Dear Paul,

On February 23, 1989 we presented Mr. Wayne Graybill with a Silver Beaver, recognizing his 27 years of service to Scouting and the community. Shortly after that, I received an anonymous phone call from a man stating that he had seen Mr. Graybill's picture in the paper, along with other recipients and was appalled that we would give an award to a person who had sexually abused his son some 21 years ago. He would not identify himself, nor give me anything to go on. I have a serious problem with anonymous callers making accusations. I however did check on Mr. Graybill and learned that he has suffered a heart attack and is in very poor health and will not be able to return to any type of activity. Those who know him do not expect him to live much longer.

On April 13th, I received a call from a [redacted] of Salt Lake City who had seen the pictures of our Silver Beaver recipients in the paper some time ago and wanted to let me know that her son had been sexually abused as a 4th grader in Mr. Graybill's class some 21 years ago. I have checked with the [redacted] School District superintendent, Dr. Loren Burton, and have learned that Mr. Graybill terminated his employment with the school district on February 6, 1972 and gained employment as a salesclerk in a local bookstore. I have also checked with his church leaders who tell me that there was some rumors of misconduct in the early 70's but never any proof nor were any charges filed.

My recommendation at this time is to place Mr. Graybill on the confidential files with the understanding from the district leaders and his church leaders that should he regain his health, he would not be involved in any youth programs. They fill this very unlikely knowing the poor condition of his health at this time.

I am also enclosing a copy of Mr. Graybill's Silver Beaver nomination form which may give you more insight into this person.

Respecting the request not to discuss this application with the nominee has made it difficult to do justice to this great man and scouter.

Many scouters in the area were contacted; without exception they testify to his greatness as a scouter and devotion to the Scouting Program. One parent commented when asked about Wayne that his boys that were scouts under Wayne are Eagle Scouts, the others were not. His motto was "Every boy an Eagle." When Wayne was scoutmaster he had large troops, 20 to 30 boys most of the time. Scouts and scoutmasters remember him in our Stake Courts of Honor later as District Advancement Chairman exhorting us to greater accomplishment and exemplifying the highest ideals of scouting.

Following are some of the things he has done or is doing on an on-going basis to improve scouting wherever he is:

1. Very high on everyone in scout uniform. He will organize a neighborhood uniform pool, call old scouters and even buy the boy a uniform if need be.
2. Always willing to teach, train and be helpful in any way. Many times he has held merit badge classes for all who were interested.
3. Always interestd in the boy and accomplishing the purposes of the scouting program. If he notices a troop having problems he will volunteer to help them.
4. Always trying to improve the program. He often goes to other areas to get ideas.
5. He is a sterling character, adding honor and dignity to any group.
