

## Grand Jury Returns Indictment Against Suffern Scoutmaster

A Suffern scoutmaster was indictedly visiterday by the Rockland County Grand Jury on Manges of second degree sodomy of two Suffern youngstres.

The crime was allegedly committed by Charles Hughes, 43, of It Washington Ave., Suffern, on April 10 in the Village. Bughes, also a school bus driver in the Suffern area, was arrested May 19 on a complaint by the children's parents.

Hughes, now in custody in was sentenced at the time the county jail in New City, is months in the county jail.

Also indicted yesterday was Roman Rodriquez, 31, of 14 S. Main St., Spring Valley, on charges of unlawful possession of a loaded Scaliber revolver. He was arrested April 2 following a brawl in a Spring Valley tavern.

RODRIQUEZ was convicted one year ago yesterday on a charge of unlawful entry into a Spring Valley luncheonete. He was sentenced at the time to six months in the county jail

In the third indictment handed up to Judge Henion, Kenneth Heller, 20, Nyack, was charged with third degree burglary of the Eureka Barber Shop, Suffern on May 11.

Heller's alleged accomplice, John Morgan Hicks, also of Nyack, was indicted on the same charge May 19.

The pair allegedly broke into the barber shop located on Orange Ave., Suffern opposite the Suffern police station.

Heller was arrested May 27 and is in the county jail. Hicks is being held there also.



In consideration of the several written recommendations of his character, previously sent you from leading distizens of Suffern and officers and members of the American Legion spensoring the post, we are agreeable to his being listed on probation for a period of two years, with periodic six months check-ups thru this office.

Paramount in this decision to continue his commissioning as a registered Scouter are two major factors. Firstly, that the apparently is a most unreliable and financially irresponsible character and thus his charges against lose some value. Secondly, since six of the sponsoring legionnaires have sons currently registered in Troop #123 and know of Charles Hughes' record, of eight years ago, and are willing to have him serve as Scoutmaster we feel he will be under most rigid scrutiny and observation at all times.

In any camping excursions at our camp or in camporees, our staff likewise can observe him more rigidly than would otherwise be the case. One final confirmation for the record, should be concluded. Mr. Hughes has offered to mindergo psychiatric treatment at any time and place and at his own expense, if the case so warrants.

Thanks for the fine cooperation, Howard, in this naturally difficult personnel situation. We will all be happy, if he can prove himself worthy of the continued responsibilities of a Scouter over this next two years.

As you recall from my two previous phone calls, the of this man, who has dropped his first name of "Tyrone", on moving to Suffern 7 or 8 years ago, of Highland Falls, New York phoned our office last Wednesday to inform us that said Tyrone Charles Highes, while in a retail business in Walden, New York was convinted and sentenced and served 11 months and 29 days in the Goshen, New York jail. The charge was "Impairing the Morals of

We have, as a new District Training Chairman, Mr. Adam Krainak who happens to be Chief of Police of Spring Valley, New York. Following the three fruitless calls to National, Hudson-Delivare Council and Kingston Council, we asked Chief Krainak to verify this, which he very quickly did, by phone with Goshen, and came to our office to report said verification to his District Scout Executive, Joe Milutinovic, who had received the original call.

Feeling we had a routine, yet dangerous Scouter, I made two calls. First, to John H. Hunter, Jr., who was on our records as Commander of the sponsoring American Legion Post, who was very shocked yet cooperative and got the Troop Committee together that same night. Later called me back from that meeting, asking whether something could be done and would I talk with Hughes. Also informed me that in November they had just elected his successor Arden B. Walling as Commander of Post #859 and that he was going to register as Institutional Representative himself.

I called Hughes and of course told him the news, which he made no attempt to deny, only pleading to see me personally. Friday A. M. he came to my home, and spent three hours and was there when I phoned you the second time. His story is that he caught a boy stealing from his store in Walden and in an argument slapped him around and threw him out. This boy threatened to get even with him and got another chum to testify with him that he had abused them in his store on some previous date. Your directions that he should submit substantive evidence that he was incarcerated innocently he of course cannot do. Says he was

a Methodist, so I called in to my home Rev. Edwin Muller, a Methodist Minasters greatly skilled in prison work, famely counselling, sociology etc. Under his questioning Charles, though crying most of the time, stuck to his story and begged on his knees for a chance to show he was leading a good life, had paid off all his lawyers fees etc., even though he almost went bankrupt and fost his fiancee also. He is still not married. Was willing to pay for a psychiatric examination also.

Since that time, my home life has been beseiged with phone calls and letters. Charles says he personally went to every Committeeman and has taid them all the details. Also says the Suffern Police Chief was called by his brother also and still writes the letter among those enclosed.

When I received the one from the V. P. of Rockhard National Bank I felt it was high time to bother my President with this was for two reasons. Jim Collishaw is President of that bank and also lives in Sufferent At lunch with him yesterday, we reviewed the entire matter and letters and we tagether feel our National Office can do us a real service by issuming a premise ruling in this case. Only one man in the Troop Committee, Richard B. Weyer has been hostile and downright nasty to me on my home phone. Says Fill have to produce the papers to support my charges and will not accept the Spring Valley Chief's word for it either. I told him to go to Goshen himself will and show me Hughes was not convicted.

The Legion otherwise, though desperately garting to retain this man, and several of them have sons in the troop, have individually said that "if nothing can be done after I have submitted all the recommendations to the top", then they will appoint a new Scoutmaster by name of McKee, presently serving as one of two A. S. M.'s. Their fear and Hughes also, is that his being forced out as S. M. even secretly will make him lose his school bus job and jeopardize his meagre antique and used furniture retail business also.

With no attempt to sit as a Judge, I do want to make one personal observation with which Paster that her congress. He does not seem to be emotionally stable. Called me one of many times to tell me he just couldn't work, he was in back of sterry, cryingsetc. etc.

I also feel sure that the Legion and Hughes have kept the conviction record from the Rabbi, the bank V. P., the High School Principal and Mayor Rice, whom Jim and I know very closely. We do not believe they would write any letter if they know of the case.

With our Annual Council meeting due December 15th, the time spent on this to date and the time you have to take to read all this is not justified and I don't want to hurt say man if he was guilty and has reformed or otherwise. Your experience with these cases and types must be greatly magnified and thus more experienced than mine (I've had enough, too!)

If you prefer to call me instead of write, do so. I can get on an upstairs extension if we need talk further about it. Otherwise give us a quick danision and we'll cooperate to the fullest.
