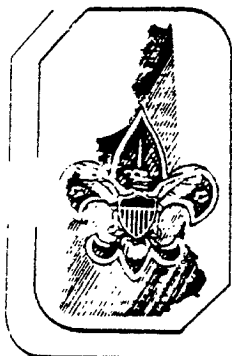

Molester Sentenced to 15-40 Years

Judge Said Former School Janitor Deserved Life Imprisonment

EXETER (AP) — A Rockingham County Superior Court judge sentenced a former elementary school janitor and two-time sex offender from Concord to 15 to 40 years in prison for molesting four boys.

But William Sheehan Jr. served a longer prison term than what was called for in the plea bargain, according to Judge Bruce Mohl.

"These crimes were horrible crimes and perhaps as vicious crimes as any this court has seen," Mohl told Sheehan Friday. "It would be my inclination, Mr. Sheehan, that you never be released from prison."

Mohl said he imposed the sentence agreed upon by the prosecution and defense. He forbade Sheehan from having any contact with children — even relatives — upon release.

Prosecutors said Sheehan molested the boys from August 1987 when he started work at Central Elementary School in Concord until January 1989. They said Sheehan molested the boys, aged 9 to 12, when he invited them over to slumber parties at his apartment.

Assistant Merrimack County Attorney Ronald Bessette said he recommended the sentencing to make certain that Sheehan

went to prison and to spare the boys from testifying.

"We're never assured we're going to win a trial," Bessette said. "It's a real victory to obtain this type of sentence in these kinds of cases."

Prosecutors initially charged Sheehan with molesting six boys but dropped some charges as part of the plea agreement.

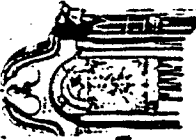
Sheehan agreed to the sentence because he faced life in

prison if convicted on any one charge, since he had been convicted of sexually assaulting children twice in other states. In 1983, he was convicted of molesting a 10-year-old boy in Vermont and a 13-year-old boy in Massachusetts.

Sheehan said he has apologized to the boys' families in letters. The parents asked Mohl to forbid Sheehan from contacting the families again.

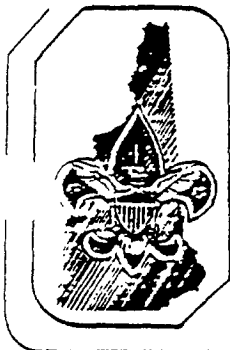

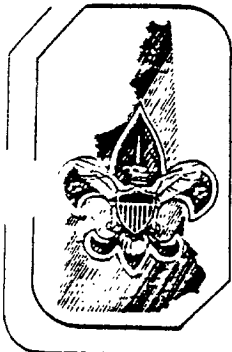

Concord Man Indicted For Assaulting Boys

A Merrimack County grand jury has charged William Sheehan with touching six young boys in a sexual manner and for skipping town.

The grand jury indicted Sheehan Friday on 14 counts of felonious sexual assault and one count of bail jumping. Each charge carries a sentence of 3½ to 7 years in prison.

The police have talked to 17 young boys since they began investigating Sheehan in mid-January, said Sgt. Ralph Lewis of the Concord police. Some of the boys told the police that Sheehan had not touched them in a sexual manner.

The police do not expect any more indictments based on those interviews, but will be talking to about seven more boys. "It's a long, slow process," Lewis said.

Sheehan, 33, lived in an apartment at 96 Fisherville Road for more than a year, until a judge ordered him to move in January. He worked as a custodian at the Central Elementary School in Penacook from August 1987 until April 1988. He left to take a job as an emergency medical technician at Tri-State Medical Services.

The police arrested Sheehan on Jan. 20 and charged him with one count of felonious sexual assault. He was released on bail.

The police arrested him again a week later, when they learned he was talking of leaving town, and charged him with two more counts of felonious sexual assault. But he was released on bail again.

Sheehan disappeared two days later, the morning of Jan. 29. The indictment for bail jumping says he failed to appear in Concord District Court when ordered to do so on Feb. 1.

Most of the indictments for sexual assault charge that Sheehan touched the boys through their clothing. Two say that Sheehan touched a boy's genitals and one says he had a boy touch his genitals.

According to the indictments, most of the attacks took place at Sheehan's apartment after June 1. But some of the attacks took place at the school while Sheehan was working there, and some took place at another home, the indictments say.

Sheehan has been indicted for touching a 12-year-old boy five times

from August 1987 and April 1988. One time, he touched the boy's genitals at the Central Elementary School, the indictments say. Another time, he touched the boy through his clothing at the school. "Three" times, he touched the boy through his clothing at a home in Penacook.

Sheehan also has been indicted for

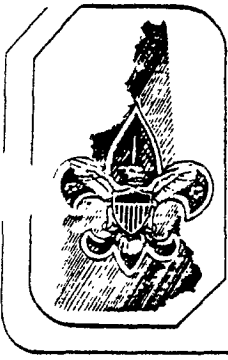
touching a 10 year old boy four times at his apartment since June. One time, he placed his genitals in the boy's hand, the indictments say. Another time, he touched the boy's genitals. Twice, he touched the boy through his clothing.

Sheehan also touched four other boys through their clothing at his apartment since June, the indictments say. He touched three of the

boys once and one of the boys twice. Those boys range in age from 10 to 13.

The police issued a nationwide alert for Sheehan, but no one has reported seeing him since he checked in at the police station the morning of Jan. 29, as ordered by a judge.

"We have no idea where he is," Lewis said.

Bail Revoked, Warrants Issued On Suspect in 4 Sexual Assaults

CONCORD — Bail set for a 34-year-old Concord man charged with four counts of felonious sexual assault involving three boys under 13 years old was revoked yesterday by district court Judge Thomas Bamberger.

Bamberger revoked bail and issued bench warrants on William Sheehan, who lived in an apartment complex on 96 Fisherville Road.

Sheehan failed to report daily to the New Hampshire Probation Department as ordered by the court when he was arrested for a second time Jan. 27.

Sheehan was first arrested on Jan. 19 and charged with a sexual assault which allegedly occurred in an apartment at the Fisherville Road complex.

He posted \$300 bail and was released, but was arrested again Jan. 27 and charged with three more felonious sexual assaults involving young males under 13 who lived at the 96 Fisherville Road complex, police said.

Yesterday Judge Bamberger heard a petition by Assistant Merrimack County Attorney Susan Alfin to revoke the bail he posted.

Sheehan, who held jobs in the area as a school custodian and an emergency medical technician, was ordered by the court to move away from the apartment complex — which he did.

But Sheehan failed to appear at yesterday's hearing and warrants for his arrest were issued.

Court officials said he hasn't been seen since his second arrest.

According to Alfin's petition, Sheehan enticed young male residents by buying them presents and furnishing them treats.

Alfin's petition said Sheehan was a custodian at the Merrimack Valley Middle School.

Police said Sheehan told them that he worked also as an EMT with Tri-State Medical Services.

Police are investigating numerous other assaults that may be linked to Sheehan, investigating officer Sgt. Ralph Lewis said.

Police Issue Alert For Assault Suspect

The Concord police have issued a nationwide alert for William Sheehan, the man charged with sexually assaulting two young boys in Penacook.

The police now believe Sheehan assaulted at least 20 other young boys in his apartment at 96 Fisherville Road. No one has reported seeing Sheehan since he checked in at the police station early Sunday morning, as Judge Thomas Bamberger had ordered, said Sgt. Ralph Lewis of the Concord police.

Sheehan told a friend he planned to get on a bus in Boston after he was paid last Friday and ride as far west as his money would take him. But his yellow Mercury Bobcat is missing, so he may be driving instead, Lewis said.

Sheehan has been charged with four counts of felonious sexual assault involving two boys. More charges are pending. He was free on bail, but Bamberger had ordered

him to check in with a probation officer daily.

The police discovered Sheehan is absent Tuesday. A judge issued a warrant for his arrest Wednesday. The police sent special alerts to places they think Sheehan might have gone, such as his family's home in Brockton, Lewis said.

Sheehan is white, about 5 feet, 8 inches tall and heavy-set, according to the police alert. He has brown hair and brown eyes. He had a heavy beard and mustache, but he may have shaved them off to make it harder for the police to recognize him, Lewis said.

The general alert is entered in a national computer network. If any police officer in the country stops Sheehan and if Sheehan gives his name or social security number, the alert will warn the officer that the Concord police have a warrant to arrest him, Lewis said. If any police officer happens to arrest Sheehan and checks his fingerprints, that also will trigger the alert.

"There's no telling when or where he's going to turn up," Lewis said.

Assaults On Boys Alleged

The police arrested a 34-year-old man Friday and charged him with sexually assaulting a young Penacook boy. He is already facing a similar charge involving another boy, and the police suspect he may have assaulted more than a dozen others.

In all, William Sheehan may have sexually assaulted more than 16 young boys in the apartment where he lived at 96 Fisherville Road, said Sgt. Ralph Lewis of the Concord police.

Sheehan, who has moved to 58 S. Main St., was arrested Friday at around 3:30 p.m. at the Exxon station on South Main Street. He was charged with three counts of felonious sexual assault, all involving one boy, and was released on personal recognizance bail.

Sheehan was charged with another count of felonious sexual assault, involving another boy, a week earlier, Lewis said.

Sheehan told the police he works as an emergency medical technician at Tri-State Medical Services. He lived at the apartment in Penacook for about a year and a half, Lewis said.

He befriended young boys between the ages of 9 and 12 during that time and took them to places like Funspot and Bear Right, Lewis said.

The father of a 12-year-old boy became suspicious of Sheehan two weeks ago and asked his son if Sheehan had touched him in a sexual manner, Lewis said. When the boy said yes, the father called the police.

When the police questioned the boy, he gave them the name of another boy. Interviews with other children have led the police to more young boys they suspect were assaulted by Sheehan. The police plan to file charges in those cases, Lewis said.

The police are looking for other boys who knew Sheehan, Lewis said. If parents suspect that Sheehan has been alone with their sons, they should not try to question the children, but should call the police, he said.

An effort to reach Sheehan this morning was not successful.

Friendship Betrayed

Mother Discusses Alleged Assaults

The police showed Anne a picture of William Sheehan a few weeks ago. He looked sinister, his dark eyes glowering from a face half-hidden by a shaggy hair and a heavy beard.

But for the last year and a half, Anne has known Sheehan as a man who was always smiling. He befriended her, and in his easy way, he grew so intimate with her family that her two sons often spent the weekend with him.

Now Sheehan, 33, has been charged with four counts of felonious sexual assault, one of them involving Anne's 10-year-old son. The police believe Sheehan assaulted at least 20 other boys at his apartment in Penacook, including Anne's 12-year-old son.

Most of the alleged assaults involved touching the boys in a sexual manner.

Sheehan moved to Penacook about a year and a half ago. He lived in an apartment at 96 Fisherville Road and worked as the night custodian at the Central Elementary School. In April, he quit his job at the school to work as an emergency medical technician at Tri-State Medical Services.

Anne agreed to talk about her family's experience with Sheehan on the condition that her real name be withheld.

She met Sheehan two summers ago, soon after he moved to Penacook, because he came often to the office where she worked. They would chat. "He seemed fine," she said. "An average guy."

Sheehan told Anne he was divorced and had not seen his children for a while. He talked about them a lot, she said. He seemed to miss them very much.

So she was not surprised when he showed an interest in her sons. He met them when they stopped by the office one day. Soon he was their pal.

Sheehan always seemed to have a bunch of boys around him then, Anne said. He would hang out at playgrounds, talking with parents and wrestling with their sons. He would take the boys to places like Funspot and Bear Right.

He began tutoring Anne's older son in reading. They would go to the library in the evening to pick

out books and go back to Anne's house or his apartment to read them. He dropped by the house often. "We even came to dinner a few times. "We considered him a friend," Anne said.

Early last summer, Anne and her husband were injured in a crash. They spent several days in the hospital and then several months recuperating at home. Sheehan stepped in. He took care of the boys until Anne and her husband were home, and he entertained them regularly for the rest of the summer. "On weekends, she said, he would invite one or the other to slumber parties at his apartment or take them on trips to Manchester or Laconia or Boston. Sometimes other boys would come, but as time went by, Sheehan tended to invite one boy at a time.

It seemed like a godsend, Anne said. How nice that someone would volunteer to do things with the boys, so they didn't have to spend their summer vacation sitting around the house just because their parents were laid up, she thought.

Sometimes her husband wondered why Sheehan was so interested in the boys, she said, but if he suspected something was wrong, he laughed at himself and pushed the thought from his mind.

The boys seemed to like Sheehan, she said. Now and then her older son would say, "I don't feel like going over to study tonight," but Anne thought he was trying to get out of reading, not trying to avoid Sheehan.

One day this fall, Anne's younger son and another boy came to her. They told her they didn't like the games Sheehan played, especially one called "Gotcha," where he would

chase the boys and grab them by the upper thigh. They told her they didn't want to go to his house anymore and they didn't want her older son to go back either.

Anne knew Sheehan paid more attention to her older son than to his brother. She asked her younger son if he was saying those things because he was jealous. She told him, "What you're telling me can hurt somebody if it's not true."

"The boy began crying, she said. "He said, 'I lied. I'm sorry.' " And when she asked her older son about Sheehan, he denied that anything was wrong. So Sheehan continued to tutor the older boy during the week and to invite both boys on excursions and to slumber parties on weekends.

About three weeks ago, the father of the other boy who had come to Anne became suspicious. He asked his son if Sheehan had touched him. When his son said yes, he called the police. Then he went to tell Anne.

She found his story hard to believe. But she sat with him as his son and her younger boy told a police officer how Sheehan had assaulted them. "They were touched, and they were shown things and given things," she said.

The police have asked her to refrain from giving more details and refuse to give more themselves.

Her older son was sleeping at Sheehan's apartment that night. But the police needed time to investigate the charges. To avoid tipping off Sheehan, she had to let her son stay.

Early the next morning, she called and told her son to come home. She told him they were going away for the rest of the weekend. But she couldn't get out of the house as early as she wanted. Sheehan started calling, she said, "wanting her younger son to

spend the night.

Anne was supposed to go to the hospital for surgery Monday, to help correct lingering problems from the crash. She had to cancel. "Bill was supposed to be the one to watch my kids when I was in the hospital," she said.

Instead, on Monday afternoon, she picked her older son up after school and took him to the police station. On the way, she told him the police had found out what Sheehan had done. "He just said, 'I don't know what you mean,' " she said.

At the station, the boy refused to talk to the investigators. He denied that Sheehan had done anything wrong. He was afraid, because Sheehan had told him that he would be the one in trouble with the police if anyone found out, Anne said.

Anne called her husband for a ride home and took her son down to the lobby. While they were waiting, she told him she loved him. She told him she knew that he was hurting, and that the only way she could make the hurt stop was for him to tell her what had happened.

Her son broke down, she said. "He told me that what they asked was all true." But though he went back upstairs and talked to the investigators, the police still believe he is holding back some things, she said.

For the rest of the week, Anne had to pretend around Sheehan. "I had to act like nothing was going on and nothing was wrong, and keep my kids away at the same time." She had a close call one day: Sheehan learned that her older son was alone in the house and was coming down to see him, but the boy ran out of the house before Sheehan arrived.

That Friday, Jan. 20, the police arrested Sheehan and charged him

with one count of felonious sexual assault involving Anne's 10-year-old son. In Concord District Court, Judge Arthur Robbins released Sheehan on bail, but ordered him to move from his apartment and to have no contact with anyone under the age of 16.

A week later, the police hauled Sheehan back into court, this time to charge him with three counts of felonious sexual assault involving another boy.

Judge Thomas Bamberger released him on bail again, this time ordering him to check in daily with a probation officer.

Two days after that, Sheehan skipped town. The police have issued a nationwide alert for him. Anne is furious, both that the state's bail law makes it difficult for district court judges to hold people without bail and that Bamberger didn't find a way to hold Sheehan anyway. "If they would have held him the second time, he would still be here and not be a threat to other kids," she said.

Now that her sons have spoken about their experiences, they are showing their anger. They fight often at home. "Since all this happened, we have had a very disruptive house," she said.

Her sons have begun seeing a psychiatrist. He asked the boys how they felt about Sheehan. The older one said he would like to beat the crap out of him, Anne said. The younger one said if he had a gun, he'd shoot him.

Her children will be less trusting now, she said. In a way, she is glad. But she also is worried. To get through life, you have to be willing to trust people, she said. "How do you bring kids up to be suspicious of people who seem to be friends?"

Suspect In Assaults May Have Fled

The police believe a man suspected of sexually assaulting at least 19 young Penacook boys has left town, violating the terms of his bail.

William Sheehan, 33, did not report to a probation officer yesterday and did not show up for work, said Sgt. Ralph Lewis of the Concord police.

Sheehan has been charged with four counts of felonious sexual assault. He was ordered to report to a probation officer daily as a condition of his release on bail.

A hearing was scheduled late this morning in Concord District Court to determine whether to revoke his bail. If a judge revoked the bail, a court would issue a warrant for his arrest and the police would issue a nationwide alert.

The charges against Sheehan assert that he touched two boys in a sexual manner and had one of the boys touch him. Based on interviews with those boys and others, the police

believe Sheehan assaulted at least 17 other boys at his apartment in Penacook, Lewis said. Most of the boys were between 9 and 12 years old.

Sheehan lived at 96 Fisherville Road for about a year and a half, until a judge ordered him to move a week ago, Lewis said. He was working as an emergency medical technician at Tri-State Medical Services when he was arrested, but for eight months before that he worked as a custodian at the Central Elementary School in Penacook.

He began working as the night custodian at the school, now called the Washington Street School, in August 1987. The school housed third, fourth, fifth and sixth-grade classes.

Though Sheehan began work at the end of the school day, he still had a chance to meet children, said Kent Hemingway, who was the principal when. Some children stayed at an after-school program until 5 p.m. and others returned some evenings for activities such as basketball games.

Sheehan worked with another custodian, and the head custodian and Hemingway checked on them now and then, Hemingway said. Hemingway does not think Sheehan assaulted children in the school.

Sheehan left the school in early April to take the job at Tri-State Medical Services.

The police talked to Hemingway after they began investigating Sheehan two weeks ago, Lewis said. Since then, the school has acted to help the investigation, Hemingway said. He would not elaborate.

The school also is offering counseling to students who the police say

were assaulted by Sheehan, Hemingway said.

Sheehan probably met children at the school, but he also met them in many other places, Lewis said. "He was a guy who showed a lot of interest in kids and everybody who knew him thought he was a really nice guy," he said. "He just met kids throughout the area and befriended them."

Sheehan took the boys to places like Funspot and Bear Right, Lewis said.

The police began investigating Sheehan when the father of one boy reported that Sheehan had touched his son. Since then, the police have talked to six young boys, Lewis said. Four of those boys said Sheehan assaulted them.

The police have gathered enough evidence to press more charges against Sheehan, Lewis said. The police will give the evidence to the county attorney's office, which will decide whether to present the evidence to a grand jury.

The police expect still more charges to follow, Lewis said. "We're still at the beginning."
