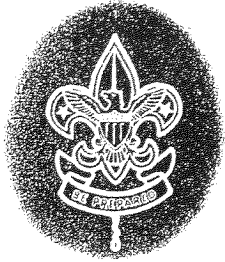

This is a statement stating an unjust action which was committed to me which happen on the afternoon of August 14, 1961

It all started when I first hired here at Beaumont. Mr. Stewart was showing signs of affection to the members of the staff, and I didn't take it to mind, since he was doing it in public. But later he was demonstrating these same emotions to me in public as well as private.

An example of this when I was being driven home from relaps I had out at camp, and Mr. Stewart had his hand holding mine & sometimes it found its way down near my private. Later when I had returned to camp, I found him most friendly, and at the time I thought he was showing me a closer sign of affection of his likeness for in a good "fellowship" spirit.

Then Monday evening about 10:30, I had decided to leave Abe's party and head back to camp since I was pretty tired from the weekend. As I was going Mr. Stewart also decided to leave with me and a few other fellows followed along. As we were walking along, his hand came near mine, and he decided to hold it as we walked to my cabin. He then said he would be back after "Jish" and I had talked to him for a while, because Mr. Stewart then had a bed check round to make.

He later came back (Mr. Stewart) that is, and we started to talk on the subject about us boys. I had complete faith and confidence in Mr. Stewart, line of reasoning, and again his relationship to me was again very close. He left about 1:30 that Tuesday morning, and I spent the following in great wonderment of the man, Mr. Stewart.

My wonderment became a ugly reality the next day though, after my unfortunate experience had happened. It seems the next morning I was quite sleeping from spending most of the night from being awake. So I asked Mr. Stewart if I could spend the afternoon sleeping. He consented to my request, and later in the day I also asked him if I could use his bed, or either Mr. Stewart suggested to me to use his bed. Well anyway I thought it was mosquito free & I wouldn't be

This is a continued statement stating an unjust action which was committed to me which happened on the afternoon of August 14, 1961 not disturbed.

Then as I sleep there for a while, Mr. Stewart came and woke me by rubbing his hand on my back. I was in a very easy position to do this since it was warm for me, and I only had my underpance on.

Anyway, I was starting to do most of the talking on the most interesting to me which was about myself, and he (Mr. Stewart) was getting extremely friendly. Examples of this friendliness was hugging & pecking at me in a most comfortable position; laying next to me on the bed.

This might have carried on for several hours, and later developed into Mr. Stewart playing with my pance, and private, and also loosening his pance to have me play with his by placing my hand there.

Finally over a period of time he was kissing me and masturbating me until it was finally over, and done with. Mr. Stewart had made love to me like a man would do to his wife, and asked me if I hated him for what he had done, and I told him that I did not.

Also last night at bed check, he was again playing with my private, and that is when I told my close friends of this incident.

SWIPPER HAS ASKED ME TO ANSWER YOUR LETTER OF AUGUST 29. WE ARE VERY SORRY TO HEAR OF BILL STEWART'S DIFFICULTIES.

WE HAVE COMPLETED THE CONFIDENTIAL RECORD SHEET FROM THE PROFESSIONAL FOLDER SO YOU WILL NOT HAVE TO DO THIS NOW.

WE WOULD LIKE TO HAVE THE LETTER YOU MENTION FROM THE 17 YEAR OLD CAMP STAFF MEMBER. WE BELIEVE THAT THERE SHOULD BE ONE CONFIDENTIAL FILE AND THAT IS IN THE HOME OFFICE. WE PLACE ALL THESE MATERIALS UNDER LOCK AND KEY AND SHARE THEM WITH NO ONE. SINCE PERSONNEL CHANGES FROM TIME TO TIME IN A LOCAL OFFICE WE BELIEVE IT BEST THAT SUCH LETTERS NOT BE FILED THERE; IT COULD FALL INTO THE WRONG HANDS SOMETIME.

I CAN ASSURE YOU THAT UNDER THE OPERATION OF THE FILE YOUR 17 YEAR OLD CAMP STAFF MEMBER WILL NEVER BE EMBARRASSED NOR WILL THE FACT EVER BE RELEASED THAT HE MADE SUCH A STATEMENT. IN FACT, AS YOU KNOW WE WILL NEVER TELL NO ONE WHY WE WILL NOT REGISTER MR. STEWART. WE SIMPLY SAY THAT THE NATIONAL COUNCIL REFUSES TO REGISTER HIM.

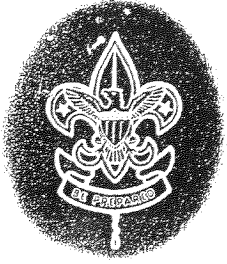

I am very sorry to report to you that the employment of William K. Steuart, along with his position as Advisor to Post 108, has been terminated as of August 16, 1961.


