Smithville man sentenced

BURNET - A jury convicted a Smithville man for sexual assault of his step-daughter and sentenced him to 15 years in prison after a district court trial here last week.

Clyde W. Formby, 35, was found guilty on the first degree felony after an 8-year-old girl testified to being a victim of his sexual advances. The girl said Formby was living in a Granite Shoals home with her mother, sister and brother when the advances occurred.

In statements to Burnet County sheriff's department investigators, Formby claimed the girl initiated the sexual contacts.

Formby had requested probation if his sentence was for less than 10 years. District Judge Clayton Evans gave him credit for 195 days jail time already served in accepting the 15-year sentence.

cewood was given eight years prison time to be served concurrently with an eight-year sentence ordered by a Llano County jury for similar charges last year.

Investigators said the mother of a 10-year-old boy filed a complaint in March, 1988. The boy worked for Artusy at his Lakeside Beach home after school. Several youths stayed overnight at the home, investigators said.

Artusy was a Boy Scout leader in Kingsland before an indecency complaint was filed by the mother of a 12-year-old boy. This complaint resulted in Artusy's first conviction. Artusy is a former substitute teacher for the Burnet school district.

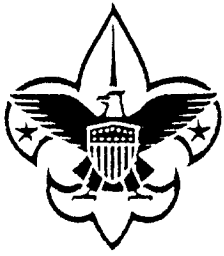

Judge sentences

Sunrise Beach man

A Sunrise Beach man, convicted of sexual indecency with a child by a Llano County jury Thursday, June 30 was sentenced Friday, July 8 by Judge D.V. Hammond to eight years in the Texas Department of Corrections.

William Henry Artusy, 61, who did not want to be sentenced by a jury, immediately indicated the sentence would be appealed. It was reported that Artusy's attorney, Eddie Shell of Burnet, arranged for him to be free on bond pending the appeal.

The alleged incident occurred in October of 1987 and involved a 12-year-old Kingsland boy. Artusy did not testify on his own behalf.

According to court records Artusy is facing a similar charge in Burnet County.



Man jailed again for indecency

BURNET — A 61-year-old former scout leader and substitute teacher was arrested near Spicewood Tuesday on charges of indecency with a child.

Willard Artusy was being held Wednesday morning at the Burnet County jail on a \$25,000 bond. Artusy had been released on bond after being arrested on a similar indecency charge in Llano County last October.

Bob Beierle, of the Burnet sheriff's department, said the investi-

gation of Artusy began Sunday after a complaint was filed by the mother of a 10-year-old boy.

Beierle said the boy was working for Artusy after school and had gone on fishing trips with him. Beierle said the alleged victim and other youths stayed overnight at

Artusy's Lakeside Beach home. Artusy was arrested last October for indecency with a child by the Llano County sheriff's department. The complaint was filed by the mother of a 12-year-old Kingsland area boy.

Artusy had been a leader of a World Boy Scout troop in Kingsland and lived at Sunrise Beach at the time of the arrest. Bond for the charge was \$50,000.

George Wright, Burnet school superintendent, said Artusy is a former substitute teacher for the district.

Beierle said reports are still being compiled in the recent incident, which will be presented to a Burnet County grand jury.

Free legal services are available

BELTON — Starting March 7, the Legal Aid Society of Central Texas began offering free legal services in civil and administrative matters to low income people in Burnet and Llano counties through the Belton office.

The Legal Aid Society of Central Texas previously served Burnet and Llano counties through its main office in Austin, but responsibility shifted this month to the Belton office.

Persons needing legal assistance should call the Belton office's toll-free telephone number 1-800-792-3036. A staff member will determine eligibility for the free legal services and obtain detailed information concerning the legal problem.

Belton staff members plan to work closely with senior citizens centers and the Family Violence Center to address the unique needs of the elderly and protection of families from domestic violence.

Emphasis also will be given to administrative cases, including Food Stamps-AFDC, Social Security-SSI, unemployment compensation, and housing. The Legal Aid Society of Central Texas provides representation in civil law areas, including family, consumer, education, landlord-tenant, and public entitlements. No criminal cases are handled.

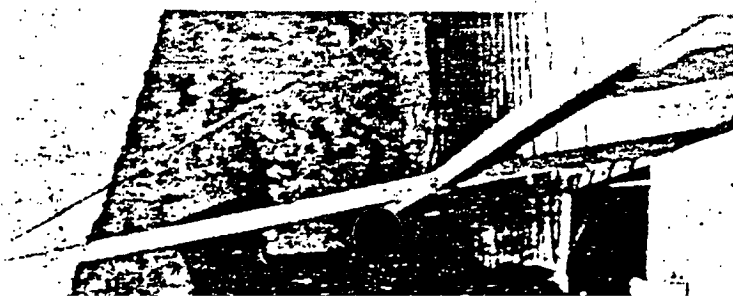

County hopeful seeks joint planning

County commission candidate Alex Young asked Travis County commissioners Tuesday to start a study leading to a joint planning commission with Austin.

Young, a Republican, also asked commissioners to talk to their appointees to the tax appraisal district about requesting a study of the expected impact of AustinPlan on the tax base.

Young, running against incumbent Precinct 3 Commissioner Pam Reed, a Democrat, appeared during the citizens communications portion of the commissioners' work session. There was no reaction or response to his requests.

Young proposed earlier in the campaign that the Austin City Council and commissioners sign an intergovernmental agreement establishing a planning commission that would include representation for non-city residents.

A joint commission would "finally give representation to Travis County voters in planning in the ETJ (extraterritorial jurisdiction)," Young said. He said he

made his request to the City Council last week.

The AustinPlan is a city-charter mandated, long-range plan for transportation, public services and land use. Young said its potential impact on the tax base should be gauged before the plan is implemented.

"Many people feel that the north and northwest tax base will be reduced 20 to 25 percent on all raw

land in those areas," Young said.

Richard Petree, chief appraiser at the Travis Central Appraisal District, said later Tuesday that although he has not studied AustinPlan fully, it would decrease land values by requiring more land for development projects. In some cases, a landowner would need two or three times more land than is now needed in order to comply with restrictions in AustinPlan, he said.

Man facing 2nd indecency case

BURNET — A Burnet County man was charged Tuesday with indecency with a child, four months after he was indicted on a similar charge in Llano County.

Willard Henry Artusy, 61, of the Lakeside Beach subdivision was being held in the Burnet County Jail on \$25,000 bond Tuesday on the second-degree felony charge, Burnet County sheriff's investigator Bob Beierle said. Artusy is accused of sexually abusing a 10-year-old boy in mid-February.

Artusy was indicted in Llano County in November on charges of indecency with a 12-year-old boy in October.

District Attorney Sam Oatman said he will ask that Artusy's bond be raised because he is accused of committing the Burnet County offense while he was free on bond on the Llano County charge.

"We're really going to pursue this since he committed the offense while he was out on bond for the same thing," Oatman said. "We're going to try to get his trial going and get this guy off the streets."


Dear Mr. Artusy:

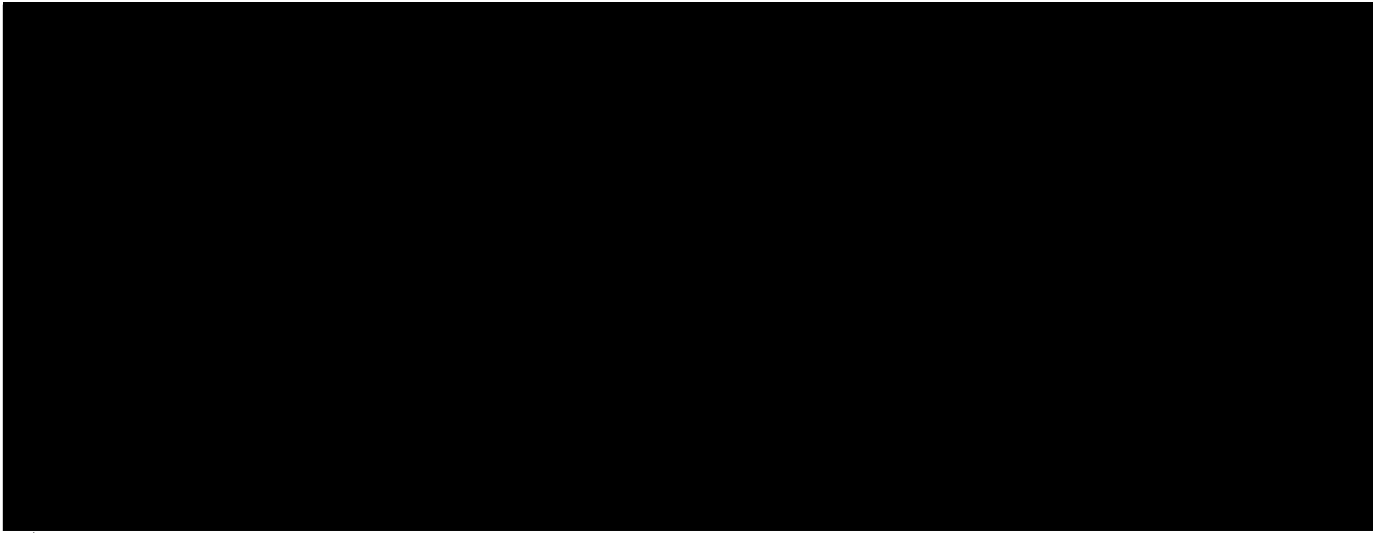

THE FACTS:

Ray A. Smith, Scout Executive, Capitol Area Council, Austin, called this morning (10:15 a.m.) to report that one W. H. Artusy, of [REDACTED] Sunrise Beach, Texas 78643, had been arrested in Llano, Texas over the weekend on child sexual abuse charges involving 3 boys ages 9 and 10.

Artusy, who also maintains an Austin address, is currently registered as a district committee member. He reportedly is a retired BSA professional, married, and in his early 60's.

ACTION OR RECOMMENDATIONS:
