

Scout leader faces up to 76 years

Edwards pleads
guilty to attempted
child molestation

A Prescott Valley Boy Scout
leader is facing up to 76 years in
prison for attempted child
molestation.

William Reese Edwards, 29, en-
tered a plea agreement with the Ya-
vapai County Attorney's Office
Thursday in five counts of at-
tempted child molesting and one
count of indecent exposure.

He was indicted by the Yavapai
County Grand Jury Jan. 26 on
eight counts of sexual intercourse
with minors and two counts of child

molestation.
The initial charges involve sexual
acts with four juveniles on various
occasions between January to
June 11, 1987.

Edwards, a Prescott fireman,
has been held in the county jail
without bond because the county at-
torney's office alleged he had
threatened one of the victims.

Edwards allegedly told a co-
worker that if he got out of jail, he
would "take out the kid and my-
self" or that he might "hire some-
one to make it look like an
accident."

One of the victims told authorities
that Edwards had said that "if he
told, he (Edwards) would physi-
cally beat him up and spread it ar-
ound he is a faggot."

The case has caused quite a stir in
Prescott Valley where Edwards

lives.

Many civic leaders have come
forward to testify to Edwards' good
character and how Edwards has
been heavily involved in various
civic activities in the community.


The Edwards supporters are ex-
pected to appear on his behalf at a
mitigation hearing before Yavapai
County Judge Richard Anderson
July 7-8.

At the mitigation hearing, the
judge listens to testimony from de-
fense and prosecution witnesses
and sentencing is set for July 11.

County Attorney Charles
"Chick" Hastings said the normal
course for a mitigation hearing is
for the defense to try and make the
case look "not as bad as it seems"
and the prosecution tries to make
the case "worse than it appears."

Chino man guilty of child molestation

A Chino Valley man is facing up
to 30 years in prison for molesting
children.

Ernest Vineyard, age 48, is sche-
duled for sentencing Monday be-
fore Yavapai County Judge Sult,
who could give Vineyard up to 30
years in prison and/or probation for
life.

Vineyard pleaded guilty to two
counts of attempted child molesting
after being faced with a possible 200
years in prison for six counts of
child molestation and rape.

The Yavapai County Attorney's
office portrayed Vineyard as a
career criminal who poses a threat
to society.

Prescott fireman arrested for child molestation

Accused faces 4 counts of child molestation involving 2 juveniles

PRESCOTT VALLEY — A Prescott Valley man was arraigned Wednesday afternoon in the Mayer Justice Court on four counts of child molestation involving two juveniles under 15 years of age.

William Reese Edwards, 28, a member of the Prescott Fire Department, was arrested by detectives from the Prescott Valley Police Department on charges of sexual conduct with a minor and child molestation.

"This investigation is on-going and at this time appears to involve multiple victims over at least a three-year period," Prescott Valley Police Chief Ed Seder.

Judge Dan Leonard, magistrate of the Mayer Justice District, set Edwards bail at \$137,000, and said, "I am setting a high bond because it is easier to reduce the bond later than to increase it if additional charges are made." Leonard indicated that he thought additional charges against Edwards would be made by the Prescott Valley Police.

In a written statement, the police department said, "Due to the suspect's affiliation with the Boy Scouts, the locations of the incidents have been in several counties in the state."

Prescott Valley Police Detective Dennis Baile said Maricopa, Coconino and Pinal counties have been identified as locations of the alleged sexual abuses. At least two more counties are listed as possible sites.

Edwards has been a fireman with the Prescott Fire Department since February 1984. According to Fire Chief Ron Prince, Edwards has "actually got quite a good employment record; he has always received a good evaluation record."

Prince said Edwards would be placed on indefinite administrative leave pending the outcome of the court proceedings.

According to the report, Edwards had "even more access to his victims, whose ages ranged from 10-14 years, because until late 1987 he and his wife were foster parents for Child Protective Services."

Baile said, "We are expecting more information about additional counts (of sexual abuse) to develop."

"I will meet with the county attorney today, and we will probably add charges for a third victim and additional charges for the first two victims before the grand jury meets," Baile said.

Baile also said he will be talking

to local Boy Scout leaders later today.

One source, a police officer, who wished to remain anonymous, said the number of victims could be in the two-digit range, with over a hundred counts of child molestation.

Lt. Roger Larm said one victim has been molested repeatedly over a two- or three-year period.

Baile said he could not comment on the number of possible victims or the number of counts of molestation at this point in the investigation.

A preliminary hearing has been set for Jan. 29 to determine if Edwards should be detained for trial in superior court. If a grand jury meets prior to that date and votes to indict Edwards on any or all of the charges brought against him, then the preliminary hearing will be dismissed.
