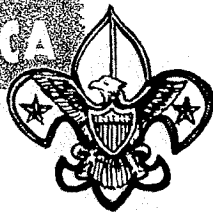




Dear Jack:

I have been advised that Wyman C. Blankenship, Assistant Scoutmaster of Troop 335 Palmdale has been arraigned on charges of molesting boys. The arrest came after an investigation by the Los Angeles County Sheriff Department. He pled guilty and was released on parole with the condition that he no longer involve himself with any youth program. He was also active in the Little League Baseball program. He was released after being registered under Penal Code 290 as a sex offender.

The registration department of the council has been alerted to pull his plate and remove him from the troop records. The sponsor, Palmdale Ward of the L. D. S. church is aware of the situation.

Would you please initiate a letter to the National Council putting him on the confidential file?

Sorry to bring you bad news but thanks to a cooperative school principal and law enforcement agency we are able to stop it at this point.

### GRANTING COMMISSIONS AND CERTIFICATES OF MEMBERSHIP

All persons serving in any official relationship with the Boy Scouts of America shall subscribe to the statement of religious principle the Scout Oath and Law, and these Bylaws. Such persons shall be citizens of the United States, or shall have legally declared their intentions to become citizens of the United States, or, in the case of minors, shall take an oath of allegiance to the flag and Government of the United States, or shall satisfy the requirements of Article XVI, Section 6, Clause 4 with respect to visiting adult aliens: Article XVIII, Section 2.

### PURPOSE: CHARACTER BUILDING — CITIZENSHIP TRAINING

The purpose of the Corporation is as set forth in the original certificate of incorporation under the laws of the District of Columbia, dated February 8, 1910, and restated in the Act of Incorporation enacted by the Congress of the United States of America on June 15, 1916, as follows: "That the purpose of this corporation shall be to promote, through organization, and cooperation with other agencies, the ability of boys to do things for themselves and others, to train them in Scoutcraft, and to teach them patriotism, courage, self-reliance, and kindred virtues, using the methods which are now in common use

by Boy Scouts." In achieving this purpose, emphasis shall be placed upon its educational program and the oaths, promises and codes of the Scout program for character development, citizenship training, mental and physical fitness. Article I, Section 2.

### DECLARATION OF RELIGIOUS PRINCIPLE

The Boy Scouts of America maintains that no boy can grow into the best kind of citizen without recognizing his obligation to God. In the first part of the Scout Oath or Promise the boy declares, "On my honor I will do my best to do my duty to God and my country and to obey the Scout Law." The recognition of God as the ruling and leading power in the universe and the grateful acknowledgment of His favors and blessings are necessary to the best type of citizenship and are wholesome precepts in the education of the growing boy. No matter what the religious faith of the boy may be, this fundamental need of good citizenship should be kept before him. The Boy Scouts of America therefore recognizes the religious element in the training of the boy, but it is absolutely nonsectarian in its attitude toward that religious training. Its policy is that the organization or institution with which the Scout is connected shall give definite attention to his religious life.

Only persons willing to subscribe to this declaration of principle shall be entitled to certificates of leadership in carrying out the Scout program. Article II, Section 2.

### THE SCOUT OATH OR PROMISE

On my honor I will do my best  
To do my duty to God and my country and to obey the Scout Law;  
To help other people at all times;  
To keep myself physically strong, mentally awake, and morally straight.

### THE CUB SCOUT PROMISE

I, ( ), promise to do my best  
To do my duty to God  
And my country,  
To be square, and  
To obey the Law of the Pack.

### THE SCOUT LAW

1. A Scout is trustworthy.  
A Scout's honor is to be trusted. If he were to violate his honor by telling a lie or by cheating or by not doing exactly a given task, when trusted on his honor, he may be directed to hand over his Scout badge.
2. A Scout is loyal.  
He is loyal to all to whom loyalty is due, his Scout leader, his home and parents and country.
3. A Scout is helpful.  
He must be prepared at any time to save life, help injured persons, and share the home duties. He must do at least one Good Turn to somebody every day.
4. A Scout is friendly.  
He is a friend to all and a brother to every other Scout.
5. A Scout is courteous.  
He is polite to all, especially to women, children, old people, and the weak and helpless. He must not take pay for being helpful or courteous.
6. A Scout is kind.  
He is a friend to animals. He will not kill nor hurt any living creature needlessly, but will strive to save and protect all harmless life.
7. A Scout is obedient.  
He obeys his parents, Scoutmaster, patrol leader, and all other duly constituted authorities.

8. A Scout is cheerful.  
He smiles whenever he can. His obedience to orders is prompt and cheery. He never shirks nor grumbles at hardships.
9. A Scout is thrifty.  
He does not wantonly destroy property. He works faithfully, wastes nothing, and makes the best use of his opportunities. He saves his money so that he may pay his own way, be generous to those in need, and helpful to worthy objects. He may work for pay, but must not receive tips for courtesies or Good Turns.
10. A Scout is brave.  
He has the courage to face danger in spite of fear and to stand up for the right against the coaxings of friends or the jeers or threats of enemies, and defeat does not down him.
11. A Scout is clean.  
He keeps clean in body and thought; stands for clean speech, clean sport, clean habits, and travels with a clean crowd.
12. A Scout is reverent.  
He is reverent toward God. He is faithful in his religious duties and respects the convictions of others in matters of custom and religion.

### BOYS' LIFE

Registered adult members are entitled to a half-price membership rate of \$1.50 a year or 12½ cents a month. (Regular rate is \$3.) A *Boys' Life* subscription should be for the same number of months as an individual's registration, but the first issue of *Boys' Life* will not normally arrive for approximately 2 months. Your local council will transmit your subscription on the appropriate unit or council roster form.

*Boys' Life* is published by the Boy Scouts of America and contains some of the best of fiction, hobbies, crafts, sports, and outdoor crafts and skills. Program material is coordinated with unit program themes.

### APPROVAL

The application of the Cubmaster, Scoutmaster, Explorer Advisor, and their assistants and Den Mothers should be approved by the chairman of the unit committee. Applications of unit committeemen and the institutional representative must be approved by the head of the institution or sponsoring body. Council Scouters should be approved by the proper council authority.

### REGISTRATION FEES

If applicant already holds an unexpired registration certificate in another capacity, no fee is required with this application, unless he is ceasing activity in the other capacity. In such case he should pay a proportionate fee to the expiration of this registration.

Annual adult fee is \$1, but for periods of less than 1 year, registration will be proportionate to the period to be covered, as shown on the front side.
