnlein. As a group we agreed to forego addressing the issues we had until after Boone Summer Camp in order not to disrupt or cause any disharmony in the group of boys we serve.

It was our intention to broach the matter upon return, in the proper order and protocol during the summer months so as not to jeopardize the unity and spirit of the boys of Troop #109.

Thank you once again for your time and attention to this matter. I regret we came to such an impasse.
