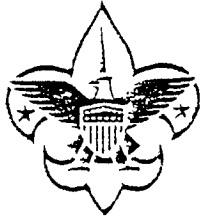


Dear Mr. Ernst,

poor academic performance and a history of substance abuse by either themselves or their parents. Students must also be eligible for food stamps from families on welfare.

"The results of the program so far have looked pretty good," Coffey said. "It seems to be having a good effect on the dropout rates, at least in the pilot program."

Sue Scott, who will coordinate the program in the Negaunee schools, is identifying eligible students.

"We're allowed 15 kids," Scott

said. "Once I identify them, I'll begin intensive counseling, working with the family situation and setting up job sites.

"I'm looking at the public sector right now to get it going. I can go to the private sector, but under the program the business owners have to pay the wages. Grant money can only be used if the student works in the public sector or for a not-for-profit agency."

She hopes business owners hire the students so the business persons can have the satisfaction of contributing to keeping a potential dropout in school.

But the students themselves are expected to benefit the most.

"It not only will help keep the kids in school, but help them to do better in school by seeing what the possibilities are for a well-trained high school graduate," Scott said.

Prison terms given two girls' attacker

MARQUETTE — The Ishpeming man who plead guilty to sexually assaulting a 13-year-old Negaunee girl and choking an 11-year-old Ishpeming girl started serving a prison sentence Friday.

Wilfred J. Ayotte, 35, formerly of 210 W. Johnson St., was sentenced to a minimum of seven years and a maximum of 15 years for second degree criminal sexual assault.

In addition, Ayotte received sentence of 6 years 8 months to 10 years for assault with the intent to do great bodily harm less than murder.

The sentences, imposed by Marquette County Circuit Judge Raymond Jason, are to be served concurrently.

In custody since his arrest in Ishpeming on June 17 — the day of the incidents — Ayotte was given credit for 231 days already served.

Both assaults took place on a logging road in Tilden Township in the early morning hours. After consuming alcohol at a relative's camp, Ayotte drove the two girls to the logging road where he made sexual contact with the older girl

and choked the younger girl.

The younger girl told police that Ayotte sent her for help after choking her; Ayotte sexually assaulted the older while she was unconscious from being choked.

Ayotte later said, because of the substantial amount of alcohol he drank that night, he couldn't remember what happened.

Friday's sentences were made possible through a complicated plea bargain that saw three other pending criminal sexual conduct charges against Ayotte dismissed by the Marquette County prosecutor's office in exchange for the guilty pleas.

Ayotte had been charged with two counts of second-degree criminal sexual conduct relating to alleged incidents in July and November 1988.

A third first-degree criminal sexual conduct charge relating to an alleged July 1988 incident involving the same 11-year old girl Ayotte was convicted of choking, was also dismissed.

Judge Jason said, following the hearing, he wasn't sure what the minimum amount of time that Ayotte would have to serve before parole could be granted.

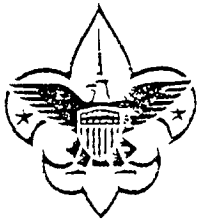

Suspect free on bond arraigned on assault, sex conduct charges

MARQUETTE — The Ishpeming man charged with sexually assaulting two girls Saturday was free at the time on a personal recognizance bond stemming from an earlier criminal sexual conduct charge involving one of the same girls.

Wilfred J. Ayotte, 35, of 210 John St., was jailed Monday after he was arraigned on the four charges — murder and two counts of second-degree criminal sexual conduct.

Ayotte was jailed because he was unable to pay bond, set by District Judge James Collins at \$50,000 cash on each of the two assault charges and \$10,000 cash on each of two CSC charges.

Ayotte is charged with assaulting and intending to kill two young girls — an 11-year-old from Ishpeming and a 13-year-old from Negaunee — during the early morning hours Saturday.

Marquette County Undersheriff Mike Quayle Monday declined to give details of the assault, but confirmed that the preliminary investigation showed that a weapon was probably not involved.

Count one of the criminal sexual conduct charges accuses Ayotte of sexual contact with a girl under the age of 13. Count two charges that he engaged in sexual contact with an injured victim he knew was helpless.

Collins scheduled a preliminary hearing of the charges for June 30. Marquette defense attorney Thomas Caseiman was appointed by the court as Ayotte's attorney.

Ayotte was arrested in Marquette at about 7 a.m. Saturday, after the two girls told police that Ayotte allegedly engaged in sexual contact with them, and allegedly attempted to kill them while parked on a secluded road in Filden Township several hours before.

Asked by Collins if he understood the charges Monday, Ayotte, who is married and the father of four children, answered, "Yes sir, I do."

Marquette County Chief Assistant Prosecutor Peter Plummer asked that Collins set "a substantial cash bond" because Ayotte had allegedly violated the conditions of a personal recognizance bond set earlier by Circuit Court Judge Raymond Jason.

Jason had freed Ayotte on a \$1,000 personal recognizance bond after he was charged with one count of criminal sexual conduct, first degree — engaging in sexual penetration with a female under the age of 13 years — relating to an incident in July, 1988. As a part of the condition of the personal recognizance bond, Ayotte agreed to have no contact with his victim.

One of the juvenile females Ayotte is accused of sexually assaulting Saturday was the same girl he is accused of assaulting in July 1988 in Ishpeming.

In a third separate case, Ayotte is accused of two counts of criminal sexual conduct, second degree — engaging in sexual contact with a female under the age of 13 years — relating to incidents in Ishpeming in July 1988 and November 1988. He was freed — again by Jason — on \$200 cash bonds on those charges.

A scheduling conference, according to a spokesperson with Judge Jason's office, was set for July 10 for both of the previous cases.

According to Collins, convictions on each count of assault with the intent to commit murder carries a maximum penalty of life in prison or any term of years. Convictions on the second-degree CSC charges carry a maximum 15 years in prison.
